GUERILLAS, GUNS 'N' GOURDS: A WAY OF LIFE FOR THE OPM

"We have 6,000 troops split into 15 battalions in Meruke. We have enough weapons and war equipment. All these forces will make their move once I instruct them to do so." says Willem Onde, leader of the OPM battalion responsible for seizing over 20 employees of a Korean logging company in the past few weeks. Onde, a wild looking character with long matted hair and huge whiskers, holds the unofficial rank of 'colonel' and steers his troops from a jungle HQ in the Asiki forest, eight hours drive from Merauke. Only a radio transmitter and a mobile phone link them with the outside world. Onde learned to fight young; joining the OPM aged 12 (he's now 40), he's perfected the OPM tactics of sudden surprise attacks on a target followed by a swift retreat into the heavily forested mountains. Onde and his troops have been holed up in the Asiki forest since 1976. Often, they'll have only corn to eat, not even any vegetables or salt. This war is, as the cliché goes, a lesson in survival. Onde's is but one of numerous such OPM guerrilla units. Pretty much autonomous, each unit fights the war against



Morning Star Is Raised

November 27th: The Indonesian Embassy in Grosvenor Square gets visited by people armed with a large model Hawk jet - and the outlawed West Papuan "Morning Star" flag is raised in front of the Embassy in solidarity with the 1 million Papuans who are threatened to be massacred whilst defending their flag in the troubled Indonesian province on December 1st. British-made Hawk jets were recently used to intimidate Papuans during a massacre in the highland town of Wamena in which more than 40 people died as a result of the Indonesian police shooting into an unarmed crowd who were trying to defend the flag. Britain is currently exporting the final 6 Hawk jets to Indonesia!

Council members have managed to alienate most of the population- not least by lumping the Indonesian army and the OPM together as 'violent extremists'. The Jakarta regime has tried various tactics to appease the pro-independence multitudes. Obviously, handing Papua back to the Papuans isn't on the cards; instead Indonesia has tried to buy the people off with the promise of a bigger slice of the profits from the mining and oil concessions which are Indonesia's reason for being there in the first place. This is where liberals like the Presidium Council become dangerous- they tend to negotiate 'sensibly' around such offers, securing compromise deals that sell out the true demands of the people they're meant to represent. Yorrys Raveyai, notorious onetime leader of a Jakarta-based 'thugs for hire' group and an executive member of the PDP has publicly voiced opposition to independence. "I want Irian Jaya to remain part of the Motherland" he says, somewhat controversially for an 'independence leader', urging the government instead to spend more on 'economic development' of the province.

The People of West Papua don't want this. They don't want copper mines, money, or next years' cops in the shape of the Presidium Council. They want their forests un-raped and they want the freedom to live without being fucked over. 'Yi Wa

O'- Just leave us, please.

Indonesia in its own territory, always from the comparative safety of a wild hideout. The OPM know the mountains, swamps and jungles; it's their birthright. Even with their M16's against the OPM's primitive weaponry, the Indonesian Army wouldn't stand a chance here.

OPM Military Area III is under the command of Kelly Kwalik, the guerilla chief best known for the kidnap of seven European botanists in 1996. To get to his battalion HQ near Timika involves a trek of several hours, usually conducted under the cover of darkness and in total silence. Such is the way of the guerilla; the roads are the enemy's territory. Being spotted could mean death. Instead, visitors to camp walk single file, with an armed guard front and rear, up and over a landscape littered with the tailings from the Freeport mine. Stops are made en route at intermediate camps. Guerillas sit around, cleaning weapons and chewing betel nut, eyeing visitors with necessary suspicion. Spies and suicide bombers are ever-present dangers; strip searches and body inspections are mandatory.

At Post III, Kwalik's headquarters, security is even more intense. It has to be. But inside the heavily -guarded perimeter, life is . well, normal. The softly spoken Kwalik munches sweet potatoes and sleeps on the floor of a simple thatched hut, his pillow a block of wood covered with black cloth. The life of the guerilla is not glamorous. It is a life stripped to the bare necessities. None of these people are professional soldiers; none of them want to have to fight. They are proud mountain people who have the audacity to want to live their lives unmolested by the rapacious industrial hydra. Who favour the full, deep relationship with nature of their forebears over a never-never land of tv-sets, cars and cancer. For this crime, they are forced to take up arms. To wage war on the dismal tide of progress. Their fight is also ours.

May all their arrows find their targets!



East Timor:

East Timor is one half of a small tropical island 400 miles north of Darwin, Australia. Formerly a Portuguese colony. Timor has just emerged from Indonesia's violent occupation. It is at present under administration by the United Nations. The Indonesian invasion in 1974 and the subsequent violent occupation of Timor has been ignored by the rich countries media because of vested interests. Indonesia was a stable anti-communist power and a good armaments customer. Australian government wanted to get their hands on the black gold in the Timor gap and American military want to play with their nuclear subs in the deep-sea channel there. (Isn't it strange how the uranium poison seems to be part of almost every bad story?) So Timor gets subjected a quarter of a century of terrorising nightmare, killing a third of its population, genocide and destruction on a scale and duration that is hard to imagine. Now all that has changed, the hypocrisy is staggering. Governments who conspired to perpetuate the agony are now expressing glib sympathy and offering tokenistic aid packages. The same mainstream media agencles that previously turned a blind eye to the situation are happy to run human-interest stories about the reborn nation. In Dili, city cafes, the incongruous Sydney style UN and Non Governmental Organisation worker's haunt, is packed with coffee sipping, well meaning foreigners.


I went to Timor to work with friends on musical and theatrical projects. They had come their as part of the Earthdream convoy. Earthdream is an international convoy of artists, performers, musicians and activists who brought a show and a sound system to Timor in August, when most people return to Australia these friends decided to stay and start their own N.G.O. They call themselves 'Bibi Bulak' which means crazy goat and they are running amazing creative and educational projects with children and young people. Arriving in Dili what blew me away the most was how much every body smiles and laughs there. Make eye contact with someone and they instantly beam you the most sincere and sparklee smile, soon I got in the habit too and took to walking around with a permanent grin. Walking around Dili market is a full-on experience, and although people love to mob a foreigner, or Malai as they call us, they are never really pushy or aggressive. Once I had a few tetum words I had loads of fun and attempting to chat to the beetle chewing grannies, singing Elvis with the guitar sellers, ducking and diving down the narrow alleys of flip flops and bootleg D.V.D discs amid constant cries of 'hello Mrs! How-are-you?!' This is Dili's bizarre beach front: lined by a shanty of shacks and cooking fires. populated with hairy black pigs, men with coconut barrows and prize fighting cocks with showy plumage. Shiny white U.N. vehicles and beat up taxis cruise past. In the water, slippery swimming boys clamber between the gangway of the incongruous luxury floating hotel and a rusting hulk that was once a landing platform for the invading Indonesians. We were staying with a family further round the bay in the direction of the Jesus statue, a silhouette with out-stretched hands marking the farthest edge of the mountains that cup Dili. The Indonesians put Jesus there to honour the pope on his visit during the occupation.

We put together a little musical comical show and set off to present it, in and around Dili, along with creative workshops and games for kids. We spent some days on Atuoro, an island, which managed to escape most of the violence but is none the less a very poverty stricken place. Although the U.N. and N.G.O.s have been in Timor a year, progress has been frustratingly slow and many people still do not have access to clean water and food. We visited one project, back on the mainland, which seemed to be addressing local problems in very constructive way. This was a course which has

trained more than 100 Timorese permaculturalists. As well as learning practical skills the students learnt about the bad effects of chemical farming in other parts of the world. It was great to see ordinary Timorese people getting access to this kind of information. It's important for people to see that the rich countries don't have all the answers and to have the chance to learn from their mistakes. Armed with knowledge and permaculture skills these people will stand a good chance against the corporate farming systems that will certainly be out to do Timor over. The permaculture approach also emphasis the appropriateness of small-scale traditional techniques, reminding the locals to trust themselves and their knowledge of their homeland.

We presented our little show one evening along with a little skit on chemical farming verses permaculture. This got everyone thinking about ways that theatre could be of use in the permaculture field. One of the biggest ecological problems Timor faces is landslides as a result of the Indonesian regime having cut down a lot of the trees in the mountains. It was proposed that Bibi Bulak could be of use providing an educational show about replanting trees, to take to remote rural areas. We also performed at the student solidarity centre while the first monsoon rains pounded down. It was an honour to perform for the student crew. Timorese students have always been very active in the independence movement, putting their lives on the line on many occasions in order to publicise their country's plight through bold direct actions. Some of these proved to be turning points in Timorese history, such as when a group of students managed to meet and talk to a visiting American politician in the presence of international media. Many of them were killed or tortured for their trouble but their message did get out to the world.

Two and a half weeks in Timor has given me lots to think about and has shifted my perspective and priorities in some fundamental ways. Back in the rich world, I feel it is important to focus on how our governments colluded in creating that situation. As citizens of these privileged countries it is our responsibility to be vigilant and noisy, in an attempt to prevent other similarly terrible stories from happening anywhere in the world. This is why the recent protests against globalisation that took place in Melbourne and in Prague are so important. A look at the Timorese experience should also make us keen to appreciate and defend our civil liberties such as the right to freedom of movement and to protest, we may get arrested, sprayed with chemicals or beaten but we don't get shot, raped and tortured to death. Let's make certain it never happens. The people of East Timor have suffered more than we can easily imagine but in spite of this, they seem to have a great capacity for joy. One year into independence Timor Lorasi is buzzing with life, may it always be so!



MIND THE GAT!

Susan George, economist It's just over a year since the World Trade Organisation (WTO) got a good kicking in Seattle (see SchNEWS 240). But behind the closed doors of the world's most powerful trade organisation, bureaucrats backed up by their mates in big business have been busy plotting.

What they've come up with is a few new ways of expanding the General Agreement on the Trades in Services (GATS). First signed in 1994 the agreement is all about eliminating 'barriers to trade' (see box)

So they've come up with a cunning plan to privatise the world's public services. Everything from water to housing to education to hospitals, and a whole lot more are now 'barriers to trade' creating unfair competition that must be put on the open market to the lowest bidder.

A European Commission representative singled out the European health service as ripe for 'liberalisation' (that's corporate chat for privatisation), with a US healthcare industry lobbyist complaining that health has "largely been the responsibility of the public sector (making it) difficult for US private sector health care providers."

Now that would make a hell of a lot of difference in the UK where New Labour are pressing ahead with handing over hospitals, schools, prisons, council houses etc. to the private sector. Hey, last week the UK even became the first country in the world to part privatise Air Traffic Control.

Elsewhere European water and energy companies are keen to expand their interests in the Third World. This is of course out of a noble sense of duty in wanting to help developing countries obtain things like clean water and not as the more cynical amongst you might think about further lining shareholders pockets.

Trickle Down

Imagine getting a water bill that cost you one third of your wages. Or needing a permit to collect rainwater in rooftop tanks. This was a reality for some of Bolivia's poorest families when the Government sold the public water system with Bechtel taking a major share. The charges that the

company imposed on peasant families were so crippling that they sparked mass protest. Hundreds of thousands took to the streets of Cochabamba City in April. Soldiers sent in to quell the protests killed six and injured hundreds others. The Governor of the State resigned saying he did not want to be responsible for the 'bloodbath' that would follow the Bolivian Government's refusal to reverse the privatisation. But in the end, the protestors won — Bechtel were kicked out of Bolivia and the Government accepted the protestors' demands to put control of water in local hands.

But it's not just been protests in Bolivia. Around the world this year there have been mass strikes in Indonesia, calling for the government to end contracts with private water companies, while in Costa Rica huge demonstrations took place against the privatisation of the country's energy and telecommunications sector. In South Africa, protests and strikes are taking place in response to privatisation, with the ANC government taking a heavy stance against protestors.

However, if the new GATS agreement had been in force, all these protests would have been futile, because as the WTO Secretariat points out, one of the benefits of GATS is helping "overcome domestic resistance to change."

What that means is that once a country signs up and decides to open up a particular service to WTO rules, it would be practically impossible to go back on any agreement . Any change of heart – tough. Change of government – tough. Popular protest – grin and bear it. Or face the trade sanction consequences.

Fair trade or 'free trade'?

Environmental laws, union rights, health and safety regulations, business regulations... We're sorry but these are 'barriers to trade' and if you try to enforce them then we will have to hit you with our economic sanctions stick.

