Local Banking Institution Adopts New Plan On All Its Commercial Checking Accounts.

Reduced net earnings from loans and investments in recent years, due to lack of demand for money and lower rates of interest, have made it necessary for the Manchester Trust Company to adopt a new plan of service charges.

Reason For The Change The bank feels that no depositor knowingly wants his bank to handle his account at a loss.

Under the new plan, commercial checking accounts will be handled at a charge of ten cents for each deposit, five cents for each check paid on the account and two cents for each out-of-town check or postal note order deposited.

Important feature of this plan and one of much benefit to depositors is that against the total of these charges will be offset the earnings on the account.

Uncle Sam Gets Headache From 'Smart' Indian Pact

Washington, June 7.—The white man's "smart piece of business" in dealing with the Indians years ago is giving Uncle Sam a headache. There currently are a score of disputes, some serious and some amusing, which have arisen from the economic and political strategy of the forefathers in giving about 200 treaties to obtain Indian land cheaply.

Business Indians, for example, are pressing on the government an urgent treaty claim to the Indian title of the Niagara river. Officials say the title, if established, may interfere with a power company's application to divert additional water from the river.

Killing Of Bears Problem
In higher vein, Arizona officials and the Apaches are at loggerheads over Indian attempts to fire a white man to kill bears which are destroying large numbers of cattle on the Fort Apache reservation. The Indians insist that the white man will kill a bear and state that the white man will be killed.