Bob Olson, anti globalisation campaigner Last month, a secret tribunal ruled that under the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA- see SchNews 200), a US hazardous waste company had been discriminated against by the Canadian government. The reason? Because of Canada's ban on the export of highly carcinogenic PCB waste. The ban is part of an international environmental protection treaty signed by over 130 countries who agreed to reduce their exports of hazardous wastes to a minimum and instead focus on reprocessing the wastes at home. Tough - the treaty is a 'barrier to trade' and the company can expect compensation of up to \$50 million.

* In August, the Metalclad Corporation of America won \$16.7 million compensation and the right to pollute an area in San Luis Potosi in Mexico after a NAFTA ruling. Local protests blocked a hazardous waste treatment and disposal site being built because it would poison the local water supply. Tough – that's an infringement of the corporation's rights.

* Thanks to an interim ruling by NAFTA the US may have to open its borders to Mexican lorries, regardless of safety concerns. Mexican lorries regularly break US safety regulations. Drivers can drive as long they like, can carry heavier loads and their trucks have common safety problems including faulty brakes, tyres, tail-lights and brake lights. Tough – stopping dodgy trucks entering the US is a barrier to trade. * Talks to extend NAFTA take place in Quebec next April. Demonstrations are being organised. In Harmondsworth Way

Picture this ... you leave the country you were born in because either you're in fear of your life from a despotic regime - or because NATO - in its wisdom, has bombed your country back into the dark ages, covering it in depleted uranium and unexploded cluster bombs. You end up in Britain hoping for a new life and what happens? You're locked up and treated like a criminal. One of the places you could end up is Harmondsworth Detention Centre, near Heathrow Airport which, by spring next year, will have increased its capacity by six times, to hold 550 people including families.

There have been regular demonstrations held outside the prison and at Heathrow, where on 3rd August activists highlighted the case of Amanj Gafor, a Kurdish refugee who was about to be deported. The police were ready, and early in the morning took Amanj to Gatwick instead, but because he put up such a fight he was taken back to Harmondsworth. Mike Taylor, branch secretary of the Bristol N.U.J., was arrested at Heathrow and charged with "organising a demonstration to interfere with passenger safety" and "refusing to leave airport property". Mike is appearing at Uxbridge magistrates court on the d Dec. Campaigners are hoping to use this trial to bring about a change in the law under the Human Rights Act for the right to demonstrate. Bristol Defend Asylum Seekers Campaign has called for a picket outside the court on the day and on the 16th Dec there will be a demo outside Harmondsworth itself. Stop Badgering Us

After killing 30,000 badgers over 25 years the Ministry of Agriculture (MAFF) are killing another 20,000 to try and prove badgers are responsible for tuberculosis in cattle (bTB). According to official figures the new culls cost a mere £7,000 per badger!

Despite the culls, cases of bTB are continuing to soar, MAFF seem blind to the fact that bTB is likely to spread amongst cattle because of the poor conditions they are kept in. Hazardous

This week has been a tragic week for workers in the construction industry. Three workers have needlessly lost their lives. Work stopped out of respect at one of the sites in the City of London, on Wednesday, and there will be a vigil in Sheffield on Monday for another of the victims. The first six months of this year saw twice as many construction workers being killed (68) than in the same period last year. It had been hoped that the government would include a new Health and Safety Act in this week's Queen's speech, which would have increased fines and made companies criminally liable for injuries due to poor safety. The government appears to have given into big business and didn't introduce the Act. There will be a day of action for construction workers in London on 27 Feb to coincide with the Government's Health and Safety Crisis in Construction Conference. Last weekend saw the burning of numerous effigies in the Indian city of Bhopal, home to 200,000 who are still living with the chronic effects of the 1984 Union Carbide gas disaster (SchNEWS 238). Women protesters blocked off the central traffic area and shouted "Death to Union Carbide". The next day another effigy was burnt right outside the Union Carbide factory (still seeping lethal chemicals into these people's drinking water supply). This was a symbol of the way the Indian government has little choice but to pave the way for multinationals to exploit communities, livelihoods and environments. Jim Carey reviews a remarkable out-of-court police settlement with widespread implications for the relationship between big business and the police.

Out-of-court settlements are usually a way of avoiding embarrassment. A way of mollifying claimants with-

out admission of guilt.

So it was highly unusual when an out-of-court settlement agreed by the Metropolitan Police in July was accompanied with a public apology. It was perhaps less unusual that the details of a case with wide implications went unreported in the mainstream media.

The case revolved around the admission by the vice president of a corporation that its security department had easy access to confidential information held on the police's database. And that he and his corporate colleagues used this conduit to gather personal information on its critics.

'All the security department have many, many contacts in the police service," said Sid Nicholson in High Court. "If I wanted to know something about someone, I would almost certainly make contact with the local crimes beat officer, the local CID officer, the local collator."

Nicholson's telling admission was made on May 14 1996 during one of the many lengthy cross-examinations which took place in the mammoth McLibel trial. Before joining McDonald's in 1983, Sid Nicholson had spent 31 years as a police officer, firstly in South Africa and then with the Met. As Vice President of McDonald's UK, Nicholson's job was to oversee several departments including security.

Serving under him as head of McDonald's security department was Terry Carrol, who, like Nicholson, had reached the rank of Chief Superintendent in the Metropolitan Police before joining the burger corporation. In fact, as Nicholson said under cross-examination, the McDonald's security department "are all ex-policemen".

It transpired that both Terry Carrol and Sid Nicholson had met with Special Branch agents on several occasions at a variety of venues, and even stood with them on public demonstrations. The exchange of information between police and corporate security involved personal information on, and the home addresses of, several activists including the two defendants in the McLibel trial. Helen Steel and Dave Morris, subsequently launched proceedings against the Met in September 1998, claiming damages for misfeasance in public office, breach of confidence and breach of their right to privacy.

The two named targets of their claim were the Metropolitan Police Commissioner and a CID officer, Detective

Sergeant David Valentine.

DS Valentine's appearance in the frame came via a circuitous investigative route. When McDonald's first considered suing activists for distributing critical material back in 1989, the Corporation hired the services of two investigation agencies to infiltrate the activist group, London Greenpeace.

In the run up to the rights-to-privacy trial, Dave Morris and Helen Steel "became aware" that McDonald's had failed to disclose all the log book of one of the under-cover agents, Allan Clare. McDonald's claimed the miss-ing sections were not relevant. However, Steel and Morris discovered that the missing sections noted two meetings between Allan Clare and DS Valentine at Southwark Police Station. During the meeting confidential information was exchanged. Police records now confirm the meeting took place. It was discovered that DS Valentine was involved in Operation Carnaby, the police investigation which followed the Trafalgar Square anti-poll tax demonstration. When Dave Morris applied under the data protection act to view his police record he found the words "Veteran of the poll tax riots" next to his name even though he had no convictions associated with the event.

The evidence now demonstrated a three way exchange of so called confidential information between the police, a corporate security department and a private investigation firm in the service of a corporation. And what's more, it all appeared quite normal.

Faced with such damning evidence, the Met Police agreed to a £10,000 plus all legal costs settlement in July in order to avoid what they called "a difficult and lengthy trial".

Under the terms of the settlement, the Metropolitan Police agreed "to bring this settlement to the attention of the 3 Area Commanders of the Metropolitan Police force and ask them to remind their officers of their responsibility not to disclose information on the Police National Computer to a third party". Complying with the consent order, DS Valentine stated he "regretted any distress of the claimants caused by the disclosure of their details" to a private investigator.

Many corporate security departments are now made up of ex-British policemen pursuing lucrative service with corporations. They are all likely to have relationships with currently serving officers. Whilst the apology and com-mitments forced from the Metropolitan Police by Steel and Morris were an achievement in accountability, the relationship they helped uncover appeared par for the course. How effective will the Met Police's memo to area commanders be in curbing the incidence? And what checks and balances are there to regulate this collusion between public servants and corporate agents nationwide?







European Round-Table of Industrialists

Up to 70,000 demonstrators rallied last week on the streets of Nice before the European Union summit. At the same time as a charter of fundamental rights was being discussed counter-summit meetings were being cancelled or raided while others fought battles with police who wouldn't let them into France!

On the day of the summit a few thousand people tried to storm the centre and were met with the usual greetings of tear gas and stun grenades. A bank was burnt, a lew shops were trashed and the French President Chirac said the anti-capitalist demonstrators were "contrary to democratic principles." Yet behind the clouds of smoke, the un-elected and unaccountable faces of big business were once again pushing their agenda onto the centre stage, using the EU as a Trojan horse for more corporate global carve-ups.

Carve Up Countries, we are told, are desperate to join the EU club. However, before any can play, their economies must be 'harmonised', y'know, public services slashed and privatised, etc. In fact, you could call it the European version of the Structural Adjustment Programmes (SchNews 256) forced onto the 'Third World'. As Green MEP Caroline Lucas points out "In short, governments are expected to give up control over their own economies - spelling de-struction for local businesses."

Take Slovakia. With approximately 50,000 staff, the Slovak Railway Company is the biggest employer in the country. In 1998 the Slovak government announced plans to sack nearly half the workforce, and a year later they signed a loan agreement with the European Investment Bank, With

strings attached.

The strings will result in a rise in fares of 30%, a cut of two thirds in both state subsidies and in staff pay, a reduction in rail freight and a cut in railway lines. There was no public discussion about these conditions. Instead the media reported that the government and the rail company were given two weeks to accept: if they agreed to meet them, the Bank was ready to provide the loan immediately.

When a Slovakian environmental NGO sent a protest letter to the President of the Bank, he replied: "The proposed restructuring measures in this case mirror those agreed over recent years between the Bank and virtually all railway companies in the ten Central and Eastern Europe Countries which have applied for EU membership."

So that's all right then.

Fast Track To Profits

They call it 'qualified majority voting', which basically means countries can't individually veto decisions. Instead the European Commission gets to make decisions without having to answer to anyone. It's called 'fast-tracking' and is popular with big business who are fed up with their great ideas being watered down or blocked altogether by interfering governments or nitpicking protestors. They want swift, centralised decision-making, making it easier to push their demands through an already industry-friendly European bureaucracy. And up to a point, they got their way with more trade decisions passing out of national control. National and the European Parliaments now have little control of Trade-Related Intellectual Property Rights (see box) and some services.

If you think this is all confusing, EU bureaucrats estimate that it will take two months to produce a consolidated text of the Nice Treaty, i.e. to come to agreement about what has been agreed! To help decipher it read:

Intellectual Property Rights -ugh?

Short Change!

"One of the enduring myths about globalisation is that it is bad for the poor."

Philippe Legrain, WTO advisor So this week Clare Short-Fuse and her cronies in the Department for International Development (DFID) released their much anticipated white paper on globalisation. And surprise, surprise, they found that "while globalisation brings with it opportunities and risks, free trade for the poor people of the world is beneficial'

But did anyone really expect anything different? I mean Claire Short, a women who believes that "developing countries, governments and their people, want development and multinational companies to invest in their countries". A woman who attacks protesters as rich kids " who sit in the predominantly wealthy rich parts of the world" who "are morally wrong"! Conveniently she doesn't mention the millions of protesters in the Third World fighting quite literally for their lives.

A key phrase that we keep having rammed down our throats is that of "a level playing field". But in reality the game of free trade takes place between two teams where one team has access to the best equipment (the West) while the other team turns out in hand me downs, suffering from malnutrition & kicking an old tin can (the

Third World).

A level playing field: One where the West spends annually \$361bn on subsidies of environmentally destructive intensive agriculture and free trade. The mother of all free traders, the US has increased subsidies on over the past decade to the extent that each US farmer receives on average \$20,000 per year in subsidies, to compete against Third World farmer who live on less than \$1 per day.

A level playing field: Since 1980 the Third World has lost 40% of its trade in the world market as protective barriers against trade from the Third World, mainly food and textiles, are implemented by the rich Western countries to protect their own home market. For every \$1 in aid and debt relief given to the Third World the same countries lose \$14 because of trade barriers erected in the West.

According to Indian environmentalist Vandana Shiva "Development is a trick played on the people of the Third World, especially rural communities, to rob them of their resources and wealth." But then what would she know...

LIVE WILD OR DIE

"The tribal warrior cultures of the native Papuans would rather die fighting than live another minute under the brutal, destructive and genocidal Indonesian regime. I have to say I agree with them".

Western observer in West Papua. This week Indonesian soldiers stormed the university in the West Papuan capital of Jayapura, killing several students and arresting over 100 more. In a show of force in the mountainous, rainforested province, 26 warships are currently moored off the coast and 25,000 troops and a battallion of tanks have been mobilised within the last month. And for what? To gently remind the people of West Papua that the freedom to run their lives them-

selves just ain't on the cards.

West Papua is one of the few really wild places still left on earth. The stunning jungle landscape, rich in biodiversity, is home to rare wildlife like the beautiful bird of paradise and to dozens of different tribes of the Papuan indigenous people who live traditional huntergatherer lifestyles close to nature. Over a third of all the world's languages exist here, spoken by remote clans who shun outside contact.

Sadly, it is also home to some of the largest deposits of minerals in the world - which is why Indonesia won't let go of West Papua without a fight. Multinationals Freeport McMoran and Rio Tinto are just two big name mining companies making huge profits from West Papua with serial offenders BP and Shell also in on the action. Cash from mining concessions is being used directly by Indonesia to repress the Papuan people.

The OPM has been in existence for as long as the Indonesian occupation and resistance to the Indonesian military is ingrained in West Papuan society. "We are all OPM in our hearts," says student leader Jatin Wakerkwa.

Rebels believe the massive Indonesian military presence and the attack on the university are intended to provoke the OPM into retaliation, providing an excuse for an assault on the independence movement and the West Papuan people. As in East Timor, Indonesia is busy recruiting an anti-rebel militia and British-made Hawk jets are being used to terrorize civilians. But unlike East Timor, there are no UN resolutions supporting West Papua. The OPM and the West Papuans are on their own. There is nowhere like West Papua on earth. People have a human right to live wild and die wild. Fight for it or lose it.

A woman who was arrested at Brighton Reclaim the Streets in 1996 for trying to buy a sandwich (SchNEWS 61) was in Court last week for a civil case against Sussex Police . She was nicked for obstruction for asking why she had to go all the way round the block to reach her fave lunch-time café. The jury found in her favour on 2 counts of wrongful arrest and false imprisonment, but not on the third count of malicious prosecution. The judge awarded her the minimum amount of money possible, but she was also made liable for a third of the Police costs, and now faces financial ruin. Her barrister concluded that if you question the Police you are liable to be nicked for obstruction- so just do what they say, and don't answer back!

Carbon Con

Activists in Leeds have staged a protest at the offices of a company who are proving themselves to be major players in the decay of our environment. PriceWaterhouseCoopers have a keen interest in the so-called 'Carbon Trading' agreement, which could eventually become a part of the UN climate treaty. Carbon Trading is a devious scheme which allows major polluting countries to actually increase their carbon emission quota by taking on emissions from countries who may not have filled their quotas. Activists managed to blockade the main entrance whilst police closed the two large car parks at the rear of the offices, preventing any staff from entering or leaving the building. PRISONER SUPPORT

WHY?

Prisons are the bottom line in the state's control over us. Resisting the prison system is part of challenging the status quo, but supporting those who get caught and imprisoned for their beliefs should be a vital part of any movement, too.

WRITING TO PRISONERS

Prison is designed to grind you down, and it isolates people from the outside world. Writing to prisoners helps break this down. It might be intimidating to sit down and write a letter to a stranger, but you can keep it short the first time. Just sending a card with a few well wishes and some words about who you are can brighten up someone's day and make them feel remembered. It can also possibly lead on to a correspondence. Some people, when they write to prisoners are afraid of talking about their lives, what they're up to, thinking this might depress someone locked up or just not be of interest. But prison life is dead boring, and any news that livens it up is generally welcome. Use your sense, don't write about things that are likely to get the prisoner into trouble with the screws or get you or anyone else into trouble.

Remember to include a return address, also on the envelope. Don't necessarily expect an answer - some prisons restrict the number of letters a prisoner can write or receive, or the person may be out of stationery/stamps, or just not be very good at writing letters.

Passing cards round meetings, the pub or among your friends for people to sign with messages of support is an easy thing to do to brighten up a prisoner's mailtime. Or maybe you have the time to start up regular letter writing sessions with your friends, with the purpose of motivating each other to write.

SENDING STUFF

If you are up for it - don't offer your help if you aren't - ask what items the prisoner can receive in the post, or give the prison a ring, as this varies from prison to prison. It also often depends on which screw handles your post and what mood they're in!

Stamps: You can usually include a couple in a letter without problems mention that you have in your letter (they might just disappear otherwise). If writing to someone outside the UK, you can include some International Reply Coupons (IRC's) that are available at any post office and can be used in place of stamps.

Stationery: Remand prisoners are normally allowed to use writing paper (not wire bound) and envelopes sent in to them. Ask convicted prisoners what they're allowed.

Books: There are different regulations on this too, so ask. More than often a prisoner can only receive books directly



from the publisher - this goes for alternative magazines as well - or via a recognised distributor or bookshop. A friendly bookshop will usually oblige if you buy the book and pay for the postage.

Pamphlets/Zines: These seem to get through to most prisons in the UK okay if they're not too big and folded up inside a normal sized envelope, for some reason. They are often counted as photocopies which are, up to a certain amount, usually allowed.

Tapes: Home-recorded tapes are often allowed, but ask. Use see-through ones.

VISITING

If you are up for travelling to visit a prisoner, mention this to them. But bear in mind that convicted prisoners are only entitled to a limited number of visits (remand prisoners to much more), usually about 2-3 a month lasting up to 2 hours with 2-3 people. The prisoner will then have to send out a visiting order (V.O.) to the persons wanting to visit them, fully naming each visitor. You will need to identify yourself at the gate, so take along sufficient I.D., and 'clean up' before you go - getting caught with even the tiniest bit of drug residue or anything else dodgy can have serious consequences for the prisoner.

OTHER SUPPORT

Ask whether the prisoner you are in touch with wants publicity for their case, or protest letters written. If you can raise money, ask where it's needed.

The Corporation Rules UK

All 700 employees of a profitable British company were suddenly made redundant just a few weeks before Christmas. Why? Mathew Carr investigates how the UK government helped a transnational corporation do the dirty on Derbyshire.

There could not be a more definitive Labour heartland than the north east Derbyshire town of Clay Gross. The birthplace of Dennis Skinner, this small town of nearly 10,000 has a long tradition of political radicalism closely connected to its mining past. Until late last year, the town's largest employer was the ductile pipe manufacturer Biwater Industries, with 700 workers. A descendant of the historic company founded by the inventor George Stephenson in 1837, Biwater was a pillar of the local economy, with an annual turnover of £60 million and a booming overseas order book. Whereas other British manufacturers had been badly affected by the strong pound and foreign competition, Biwater had remained buoyant, more than doubling its production during the past decade.

On April 12 2000 the giant French-based multinational, Saint Gobain, announced it had signed a share purchase agreement for Biwater through its Ilkeston-based subsidiary company Stanton plc. The workforce had no reason to expect drastic changes. With 80 per cent of production already destined overseas, shop stewards assumed Biwater would continue to produce mostly for export whilst Stanton plc concentrated on the UK. In meetings with Biwater's management, they were assured that Saint Gobain would provide much needed investment, whilst the company's owner - former BBC governor and Thatcher crony Adrian White - was equally upbeat, declaring that the merger would "leave the Biwater Group free to focus on its core businesses."

In the same month the Office of Fair Trading (OFT) began a routine investigation to check the merger was in accordance with competition laws and recommended its approval to the Department of Trade and Industry in June. Then on September 4 the bombshell exploded. At 3pm Saint Gobain announced the formal completion of its acquisition. Forty-five minutes later stunned shop stewards were informed by management that the company was to be shut down within three months and the entire workforce laid off. Saint Gobain referred to the job losses as 'regrettable' but claimed closure was necessary to protect its UK manufacturing base.

THE NEW OFFICE OF FAIR TRADING DIRECTOR GENERAL MADE THE ASTOUNDING ADMISSION THAT HIS OFFICE HAD KNOWN THAT BIWATER WAS GOING TO BE CLOSED ALL ALONG.

The workers believed that Biwater had become a victim of its own success and that the acquisition had been carried out in order to take over the company's overseas order book and establish a quasi-monopoly in the ductile pipe industry. "They couldn't compete with us and they couldn't undercut us," says GMB shop steward Hugh McNeil. "So this was the only way they could do it, by buying us out."

With the support of local councilors and MPs, the workers began campaigning furiously to persuade the government to keep the company open. The campaign was spearheaded in Westminster by MP for North East Derbyshire Harry Barnes, who called on DTI Secretary of State Stephen Byers to use his powers under the 1973 Fair Trading Act and refer the merger to the Competitions Commission. At the end of September a deputation of Biwater's campaigners met Byers personally at the Labour Party Conference and initially the minister

appeared sympathetic. In a fighting speech to the conference Byers promised that "where there is real pressure and difficulties in areas like textiles, coal and steel and in specific plants like Biwater in Clay Cross, we must not stand to one side. We won't walk away."

It soon became clear that this was exactly what the Secretary of State intended to do. On October 3 he wrote a letter to Saint Gobain's Chief Executive, Jean Louis Beffinheaded "Dear Jean-Louis" and signed "with personal betwishes, Stephen". Byers asked his friend to reconsider and promised government help to keep Biwater open Beffa predictably refused, and even claimed with breath taking hypocrisy that the closure had only been announced with such unseemly haste in order to "avoid future uncertainty among the workforce".

By now Harry Barnes had accumulated a copious dossier of information to show Biwater's financial viability, including its annual report for the previous year, and figures showing a surge in overseas orders during August as a result of rising oil prices. In the face of mounting pressure, Byers took the unusual step of asking the OFI to publish its initial report into the acquisition. On October 16, the OFT published an edited version of its report. In the report the new OFT Director General made the astounding admission that his office had known the plant was going to be closed all along, but that the OFT had not considered this information 'relevant' enough to be included in his recommendation.

This revelation strengthened the case of Biwater's workforce, who were now able to point out that the DTI's approval was based on misleading information. It also appeared to exonerate Byers and the DTI, though some local observers were struck by the speed with which the East Midlands Government Office (EMGO) had reacted to the closure announcement in September, setting up a special response unit that one local government officer described as 'economic first-aid'. As revealed in the minutes of a meeting of the Chesterfield Area Regeneration Team, which took place on September 8 just four days after the takeover, one EMGO Officer explained that his department had been in discussion "for weeks" about the closure and that a "meeting at a high-level" had been convened to discuss the best way to respond to the mass redundancies.

way to respond to the mass redundancies.

Since the EMGO is responsible to the Department of Trade and Industry, this casts some doubt on the DTI's claims to have been unaware of the forthcoming closure when it first approved the merger. Why was a department controlled by the DTI in discussion with Biwater's management before the closure was announced? Why had local government officers not made this information available beforehand? Under whose authority had the "high-level discussions" been initiated?

Like most officials involved in the Biwater affair, the EMGO has refused to answer any questions on the grounds of commercial confidentiality, the same justification used by the OFT for not having revealed the closure to the unions or local authorities.

THE DTI JUNIOR MINISTER'S SPEECH CONTAINED ALL THE SKEWED LOGIC OF A POLITICIAN DEFENDING THE INDEFENSIBLE.

In its original report the OFT said that no unsolicited representations had been received from third parties, though "officials consulted both customers and competitors". But when shop stewards asked how these consultations had been carried out they were informed that the OFT had solicited third party representations broadcasting the imminence of the merger via the Reuters news service. However the likelihood that any third party in-

cluding customers or workers, would read the Reuters news service was extremely low. Furthermore as the intended closure had been omitted from the OFT's report no third parties would have realised a merger meant instant closure, even if they had chanced upon the obscure announcement on Reuters news service.

At this point Stephen Byers could have called for an investigation into the merger on the grounds that he had not been aware of all the facts when he approved it. Typically he handed responsibility back to the OFT and asked the new Director General, John Vickers, to consider whether the information supplied to Barnes was sufficient to warrant an investigation.

At the end of October a new front was opened when MEP Philip Whitehead traveled to Brussels with Biwater workers to press European Commissioner, Mario Monti, to investigate whether Saint Gobain had breached European competition laws and used EU grants in its buy out of Biwater.

On November 1, the Biwater campaigners finally got their parliamentary debate. Both Barnes and Dennis Skinner gave impassioned speeches protesting against both the closure and the OFT's dubious role in sanctioning it. In response Junior Trade Minister, Alan Johnson, admitted that mergers could be revisited in cases where "material facts in relation to a merger not in the public domain were not disclosed". Though this was clearly the case in the Biwater takeover, the Minister now claimed that the information supplied by Barnes did not constitute 'material facts' and that the DTI would still have approved the merger even if it had known. Johnson's speech contained all the skewed logic of a politician defending the indefensible, including his uncritical repetition of Saint Gobain's argument that Biwater had to be closed because of 'over-capacity in the UK market' despite the fact that most of Biwater's production was exported.

The following day the OFT Director General confirmed to Barnes that the OFT did not consider there to be suflicient grounds for an investigation. The tenacious MP continued to bombard Byers with faxes, pointing out that the DTI was not legally obliged to accept the OFT's recommendation and that it could still call for an investigation in cases where mergers a) contravened the public interest b) damaged UK exports and c) affected the bal-

anced distribution of employment in the UK.

The Trade and Industry Secretary was running out of excuses for inaction. So far he had offered what Barnes described as "tea and sympathy" to Biwater's workforce, whilst simultaneously seeking to evade responsibility for the closure. Now he was forced to make a choice whether to reject his own civil servants' advice and risk confronting a powerful multi-national, or abandon the Biwater workers to their fate

In the nudge-wink world where governmental departments and big business intersect and nothing is ever written down, it is impossible to know whether any pressure was brought to bear on the DTI by Saint Gobain. The Biwater campaigners relished the prospect of the legal confrontation or judicial review expected if Saint Gobain's plan had been opposed by senior political figures. The campaigner viewed it as an opportunity to expose the multi-national's monopolistic intentions. Unforlunately for them, however, the political courage required was absent at a ministerial level. Byers was happier with New Labour soundbites, promising at the Regional Policy Forum Conference on November 15 to "widen the winner's circle" and "address the needs of the regions". The

following day he informed Barnes in parliament that he would make his decision on the merger "as soon as possible", a reply which the local MP dismissed as "fiddling whilst Rome burns

By now the EU had claimed that the Biwater merger was outside its competence, and a farcical situation had developed; with the EU Commissioner saying he would welcome 'an expression of concern' from the UK government, and Junior DTI minister, Alan Johnson, saying the UK government would welcome the intervention of the EU. On November 20, the same day as the first batch of Biwater workers were made redundant, Byers finally issued a bland official dispatch announcing that he had decided to accept the OFT's recommendations and that he would not be referring the merger to the Competitions Commission.

The confirmation of Byers' duplicity was a bitter blow to the Biwater campaigners. On November 24, a second batch of 108 workers left the factory for the last time following on from the 50 laid off earlier in the week and preceding the 542 due to follow them into sudden redundancy. Many of them may never work again, unlike some senior Biwater managers, who have already been promoted within the Saint Gobain organization. However, some management voices have clearly been as shocked by the ruthless closure of their company as their workforce. On Nov 31 a letter was sent to Harry Barnes from a sympathetic management insider containing information which the writer hoped would enable the MP "to establish a reprieve for the excellent Biwater Industries workforce and the good people of Clay Cross". An edited version of the letter was forwarded to both Byers and the OFT. SQUALL has seen the letter, which states amongst other things that:

 Biwater Industries were always a competitive thorn in the side of Saint Gobain, in Europe and the Middle

Saint Gobain has carried out similar asset stripping operations in recent takeovers of Guest & Chrimes in Rotherham and the Italian pipe manufacturer Tubi Ghaisi.

Various water authorities worldwide strongly suspect Saint Gobain of operating a cartel, in that they are faced with no alternative but to purchase pipes from Saint Gobain affiliates.

Saint Gobain is to transfer all Biwater Industries manufacturing equipment to South Africa, a process which

has already begun.

All this has been a disaster for Clay Cross, with an estimated loss to the local economy of £0.5 million per week, and the scandalous episode has made New Labour's Thatcherite agenda glaringly apparent, even to local La-bour politicians like Harry Barnes. "I don't believe there is any previous Labour Trade Secretary who would not have referred this to the Competitions Commission," the MP told SQUALL. "It's the great flaw with Third Way politics. You can try and reconcile the free market and social justice, but in the end you have to come off the fence and when they do its in the interests of capitalism.

Defenders of Third Way politics have always argued that national governments are powerless to challenge 'the market 'in a globalised economy, but in the case of Biwater, government ministers simply refused to use the legal powers at their disposal. Not only did state institutions actively collude in the ruthless destruction of a successful industry by a powerful commercial competitor, but local government organs demonstrated a complicity with Saint Gobain's designs. Meanwhile the British taxpayer is picking up the tab in the form of unemployment benefit, impact studies and 'cross-authority working groups' including counselling for the newly unemployed. The Biwater workers can feel proud of the MPs and local politicians who fought their cause right up to the end. However, they are unlikely to feel the same about the Government, whose real allegiances are no longer local or even national.

GAP GETS SHAGGED IN SHEFFIELD

Activists set up alternative recruitment stand
A group of ardent Sheffield activists, calling themselves
SHAG, distributed information of a different kind at a recruitment fair run by the clothing firm GAP in mid January.
The SHAG (Sheffield Against Gap) activists set up a 'GAP
Information Point' outside the Sheffield Novatel Hotel
where GAP management were trying to recruit staff for a

new store due to open in the city in March.

SHAG activists distributed information about dire employment conditions suffered by workers in GAP clothing factories in countries like Indonesia and Honduras where union representation is banned and workers are paid £2.50 a day. A delegation from the Honduran National Labour Committee recently reported that GAP's female workers were forced to have pregnancy tests and that the toilets in their Honduran factory are locked during working hours.

GAP is owned by the Fisher family, an American corporate clan reported to be worth \$7 billion dollars. With the profits from their GAP empire they recently bought 25 per cent of Mendocino county in California and intend to chop down some of the last of California's redwood forest.

Following their alternative recruitment action in Sheffield a SHAG spokesperson said: "Almost all the prospective employees came to us first. Whilst some people obviously couldn't give a shit, most people listened intently to what we had to say. Quite a few were so shocked they didn't even bother to go into the hotel."

"Politicians are in danger of forgetting the lesson of the 90s, when large scale road development played very badly with ordinary people. Communities and environmental groups will now take on the Government over every inch of tarmac."

So you thought the Battle of Newbury, Twyford Down and Fairmile had forced the government to halt its construction programme for new roads? Well now roadbuilding is back again to haunt us. Last week John 'Two Jags' Prescott announced the transport budget for local authorities for the next five years. Four billion pounds - nearly half the total - is to be spent on roads. That's enough to build forty more Newbury bypasses. It looks like it's time to dust down yer D-locks and take out yer tunnelling tools again.

The protests against the new programme have already started. In a preemptive strike, besuited protesters stormed the Department of Environment, Transport and the Regions in London, and locked themselves in the offices of ministers Michael Meacher and Lord McDonald. The car park was blocked by a group linked with arm tubes and security doors were locked shut, preventing Prescott from parking either of his two Jags.

It's not all bad news. £4.4 billion is to be spent on improvements to public transport and providing more support for pedestrians and cyclists. But hidden in the small print of the Fat Controller's timetable are plans to build a new Worcestershire Wyre Piddle Bypass, a new stage of the Leeds Inner Ring Road, and the East Leeds Link Road. Seventy seven more schemes are in the pipeline for funding in the next five years.

Bob the Builder's corporate chums will be jumping for joy at the news, but it certainly won't be a Christmas number one for residents in Salisbury, where plans for the bypass which Labour scrapped when they came into office have now been dug up and repackaged. Or in Lancaster, where the Lancaster Western bypass would trash the Lune Valley Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), or Carlisle, where the privately-financed Northern Development Route will destroy a section of Hadrian's Wall - a World Heritage Site.

A New Battle of Hastings

One of the prime candidates for future funding is the planned Hastings Bypass in Sussex. Despite a load of greenwash about tough measures to reduce environmental impact, the bypass would destroy two SSSI's and pass through an area of outstanding national beauty and the environmentally important floodplains of the Rother and Brede Rivers. And consultants evaluating the project warn that it may actually increase unemployment in Hastings which is not one of southern England's most prosperous areas.

That's not to say there might not be economic benefits. It's just that it's large corporations which stand to gain, with precious little expected to 'trickle down' to the resident Hastings' community. As at Newbury, construction of the Hastings bypass will open up the way for in-fill development, with business parks and housing estates already planned for neighbouring greenfield site areas. As at Newbury, the bypass would become one part of a larger national road scheme - a long-distance south coast link-road leading to Folkestone and Ashford. And as at Newbury, public debate about the Hastings bypass is being heavily manipulated by business, the local media, and the three main political parties, all of whom strongly support the road. All this despite surveys which show most local people would prefer better public transport rather than new roads.

Bypassing Logic

Meanwhile, plans for a big-budget Hollywood film drama, starring Sigorney Weaver, of the UK anti-roads movement have been put on hold. If you've been lamenting the lack of excitement in your life since events at Newbury, or if you weren't there at all, it looks like we'll all have a chance to bag a starring role as the reallife drama unfolds once again....

CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK

The police were out in force last month at a car-park near Windsor and Eton Train Station after one of their number was called a moose. For some time this place has been used by young people to meet up and chill out, so bored cops looking for fun have recently also been turning up to harass them. When one woman, who had had enough of this, called a WPC a moose no less than eleven coppers stampeded in to arrest her. After locking horns about it later at the station she was released without charge.

Christmas Bonus

More than two and a half years after Simon Jones was killed at work, the Director of Public Prosecutions has decided to charge Euromin, the company Simon was working for, and its general manager with manslaughter. Simon was sent to work inside the hold of a ship with no training and was dead within two hours of starting work.

Since Simon's death his friends and family have campaigned for the events surrounding his death to be the subject of court action. Their campaign has involved shutting down Euromin's docks, occupying the employment agency that sent Simon to work for Euromin, occupying the Department of Trade and Industry on the day that Simon's case was being debated in parliament, shutting down Southwark Bridge outside the Health and Safety Executive, winning a judicial review challenging the Crown Prosecution Service's decision not to prosecute and, this September, picketing their headquarters in London demanding a prosecution. These actions, of course, had no influence on the decision to prosecute which, in the words of the Director of Public Prosecutions, was "reached without unnecessary delay". This is only the sixth time that any company director has been taken to court for the charge of Manslaughter by Gross Negligence. So remember - direct action never works. Honest.

Wassa NATTA?

Anti-terrorism posters by the Met police are being subverted by campaigners from The Network Against The Terrorism Act (NATTA), drawing attention to the new laws which come into force on February 19th. The Act has such a wide definition that everyone from striking workers to anti-genetic campaigners could be tarred with the terrorism brush (SchNews 268). But it is the police powers to stop, search and harass that should get alarm bells ringing - especially if the old Prevention of Terrorism Act is anything to go by. Out of five thousand mainly Irish people stopped under the old PTA less than 7% were charged, even fewer convicted, with one former Home Secretary revealing "The object of the exercise is not just to secure convictions but to secure information."

A Right Carry On

Britain's planning system faces chaos after a ruling in the High Court last week. Controversial planning decisions are often decided by the Environment Minister, however lawyers successfully argued that this is in breach of Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 'the right to a fair hearing.' The ruling is the first time an English court has used the Human Rights Act to declare existing laws incompatible with human rights. The Government are now appealing.

A decision last week by Hampshire County Council to grant permission for a waste incinerator at Marchwood, near Southampton is being challenged under the Human Rights Act on the grounds that it breaches the rights of

nearby residents.

The police have started to threaten people who take their photos at demonstrations with the Human Rights Act. John Voos, a snapper with The Independent was taking pictures at animal rights demo when a copper told him "If you take my photograph and publish it, you will be infringing my human rights and I will take action on that basis." A bit rich when you can't go to any demo nowadays without the police sticking cameras in yer face. Voos has written to the Association of Chief Police Officers to find out their position asking "If the law does provide for this, how on earth do you cover demonstrations in the future?" www.pressgazette.co.uk/

Islington (IT net).

In Newham things quickly started to go wrong for CSL, owned by Deloitte Touche. Under new 'private sector management practices' claims lay unprocessed, staff are bullied and victimised and not surprisingly leave on a daily basis creating even more work for those left. Things finally came to a head when three workers, UNI-SON shop stewards, were disciplined simply for raising the issue. All three were suspended on a charge of 'causing grave embarrassment'! 'It's a bad day for accountability and a bad day for freedom of expression" Dan Lyons, Uncaged.

Yesterday the High Court decided that the rights of companies to make money by any means, no matter how horrible the animal experiments or threats to human health, were more important than the public's right to know.

Imutran applied for an injunction to prevent the public from having access to details of horrific pig-to-primate organ transplant experiments, which were leaked to the anti-vivisection group Uncaged (see SchNEWS 279).

The huge volume of confidential documents - the largest set of data on animal experiments ever leaked - suggests that the company, a subsidiary of bio-tech giants Novartis, has not been frank with the public and the scientific community. In addition, the documents also starkly reveal failures in Home Office regulations and the Government's bias in favour of commercial researchers. However, the judge decided that commercial confidentiality was more important than human health risks, animal welfare or the fact that Imutran 'falsified' results, Uncaged has been given the right to appeal.

TRUE LIES

Hiding behind corporate confidentiality is nothing new, and neither is the Government's continued protection of big business. In the field of vivisection this looks set to continue, as under commercial confidentiality clauses, animal experiments are not included in the Freedom of Information Act that became law last November (blink and you missed it, we did).

The National Anti Vivisection Society (NAVS) launched a legal challenge to the blanket confidentiality clause in animal experiments Licence Application Forms. The Home Office changed the clause, but then advised all applicants to request that everything on their application form be treated as confidential!

NAVS want Freedom of Information to apply to animal experiments: access to the technical details (no names or addresses) of proposed experiments would enable those interested in animal welfare to challenge unnecessary and repetitive experiments and suggest non-animal methods. Most of what occurs in animal laboratories is never published, and what is, is selected by the person responsible. If an experiment proves fruitless, or fails, its occurrence is unlikely to see the light of day. Yet this is the research that probably needs the most scrutiny.

Vivisectors claim that if animal experiments were included in Freedom of Information legislation they would be under threat of attack from the animal rights movement. But that's a bit of a red herring as disclosure of names and addresses are not needed. However, vivisectors aren't shy about publishing their names and what they did with puppies and electrodes in Journals like 'Cutting up Little Fluffy Animals Weekly' (OK, we made that name up, but you get the picture).

It isn't just animal experiments that are not covered in the Freedom of Information Act. You'd think such an Act would give us the right to er...get information. How naive! There are so many 'exemptions' that the Government can restrict a whole load of information if they think it would 'prejudice the effective conduct of public affairs'. Whose affairs they're talking about aren't made clear, but you can probably hazard a guess. They don't even have to admit whether such information exists!

MAD BILL DISEASE

The report into the BSE crisis criticised the secrecy involved, citing "a clear policy of restricting the disclosure of information about BSE" and that "had there been a policy of openness rather than secrecy" this would have led "to remedial measures being taken sooner than they were". You might think that Freedom of Information might have prevented the BSE crisis, but it wouldn't have made any difference, since the Government admitted that "Under the Bill, reports about BSE given to Ministers would be covered by the exemption in Clause 33 but it would then be for the Minister or the relevant public authority to decide whether the balance of public interest lay in disclosure or maintaining the exemption". And we know what the Government's priorities are.

CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK

For Playing Spoons... Two Dutch activists were arrested for "public violence" after "slamming" a spoon on the gate of a police station where three fellow activists were being held. After a wild chase by the coppers, which included nearly getting run over, the two were detained for 24 hours and fined about £250 and £300 each.

The Act contains a clause on safety information that would mean all official reports on transport accidents, nuclear incidents, chemical spills, etc. would be kept secret if it wasn't in the public interest. For example we are assumed to have no right to know about problems like British Nuclear Fuels lying about its nuclear quality control data, or trains that ignore warning signals. Whether something is in the public interest will ultimately be determined by the Information Commissioner, who can ask for disclosure of exempt information where there is an overriding public interest. However, the Authorities can reject the Commissioner's requests and keep the information secret!

So you might well ask, what will be the point of the Freedom of Information Act when it finally comes into force in April 2002? As the old proverb goes, "To tell you the truth, we're lying"

Free party organisers have complained that Sussex Police thwarted their dastardly plans after stopping 3 free parties on New Year's Eve. A spokesperson for the Webb-Kirby/Zel sponsored police said, "If people want to party then they will have to pay through the nose at one of our corporate clubs rather than trying to do it on the cheap." Accusing the free party organisers of being 'arrogant' the spokesperson added, "How the fuck are we meant to fleece people if these bastards keep putting on free events?

FULL ON INFILL

We can't believe it either - but it's five years this Sunday since work started on the Newbury bypass, kicking off the biggest anti-roads pro-

test this country has ever seen.

Some of the south east's most beautiful countryside was trashed to build the nine mile £101 million road, which even the Dept of Transport and local council admitted wouldn't solve Newbury's traffic congestion. Still, the road has meant that developers get their greedy mits on a lot of previously inaccessible land. So let the infill begin!

* The town's biggest employers Vodaphone threatened to leave if they weren't given the green light to build a massive new HO on a greenfield site. The company, who helped finance the probypass lobby, refused to move to Greenham Common because it 'wasn't prestigious enough' and because of the threat of the peace women -

two women in an old caravan.

* Trencherwood Homes Ltd. have the council's support in building 1700 houses on land originally laid out by Capability Brown, and which opponents calculate will generate an extra 4,000 car journeys a day. During a Local Plan enquiry it emerged that Trencherwood were one of four building companies who had contributed towards the council's legal fees which of course has nothing to do with why the council supported the new village

Sandleford Park is to be built on a new greenfield site that will get a new college - and possibly a 3-storey Conference Centre.

* Sutton Estates is currently testing the water to get permission to build 750 houses on part of the old battlesite. Local resident Janet Griffen told SchNEWS that the questionnaires Suttons had sent out were so 'loaded' that "people have crossed out all three options!"

The Real Petrol Price

January 16th is the tenth anniversary of the start of "Desert Storm", the land invasion of Iraq in the Gulf War, when after a massive bombing campaign using depleted uranium, Western tanks rolled into Iraq blasting anything that moved. When the war was all but over thousands of Iraqis, Palestinians, Bangladeshis and Sudanese tried to escape along the road to Basra, back to southern Iraq. These people were spotted by American jets who incinerated the whole convoy using napalm B, cluster bombs and rockets. Another incident that wasn't widely reported was the deliberate burying alive of thousands of Iraqi troops in trenches, using snow ploughs attached to tanks and combat earth movers. These troops were not given the option of surrendering. Other massacres include the carpet bombing of civilian areas, seven times more explosives were dropped on Iraq than were dropped on Hiroshima, and the deliberate bombing of the Al-Amiriya civilian bunker in which up to 400 women and children burned to death.

There have been crippling sanctions imposed on Iraq in which hundreds of thousands of children have died of starvation and disease. Two former UN Humanitarian Co-ordinators for Iraq have since resigned in protest stating, "We are in the process of destroying an entire society. It is as simple and as terrifying as that. It is illegal and immoral." Both have called for

the sanctions to be lifted.



"Imagine witnessing devastating plague and sitting on a cure for fear of Incurring shareholders revolt."

Ben Jackson, Action for Southern Africa

With AIDS sweeping through Africa like the plague, the world's most powerful drug companies are showing the usual corporate compassion by taking the South African government to court to stop cheap drugs being used to help people with HIV.

In 1997 former President Nelson Mandela passed a law which gave the country the right to buy huge amounts of generic drugs and sell them cheaply to help people with HIV. The law also gives South Africa the right to 'compulsorily license' HIV drugs allowing a drug to be produced more cheaply by someone other than the patent holder, if it's in the public interest.

The response of the pharmaceutical industry, the US and EU governments was swift and deadly. The US threatened trade sanctions, and the European Commission argued the law broke World Trade Organisation rules. Meanwhile 40 pharmaceutical companies took legal action to declare the law unconstitutional.

This has meant, in the words of the South African's health minister "pioneer-Ing legislation...has, to date, been crippled by legal challenges, cynically mounted by multinational companies, in order to preserve their narrow self-interest in exorbitant financial profit"

First Aid

25 million people are currently infected by the HIV virus in sub-Saharan Africa, yet only 25,000 Africans (0.1 per cent of those infected) receive the drugs which are available in the West to help prolong lives.

The big drug firms are scared that if they turn a blind eye to cheap drugs in South Africa it will set a dangerous precedent and hit their future balance sheets. Yet just 1 per cent of drug revenues comes from the entire African continent.

One of the most blatant examples of a company profiteering from AIDS is Pfizer. Pfizer manufactures fluconazole which is used to treat two common infections associated with HIV which are often fatal if left untreated. Fluconazole costs over 10 times more in South Africa than high-quality equivalents available from countries like Thailand and India. The result of Pfizer's profiteering is that many hospitals in the country have insufficient stocks of fluconazole, and many people suffer or die because they cannot afford the private sector price for the drug.

The Treatment Action Campaign is currently preparing legal action against the company.

TRIP'ed Out

"We cannot allow global trade rules to be used to put the commercial interests of drug companies over the public health interests of millions in Southern Africa.' Ben Jackson, Action for Southern Africa.

The South African government has come under fire because they have signed up to the World Trade Organisations TRIPS - Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property Rights. This allows owners of 'intellectual property' to control the exploitation of their inventions worldwide, determining the price at which they can be sold and the royalties they receive. Brazil meanwhile - which has not yet fully implemented the WTO TRIPs agreement has cut the cost of anti-retroviral treatments by 72 per cent since 1996 by using locally made versions in a national treatment scheme. In Sao Paulo AIDS deaths have fallen by 53 per cent since 1995.

Still, what do the drug companies care? Well, another one of those companies taking part in the legal action is GlaxoSmithKline who recently became the world's biggest drugs group. It's mission statement says how it "is committed to improving the quality of human life by enabling people to do more, feel better and live longer." But that is, of course only if

you've got the cash.

The court date is scheduled for the 5th March at Pretoria High Court and could run for years. Whoever eventually loses will face costs running into tens of millions of pounds.

International Briefs

Bosses at Microsoft Poland are reported to be none to pleased after it was discovered that the thesaurus for Word 2000, comes up with "exploitation" and "inequality" if you enter a search for "capitalism". **At least 10,000 "monkeys" occupied government offices in New Delhi, India, in protest at the governments solution to the City's monkey problem, which is to round up the animals and take them to outlying areas, that are already overpopulated with the primates. ** Meat eaters in India are being shocked into thinking about their carnivorous habits - PETA the animal welfare group unveiled billboards in Mumbai (formerly Bombay) depicting a chicken tucking into to a nice juicy human leg on a plate. This campaign is to extend to the rest of India then to US, UK, Germany, Italy and the Netherlands. **150 people were arrested in Bhopal, India as they marched in protest against the Development Forum taking place in the city, attended by the World Bank and Asia Development Bank. **21 protesters were arrested in Ankara, Turkey, for protesting outside a meeting between Turkish officials and the IMF. The country was bailed out of financial crisis by the IMF in 1999, and is now being forced to implement severe austerity measures.

Inside SchNEWS

Turkey's political prisoners remain on hunger strike in protest against their removal to isolated cells containing 1-3 people with no access to lawyers or medical treatment. The move comes as an attempt by the Turkish authorities to break up the solidarity and self-regulation of political prisoners. The hunger strikers have now been holding their fast for around 85 days and many are in a critical condition.

In recent weeks 4 police have been killed and around 30 injured through retaliation attacks to the storming of 20 prisons on December 20th in which 30 prisoners were killed.

The Turkish government has imposed a censor on the press, with all reporting relating to the situation of the detainees prohibited, whilst 5 branches of Turkey's Human Rights Association have been closed with members detained.

Last week four activists were arrested whilst laying a wreath outside the Istanbul offices of the Democratic Left Party, they are currently held in prison awaiting trial which could result in 1 year sentences.

A cyber version of Tales of the Unexpected The Centre for International Legal Studies was stuck for a speaker for a conference on international trade last October in Salzburg. So they visited the website www.gatt.org and sent an invitation to Mike Moore, the World Trade Organisations Director General. They received a reply he couldn't attend, but that he'd send Dr Andreas Bichlbauer to speak in his place.

Dr. Bichlbauer attended the conference and gave a speech entitled "Trade Regulation Relaxation and Concepts of Incremental Improvement: Governing Perspectives from 1970 to the Present". The gist of the speech was that Italians have a lesser work ethic than the Dutch, that Americans would be better off auctioning their votes in the presidential election to the highest bidder and that the primary role of the WTO was to create a one-world culture. The speech didn't go down too well, not because of the brutal truth of the role of the WTO, but because of its reference to Italians. Despite receiving a pieing on leaving the conference, Dr Bichlbauer, defended his speech, "While we of course do not advocate vote-selling or siestabanning at the present time, it is quite true that efficiency and the streamlining of culture and politics in the interests of economic liberalisation is at the core of the WTO's programme' A few days later Dr Bichlbauer was on his deathbed. Allegations began to fly that perhaps the Dr had been targeted by his own organisation who were none too impressed by his honesty. A week later Dr Bichlbauer's death was announced by e-mail.

The twist in the tail then became apparent. Dr Bichlbauer was an impostor - the organisers of the conference had been the victims of a hoax. If they'd looked at the website a bit more closely they would have perhaps realised that it wasn't run by the WTO, but by anti trade campaigners "The Yes Men". A spokesman for the group later stated "We think the ethical thing to do is to represent the WTO more honestly than they represent themselves". Full story at www.theyesmen.org/wto.

SHAG ATTACK

The Campaign to shut down Huntingdon Life Sciences (HLS) is fast becoming one of the most significant in the animal rights movement's history. The speed, methodology, and determination with which one of the world's biggest animal testing laboratories is being brought to it's knees, almost entirely by the efforts of volunteer grassroots activists, denotes the endless possibilities of what a small community of passionate cam-

paigners can do.

Huntingdon Life Sciences is Europe's - and one of the world's - largest contract animal testing laboratories. They are based in Alconbury, Cambridgeshire, but also have a smaller lab in Suffolk and one in Princetown, New Jersey USA. Everyday 500 animals die a horrible death after being slowly poisoned. At any one point there were over 70,000 animals in the HLS labs suffering a fate worse than death. HLS specialises in testing the toxicity of agrochemicals, GMOs, food colourings, adhesives, washing powders, and various pharmaceutical products. They're a contract company which means that they carry out research on behalf of others, and their list of customers includes some very unsavoury companies: Aventis, GlaxoSmithkline, Monsanto, Texaco, and Union Carbide. "Your Secret is our Secret" is HLS's motto, and there really must be a lot of secrets in this club.

HLS have been carrying out their dirty business since 1951, but have only relatively recently come into the spotlight due to a number of undercover investigations. The most famous one was in March 1997, when Channel 4 screened a programme in the "Countryside Undercover" series called "It's a Dog's Life". The programme showed harrowing undercover footage of the barbaric treatment of Beagle puppies being punched and thrown against walls. After the programme HLS share prices plummeted and have never recovered.

In late November of 1999 a small group of animal rights campaigners inspired by the successful campaigns to close down Consort Beagles, and Hillgrove and Shamrock farms started the group Stop Huntingdon Animal Cruelty (SHAC), with the sole intention of working against HLS until it was closed.

TACTICS

It seems almost unbelievable that in such a short space of time any campaign group could take on a large multi-million pound company to such devastating effect. As well as their sheer determination a major key to their success has been the diversity of their tactics. As well as causing trouble for HLS and it's employees they have had great success targeting its customers, shareholders and investors. The wide range of targets leaves the potential for people around the country, and even the world, to join in the campaign in their own towns.

Every day of the week a crowd of protesters assemble outside the gates of HLS's main lab site in Huntingdon. All day long as workers of HLS come and go they are greeted with screaming protesters who push their conscience to the limit. SHAC holds national demonstrations every eight weeks where invariably over a thousand protesters show up for the action whether it be at the lab, in the town centre (often Cambridge), or at the offices of a company affiliated with HLS in the area. Large demonstrations

are routinely followed up with several home demonstrations of the workers. Moving around like this makes it harder for the police to keep up, and also stretches their resources. In order for the police to continue to protect the company's laboratories they were given an extra £1 million at the beginning of the year, but with the momentum of the campaign at the moment it doesn't look that this will go very far.

Campaigners though haven't stopped at HLS offices and their workers, customers of the company have also been targeted, office occupations, phone and fax blockades, and demos outside people's houses have been successful to the effect that British Biotech, Servier and the James Black Foundation have all pulled out with statements that they will never use HLS again. The campaign has now also hit the high street with a campaign for the boy-

cott of GlaxoSmitkline products. In February campaigners from Manchester, Liverpool and Wigan staged a bit of 'ethical shoplifting'. In Tesco, Boots and Asda stores they removed all Glaxosmithkline products from the shelves and then blockaded the checkouts with the full trolleys- "A great day was had by all, and we're now planning to do one every week. For people who can't make it to the gates of HLS every week because of distance, then 'ethical shop lifting' of Glaxo Smithkline products is definitely the tactic to adopt" - Campaigner

To date the most successful tool in the battle to shut down this vile place has been to target those who have shares in the lab. SHAC publish on the internet the names and addresses of those across England and internationally who have shares in HLS. In response to a SHAC mail-out to all shareholders with an information pack and a persuasive request to sell their HLS shares, countless shareholders immediately sold theirs after learning of what the company actually does. Nightly crowds of angry protesters on doorsteps persuaded others to sell. SHAC then found that a great way to strip HLS of even larger numbers of shares was through the targeting of corporate shareholders who may own thousands or even millions - of shares in the company. A number of demonstrations have been held in the City of London, where a lot of HLS's shareholders are based.

In December 2000, over 60 demonstrators left Liverpool Street station each with an underground ticket and a tube map, vexing police who had no idea where the target destination was. Their first stop was the Bank of New York, in Canary Wharf, where protestors managed to fill the reception area, and bring the building to a standstill for 1½ hours, stopping 200 workers getting into their offices. After this the protest moved onto the offices of two more shareholders. These protests combined with other publicity stunts, office occupations, phone, mail and internet blockades, have resulted in large amounts of HLS stock being continuously dumped on the market plummeting HLS's share price. This year the price of a share reached an all time low of 1.75p a share.

The success of the shareholder campaign lead to SHAC receiving a tip off from people working within the city that a key to a company's ability to trade shares is their market makers, and two market makers are required to keep a company on the stock market. HLS's market makers have now been persuaded to drop them, successfully delisting HLS who now have to trade in a crappy little system called cites, alongside your local corner shop.

SHAC International

Because of the international nature of HLS and its customers SHAC's web is slowly spreading across the globe to customers and shareholders of HLS in their head offices all over Europe and beyond. In spring 2000 SHAC USA was 'born' to target the New Jersey lab and American shareholders. So far they've managed to persuade the Bank of New York to dump 7 million shares, and cause the resignation of the President of the HLS New Jersey Lab.

"We have contacts all over the world including in New Zealand targeting the only shareholder out there, sending them a powerful message that we will pursue anyone involved in HLS to the ends of the earth if we have to, whatever it takes we will close the hell hole down". SHAC

Practically speaking, all animal experiments are untenable on a scientific basis, for they possess no statistical validity or reliability whatsoever. They merely perform an alibi function for pharmaceutical companies, who hope to protect themselves thereby from legal liability." Herbert and Margot Stiller, 'Vivisection and Vivisector'

Last week showed just how far governments are prepared to go to protect private business interests from campaigners who expose their unethical practices. Science Minster Lord Sainsbury stepped in to shore up the sinking vivisection agency Huntingdon Life Sciences (HLS), while Tony Blair underlined the company's "right to conduct legitimate research" as the government pressured the Royal Bank of Scotland to extend the company's overdraft and forked out an extra Il million to help the Cambridgeshire police protect the company's laboratories. If only Britain's public transport, organic farming, and alternative energy industries received such commitment.

HLS's appalling cruelty to animals has been exposed 3 times in the past ten years by undercover researchers. In 1997 the Channel 4 'Countryside Undercover' programme caught HLS staff red-handed on film punching animals and falsifying data with one worker admitting on tape "You can wipe your ass on that data."

Despite last weeks rescue from a secretive US-based financial backer (who SchNEWS predicts won't remain anonymous for very long), HLS are still in deep shit. The Daily Telegraph's less than compelling advice for anyone thinking of buying shares in the company is "One for the brave or the mad". The Stop Huntingdon Animal Cruelty (SHAC) campaigners sure ain't going to go away in a hurry, promising "If anyone is reading this and considering baling out HLS, be warned. We are prepared for a long fight, and while our goal is HLS, we will take on anyone who gets in our way.'

So why is the government so keen on backing a company widely seen as the dregs of the capitalist barrel? On the surface they talk about preventing business and jobs from being lost if HLS and similar companies are driven out of "legitimate" scientific research which will result in the medical breakthroughs needed to save lives. In reality HLS are a commercial contract laboratory who carry out experiments for big business clients from all over the world. A lot of this work is tests on the toxicity of new paints, detergents, adhesives, solvents and other consumer products. SchNEWS wonders just how many lives a new brand of bathroom cleaner is going to save?

Tony Blair says the government is "on the side of science" over animal research. However, much of today's medical research is directed towards treatments for 'lifestyle' diseases such as cancer or into new brands of headache tablets, anti-depresssants, and appetite suppressants. Often these drugs don't actually cure patients - they just alleviate the symptoms of an illness. And while we're talking about saving lives, the drugs companies spend only a fraction of their research budgets on cures for really big killers such as malaria and sleeping sickness which infect people with no money who live in far away parts of the world.

How much effort is going into promoting low-cost traditional methods of healing which aren't based around the use of chemical drugs, such as Chinese medicine which have been applied successfully for thousands of years? As usual, Tony is talking baloney and this has nothing at all to do with saving lives - just allowing big business to carry on as usual developing new products to part the sick from their money and using junk science to hoodwink the public.

BARBARIC & USELESS

"Vivisection is barbaric, useless, and a hindrance to scientific progress," says Dr Werner Hartinger, German Chief Surgeon, which is not surprising when you consider how different humans are from laboratory animals such as cats, dogs, and marmosets. You don't need to have a PhD in applied biochemistry to be able to work out that if drugs can have different effects on different people, they will also have different effects on different species. The Fund for the Replacement of Animals in Medical Experiments and the RSPCA have reported that in 92% of experiments the use of animals does not provide any additional relevant information whatsoever about drug toxicity. Alternatives to animal experiments using cell cultures, artificial medical systems, and mathematical and Crap Arrests of the Week For having a piss. A young reveller was recently arrested after answering a call of nature against a bush outside a house party in America. Surely a case of over zealous cops taking the piss(er). For Raising a Flag! A protestor at Bush's Inauguration was arrested for raising an anarchist flag at the Navy Memorial.

computer models do exist, but the government would rather bale out HLS than force the medical industry to use more humane research methods.

Last week Mark Matfield of the Research Defence Society, the organisation that represents vivisectionits, asked: "Do you want to have a biotech industry in this country or not?" It's time to show the vivisectors that if biotechnology means the unnecessary killing and torture of animals, the answer is simply NO.

The police can already stop protests using the Public Order Acts, the Criminal Justice Acts, the Criminal Damage Act, the Harassment Act, the Interfering in Fat Cats Making Money Act, numerous trade union laws, and long-standing legislation outlawing obstruction, conspiracy, and breach of the peace (OK, we made one of them up). Even Ann Widdicome has raised concerns about the human rights implications of the proposed new laws! And coming soon is the Terrorism Act (see SchNEWS 268) which one MP described as "potentially turning activist movements into terrorist movements"

NO CHOKE

How would you feel if you knew that over the coming weekend your health would be seriously at risk, hospital admissions would increase and sufferers of heart and lung conditions could face premature death? You may have missed it, but these were precisely the conditions over much of Britain last weekend.

The dangerous concentration of traffic and power station pollutants, brought on by the high pressure of the previous week resulted in the worst air pollution incident since 1991. A recent study by economists at St Andrews University revealed that air pollution is responsible for up to 19,500 premature deaths a year in Britain alone.

* Climate change is high on the political agenda, following last year's failed negotiations at the Hague and the publication of a three year report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. The report, written by 639 authors, paints a bleak picture and serves as a harsh warning for the future of the planet. It concluded that human activity was primarily responsible for global warming and that the scale of the damage would be significantly higher than first estimated. Temperatures and sea levels will continue to rise and ice sheets will shrink for thousands of years, even when the concentrations of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere has eventually been stabilised. It is hoped the report will add some strength to the implementation of the 1997 Kyoto Protocal of reducing greenhouse emmissions, which is due to be discussed later this year. Apparently the US is trying to delay the talks because they are not ready yet!

* Mass destruction of the Amazon rainforest looks on the cards thanks to a huge 'regeneration' plan. 'Advance Brazil', would see the construction of roads, railways, waterways and hydroelectric dams over a seven year period. Aimed at connecting the inhabitants of the rainforest to the populated areas of Brazil, the plan would leave 28% of the forest destroyed, 28% untouched and the rest with varying degrees of destruction. "If these development plans go through, we'll lose the largest remaining wilderness on Earth...And that doesn't even consider the enormous impacts on the carbon cycle, global climate and greenhouse warming," said Scott Bergen, a scientist at Oregan State University.

* Rising Tide have called for March 21 to be a day of international action against climate change. Coinciding with the International Day Against Racism, the Season Of Carbon Action will be launched and groups and individuals are asked to organise their own actions. www.risingtide.nl

THE SHAPE OF NATURE

"A mushroom cloud of powerful hallucinogenic spores are exploding over Brighton, bringing out the population in a red and white spotty rash of excitement"

After being spirited into the empty and decaying "Un"-Co-operative Bank in central Brighton, the SPOR crew of proliferating schrooms soon set to work. The venue was tidied up, a few basic repairs made, the artists who had ventured from near and far began to install their pieces, and the space was made safe for children. On Tuesday 23 January, SPOR sprouted up from the underground once more with a much needed new Community Space for Brighton.

The response was overwhelmingly enthusiastic - smiles on people's faces and feelings of being at ease as they wandered round or sat relaxing and chatting with new friends. There was plenty to do while the Shape of Nature continued manifesting throughout the week: looking at paintings and sculptures; dipping into the vast library of films and videos on themes from ecological destruction and resistance to personal documentaries and features; listening to a wide spectrum of music; attending workshops and drop-ins on independent community radio, climate change, squatters rights/info, biodiesel, alternative education and home schooling, forest gardening plus more; a kids' space; delicious vegan food served up every evening; and a weekend of celebrating in a wonderful atmosphere with lots of vibed up grinning jesters...

Having decided to continue into a second week, SPOR shut the doors for a couple of days to retrieve those particles scattered around the cosmos (and to tidy up). Wednesday morning found them waking as usual to check for new mushrooms popping up. Instead, they discovered three sets of documents taped to the outside of the doors and on a window. On closer inspection these turned out to be a court summons, the appearance of those ubiquitous "persons unknown" requested less than 24 hours later.

After a few phone calls to legally sussed friends including the Advisory Service for Squatters, the scope of what the Co-op and the legal establishment were attempting to do began to emerge.

CRIMINAL ACT

Fact: In British Law it is stated that a minimum of 48 hours must be given as notice to people who are summoned to court [County Court Rules, Rule 5, order 24, paragraph 1b]. The occupants of the SPOR Community Space were served papers on the 30 January 2001 to attend Brighton County Court at 10am on the 31 January, giving them less than 24 hours in which to seek legal representation and prepare their defence. By trying to rush the case through court without giving evidence, the Co-op Bank's solicitors, DMH [of 100 Queens Road, Brighton], were obviously attempting to by-pass the legal safeguards written into the Law that are there to protect the rights of ordinary people. Hoping that Judge Kemp [not Hemp] would recognise this underhand ploy, SPOR kept their appointment in court - with no legal representation. They requested the judge give them time to find a solicitor, and to postpone the hearing until they had prepared their case. The judge refused and immediately granted a Warrant for the possession of the building. This was done on the grounds that as SPOR were holding an art exhibition, pictures had been hung on the walls which may have caused "damage" to the property. All this, despite the fact that the judge actually acknowledged in court that the occupation was of benefit to the community.

SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL SPOR!

If you feel that the law was misused against the SPOR community, please come and sign our petition at the SPOR benefit on Saturday 3 February - an all day event starting at midday with kid's activities, food at 6pm, cinema, exhibitions, and live music and DJs across the evening.

Because the Co-op Bank has twisted the function of the Law to prevent justice taking its rightful course, SPOR is launching a campaign against them. This devious attempt to have yet another free Community Space shut down in Brighton must be resisted. Bear in mind that the Coop's lease on the building runs out in March - in the meantime it is not being used, and is falling into decay and disrepair, vandals have broken windows, and with a leaky roof, mould and damp have already got a grip on the internal walls.

Many people bank with the Co-op because they "invest ethically and do not support oppressive regimes". In this case, Co-op investors' money has been used to pay the solicitors to block SPOR's right to legal representation.

GROWING ROOTS

When evicted, the pressure is on to be re-absorbed by corporate crap. It's easy to forget why Community Spaces were occupied in the first place, but there are other options. Not many people know they exist, but Unincorporated Associations can be a good way of getting a group together with legal standing. The organisation then has a legal lever to negotiate with the authorities in those sticky moments.

Unincorporated Associations formalise the democratic process by drawing up a Constitution. This gives the advantage of members of the organisation knowing exactly where they stand. The Constitution states the aims and objectives of the organisation - these can be vague and open-ended so that the activities need not be limited, or as detailed as you like. The Constitution details how membership will be determined; how often meetings will take place; how the Constitution may be amended; what the organisation is able to do - for example, if you don't write into the Constitution that you want to rent buildings you can't do so: and how finances will be handled. This all sounds very formal, but in reality it's actually a way of making life easier for everyone in the long term. How many groups of people working together have fallen apart because of petty niggles? Becoming an Unincorporated Association and drawing up a Constitution hopefully creates a loose framework that everyone agrees on to sort out problems.

MAKING SPACE

The Section 6 that sharp-eyed city dwellers sometimes spot on seemingly empty buildings is a legal document, and only hints at the variety of reasons why people occupy (squat) buildings. From getting off the streets and into a home - there are currently 765,000 empty homes in England - to putting on free parties or art events outside the profit-oriented motives of property owners who control what you do in *their spaces*.

Corporate space consolidates profit and control of the populace.

By contrast, community space loosens things up, opening up the possibility of positive action happening for the benefit of everyone involved. The feeling of inspiration spreads out of the door and onto the streets, freedom from oppression stirs in more and more hearts and minds.

The "Un"-Co-Operative Bank has been occupied to provide a Community Space, where people can meet to create their own environment and the activities that take place in it. Community Spaces are always on the move, adapting to locally changing circumstances. A Community Space is never finished, it is always being constructed, people are always adding to it - with their presence, ideas, and commitment to action...

While buildings in cities often lie empty for months and sometimes even years, the *solutions* to the complex and related problems we face, such as poverty and ecological destruction, can only really be brought into existence if we meet and share ideas and creative visions for the future.

NOT ANOTHER PARTY!

The SPOR infinity crew are holding down another Non-Party benefit event this Saturday. Featuring kid's activities during the day; talks and info; film shows and video; cheap vegan food at 6pm; acoustic music early evening, live performances and DJs later. Space is limited so come early. Communities are loose affiliations of people with enough shared interests to want to come together. The act of joining forces makes individuals potentially stronger; we can learn so much from each other, involve ourselves in a passionate and exciting life. At this point in time, we have this world to lose and through a united effort the same world to gain. Come together now with what you know, together with an open mind, and let's see what positive steps we can take to improve all life on Earth.

So often we are caught in other people's ways of thinking and feeling, we don't even realise it. So many modes of consciousness that appear natural don't lead anywhere except extinction. Contrary to what cynics may tell you, destruction and death are not obligatory.

CIA's SICK CHILE CONCOCTION

Newly declassified US intelligence documents how the extent to which the US sought to destabilise Chilean democracy in the early 1970s, and how it bolstered the post-coup junta of General Pinochet, responsible for the subsequent murder of an estimated 3,000 political opponents.

The Chile Declassification Project, as it is called, was ordered by President Clinton both in response to a request from Spanish magistrates investigating Pinochet's rimes and as a domestic freedom of information exercise in the twilight of his presidency. This fourth and linal batch of documents (released November 13) pushes the total number of documents past the 22,000 mark, most of which come from the State Department, but include many files from the CIA and FBI.

The documents reveal that between 1970 and 1973 the CIA spent a total of \$8 million on destabilization, including a payment of \$1.5 million to the anti-Allende

newspaper El Mercurio.

Following the 1973 coup, which overthrew and excuted the democratically elected socialist president, Salvador Allende, the White House ordered the CIA to "assist the junta in gaining a more positive image." The documents show that the U.S. was aware of the regime's impaign of executions and torture which included women beaten, gang raped, and tortured with electric currents and men burned with cigarettes, hung by the wrists or ankles and torture with electric current, most requently applied to their genitals. However the document reveals that the primary U.S. concern was how to deal with public relations following the execution of two US citizens in Chile's National Stadium.

The two citizens were journalists Charles Horman and Irank Teruggi. An August 1976 State Department memoindum says: "U.S. intelligence may have played an unfortunate part in Horman's death. At best, it was limited to providing or confirming information that helped motivate his murder. At worst, US intelligence was aware the [government of Chile] saw Horman in a rather serious light and U.S. officials did nothing to discourage the logical outcome of [Chilean] paranoia." And similarly for the 24-year-old Teruggi, FBI and CIA records state that U.S. intelligence had obtained Teruggi's Chilean address a year before his death and labelled him a "subversive", raising the possibility that American operatives tipped-off Chilean intelligence to his activities and whereabouts.

Another of the documents' revelations concerns the 1976 assassination in Washington D.C. of Orlando Letelier, Allende's foreign minister, killed by a car bomb with his American assistant while working to galvanise international opposition to Pinochet's regime. The CIA had briefed the State Department on Operation Condor, a plan among Latin America's military dictatorships to assassinate their leftwing opponents. A month before the Letelier killing, Washington ordered its ambassadors in the region to warn Latin leaders not to carry out the murders. The documents show that the American ambassador in Chile, David Popper, refused, believing that Pinochet would take offence at being implicated in terrorism.

The documents indicate Pinochet may indeed have had advance knowledge of the assassination plan. According to declassified cables, he asked the military leader of Paraguay to issue false passports to two agents of Chile's military intelligence who were later convicted of planting the bomb. Pinochet may yet be indicted to


the US on this charge.

Pinochet is currently facing 177 different criminal complaints of torture, murder and other crimes in Chile. The declassified documents can be viewed at the http://foia.state.gov.

We Know

Here's something to make you think- In 1991 just after the poll tax, the travelling scene was under attack. The forces of darkness had already tried smashing peoples' skulls and homes (Nostel Priory in '84 and the Bean Field in '85) after which they impounded 250 vehicles at Stoney Cross in '86 and when that didn't work they used draconian laws like the Public Order Act. With the travelling scene getting stronger they tried the one weapon left to them - heroin.

There was this big site on Lasham Airfield, near Alton, Hampshire where there were about 200 people living, and at the time there was no hash to be had for love or money but, maybe not so surprisingly, heroin was really cheap. There was one woman who came onto site selling the nasty skag shit, but the one thing that she did - and that no other skag dealer does - is give it away on tick. After three weeks she left without trying to get any money back. It ended up with the dealer being owed £4,000, which she seemingly didn't care about. But because of the lack of hash - and the basically free smack - loads of people became addicted to heroin. You might think this is not so bizarre but at the following Solstice Festival I was talking to a friend who spent the winter on another big site in the Midlands and the same scenario happened to him. If you think the state doesn't use dirty tricks to stop something they don't like think again...





26TH - 28TH JANUARY 2001

Switzerland hadn't witnessed such police and army forces deployed since last century's workers movement.

Many activist groups got stopped, body searched, photographed and not allowed to enter the Swiss territory. Others got the same treatment all around Davos including residents and independent media (later allowed in)

24th Jan: Demonstrations take place, including the locking up of a police station in Jura to protest five police being sent to

Davos to bolster numbers.

25th Jan: The local government of Tessin is occupied to protest against repressive policing. USB (the 3rd biggest Swiss bank) is occupied in Lugano and Lausanne, banners are deployed calling for demos the next day.

26th Jan: In Zurich a stink bomb action targets a Globus supermarket. Activists still arrive at borders and 100 Tutte Bianchi (white overall-wearing Ya Basta) block the frontier post of Chiasso for a day and night after their entry is refused. Swiss activists block another frontier post in the afternoon in solidarity.

27th Jan: 200 activists occupy WTO offices in Geneva. Between Lugano and Davos, more than 20 busses close the road in both directions, with 600 people reclaiming the motorway and creating a 10 mile traffic jam, while 200 reclaim the A-road. After being charged, they are allowed to get back to Zurich. 500 are blocked in Landquart train station and block all platforms for trains to Davos. They then try to join the motorway group but



get attacked by police forces with plastic bullets and gas. 15 minutes later, the activists obtain a train to go to Zurich which stops by the motorway in solidarity with the road blockage.

Swisscom telephone network is sabotaged to disrupt the forum 400 demonstrators get through the police line and march towards the Forum. They're stopped 500 yards from it by police barricades and watercanons. In Bern, 150 to 200 activists block traffic on a bridge to protest against the cancellation of trains to Davos.

Everyone gets back to Zurich. As the train is stopped before the centre, a demo starts towards it. Banks, multinational offices and posh cars get trashed on their way while police try to attack the protesters. In the evening there are riots for 2 hours against police attacks and refusal to let the protesters come to the city centre. 130 are arrested through the night.


29th Jan: McDonalds in Lausanne is blockaded, and 200 people demonstrate in Geneva against police repression and occupy the Police and Justice department until they know the whereabouts of unreleased prisoners and assurances that they

will be let out that day.

30th Jan: 50 people are deported from Switzerland, while solidarity actions take place in France, Brasil, Spain, Italy, Finland. Sources: "Davos - account of the events", rézo maloka

"We want to expose the real culprits. The IMF-imposed policies, carried out by the Ecuadorian government in exchange for more loans, have resulted in more than 50% of Ecuador's national budget going to pay off the foreign debt, have burdened the country with the highest rate of inflation in Latin America, the highest levels of corruption, the most advanced rates of deforestation and environmental degradation, and the worst example of maldistribution of wealth on the continent... and this disaster, the result of your policies, is repeating itself throughout the Third World in which you have intervened to "help us rise out of poverty."

Ecuador is currently under a state of emergency after thousands of protestors took to the streets to demand the government withdraw sweeping price rises across the country. Thanks to yet another one of those structural adjustment programmes so beloved by the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the price of cooking fuel has doubled, petrol prices have risen sharply and bus fares have increased by 75%.

However, the government has stated that their economic policy was not negotiatable "as it constitutes the fundamental backbone of the stabilisation plan for dollarisation and the predictions of growth", as agreed with the IMF.

Freedom of association has been suspended, and the army is arresting anyone leading the protests. Once again it is the indigenous people of Ecuador who make up around forty five per cent of the population - that are leading the protests. Obviously they aren't listening to the UK's Development Minister Clare Short who reckons complaints against organisations like the IMF are from those "sitting predominately in the wealthy parts of the world.'

Large areas of the country have been paralysed by blockades and 5,000 people are in the University of Eucador with the police and army firing thousands of bullets and tear gas at them.

GOOD, BAD & THE UGLY

Just over a year ago, over one a half million Indians marched on the capital against the privatisation of the water supply and the dollarisation of the economy. Their protests toppled the president. Vice president Gustavo Noboa took over promising that the water of Ecuador would never be sold off to multinationals, small farmers would be forgiven their debts to the government and fuel prices would be frozen for 2 years.

However, at the same time the army was given a huge pay rise with the help of US "aid" and the promises and signed accords were forgotten. Since then the currency has been dollarised, trade unions banned in the mines and oil fields (all of which are 100% USA owned) the price of petrol was raised by 200%. For poor farmers who depend on getting their produce to market that increases have been devastating. The US is also busy building 11 new military bases in the country under the cover of "fighting the war on drugs"

The Ecuadorian government have warned that "all subversive agents who are responsible for formenting destabilisation... will be arrested for disturbing the peace."

Surely the ones destabilising the economy and formenting unrest are the IMF? SchNEWS reckons it's about time they were shut down, their policies locked up and the key thrown away.

CRAP ARRESTS OF THE WEEK

For eating...Police in Holland arrested 13 people in a shopping mall for the crime of handing out or eating free food. The activists from Free Food Utrecht were ordered to leave as police believed they were in breach of trade regulations. A judge later called for their release, stating that free food did not constitute trading. Free Food said that they would continue to hand out 'nice dinners'.

On The Piste

The World Economic Forum (see Schnews 233) in the Swiss ski resort of Davos recently took place in "fortress"-like conditions. In a temporary suspension of democratic rights, hundreds of armed police "effectively privatised" the area, turning up to 1000 people away from the border who were not "normal-looking" or carried suspicious reading material. After deeming them abnormal and unworthy of entry into the chic resort, police had hoped to spray these folk with horseshit, but were scuppered when local farmers refused to provide manure.

Messages submitted worldwide to a Swiss website were laser-beamed onto the mountain which overlooks Davos. These included suspiciously non-commercial, environment and people-based propaganda, submitted by people probably not wearing suits.

Meanwhile in Brazil a counter-conference called the World Social Forum pissed all over Davos by bringing together 12,000 people from 120 countries. Militant farmers from all around the globe then went on to join Brazilian peasants from the Landless Workers Movement (MST) in Rio Grande, storming a Monsanto biotech research station. They trashed GM corn and soybeans and took over the research centre setting up beds and hammocks.

Another 5000 protesters marched through Madrid to coincide with the WEF, demonstrating against Davos, and the opening up of borders for profit but not for people. White monkey activists dressed in white overalls with helmets and balloons for protection scaled 15 storey buildings, hanging huge banners against immigration laws and capitalism. The police tried to detain 70 white monkeys but had to return them to the crowd after the sound system truck stopped in the road along with 5000 demonstrators and refused to move on.

Casualty

Members of a London Unison branch are bracing themselves for a struggle against the ongoing march of the Private Finance Initiative (PFI). Three London hospitals stand to be privatised by the end of the year in a £500 million project which will result in 750 non-clinical jobs being moved to the private sector. The scheme, which affects the Royal London Hospital, St Bartholomews and the London Chest will see the Royal London completely rebuilt and the closure of the London Chest, a respiratory unit. Phil Burrows, Branch Secretary of the local Unison group, says the plans are shrouded in secrecy, "As a Unison branch, we're supposed to be kept informed, when we had a meeting with management of the hospitals we were told that they had already started infor-mal talks with potential partners." Although the members of the future consortium are not yet decided, previous PFI schemes have shown that partners are likely to be large banks and companies not best known for their commitment to healthcare. "The NHS are jumping ship to the private sector," said Tim Martin, Unison's press officer, "this has all the ingredients for a great scandal. They want to take everything, not just the building, money is going to be sucked out of the NHS into private hands.'

MoD Vs Ruckus

Just in case you still aren't feeling safe on the streets despite the vast array of police powers and acts (see SchNEWS 291), rest assured the MoD Police are coming your way. That's right, the Armed Forces Bill which is currently making its way through parliment could see extended powers granted to the 35,000 MoD officers. Currently their duties are restricted to the investigation of crimes involving service people and defense contractors, intervention within the wider community is prohibited. Under the proposed legislation, officers would be able to stop and search and assist in the breaking up of large demonstrations such as last year's fuel crisis.

* If this wasn't enough, the Government will soon be extending similar powers to the 2,500 British Transport Police.

Inside SchNEWS

On February 6th Leonard Peltier will have spent 25 years behind bars. He was found guilty of killing two FBI agents, despite the fact that the government say they do not know who is responsible for the deaths.

In the 1970's native American Indians began organising in a Pine Ridge reserve against European domination. The government were none too pleased with this and began waging a low intensity war against tribal traditions. Between 1973 and 1976 over sixty native people were murdered on Pine Ridge. Leonard went to the reserve to help defend his people and subsequently got involved in an exchange of fire in which two FBI agents got killed. Leonard was convicted of the murders on false evidence.

Protesters in Nigeria have occupied three of Shells oil pumping stations forcing them to close. In a statement on Monday, the protesters called for the provision of amenities such as schools and roads, as well as jobs for local people. Despite huge revenues being gained from oil production, indigenous people see none of the benefits. Many villages close to oil wells still have no electricity, clinics or other basic services. The protests are reported to be costing the oil company 40,000 barrels a day. Not that Shell will notice this much as they have just announced record profits up 85 percent from last year. Shell are said to be holding talks with representatives from the community.

THE BIG BLOCKADE: FASLANE NAVAL BASE 12TH FEBRUARY

A Scottish regional newspaper, the *Press and Journal* put it this way on February 13th: "It is the very fact that the Faslane protest is drawing support from the ordinary Briton that sets it apart from the norm. And that is the fact that should be explored further by a chastened media and political establishment." The public impact of the Big Blockade has been huge and unprecedented.

So what was it and what happened? Faslane is home to the UK's four Trident nuclear weapon submarines. These subs carry ballistic missiles that can each deliver

many nuclear warheads to targets thousands of miles nway. Each single warhead is eight times the power of the bomb that was dropped on Hiroshima in 1945. Trident is m weapon system of mass terror and destruction and breaches cardinal principles of international law. Conventional campaigning for the past 50 years has not been able to budge successive governments from continuing to threaten to murder millions of innocent civilians and so nonviolent direct disarmament is necessary. At one extreme this involves small groups of activists carrying out secret actions against the system in order to do significant damage to key components. This exactly what Trident Ploughshares activists

Rosie James and Rachel Wenham did in February 1999 when they got on board HMS Vengeance, damaged testing equipment and probably delayed its entry into active service by several weeks. At the same time there have to be opportunities for lots of people to get to get involved in or support the direct action and that's just what the blockades do. The current generation of the Faslane blockades began in February 1999 and have grown steadily since.

So, on 12th February, people gathered from all over the UK and beyond, with activists from Finland, South Korea and the US, and about eight other countries among the 1000 or so who came. Training sessions had been organised far and wide and there was last minute training and briefing in Glasgow over the weekend. We descended on the base at 7 a.m. as the cars of a few workers who had come early to beat the blockade scuttled through the North Gate. By that time the South Gate had already been blocked with a tripod and the arriving activists either sat down in the gateway with locked arms or locked-on to a range of interesting contraptions. After several warnings Strathclyde Police showed that they were ignoring our plea to uphold the law and join us in dismantling Trident; they set about arresting us, 379 activists in all. It has to be said that they did it in a gentle, skillful and good-humoured way, confirming the peaceful and nonviolent ethos of the occasion. It took them at least five hours to clear the gates and we have no doubt that our action caused significant disruption to the base. There was a real carnival atmosphere with weird dressing up, drums, choirs and a piper and a huge variety of people, Scottish church ministers, university students, parliamentarians, a senior Scottish lawyer, full-time campaigners, school students, Peace Campers, people as young as lifteen and as old as eighty, able bodied people and activists in wheelchairs.

Those arrested were taken to the cells in various police stations in and around Glasgow. They were generally well treated and most of the problems that did occur were due to the pressure of numbers. In one police station ten women were subjected to a humiliating strip-search and as I write the police are just about to respond to our complaint, hopefully with a full apology and an assurance that it won't be repeated. Apart from a handful who were held for court the next day (they had warrants out for them or hadn't given the police their full details) everyone was released by around 4 a.m. the next morning, including six members of the For Mother Earth group from Belgium who

got into the base during the night and brought the grand total of arrests to 385.

So what does it add up to? It is pretty significant that nearly 400 people of such human variety of were willing to take part in civil resistance against Trident. There's a growing and spreading understanding that taking direct action against the UK's plans for mass murder is legitimate, effective and essential. It still needs to spread much further to the point where we will have so many peaceful blockaders at the base that we can encircle it with an ongoing presence and seriously and continuously hamper its deadly work. We will go back there in numbers on the 22nd October. Please join us then. You don't have to be up for arrest and there are lots of vital support roles that you can contribute to. It's been a phenomenal year for Trident Ploughshares. Early in 2000 we were still feeling the positive effects of the acquittal in October 1999 of the Trident Three, Angie Zelter, Ulla Roder and Ellen Moxley. Sheriff Margaret Gimblett said then that they

on the Trident-related research barge Maytime, when they threw thousands of pounds worth of lab equipment into Loch Goil. It was the boost from that event and the growing sense that the defenders of Trident at government, military and judicial level had had their confidence dented that brought hundreds to the "Crimebusters" blockade in February and made 185 of them ready to face arrest for sitting down and locking on at the gates of Faslane.

In May, after a carnival in bright sunshine at Faslane when the police were laid back and only arrested two people (refusing to apprehend a group who locked on to a Maypole that became a blockading beam), we had our first major venture at the Atomic Weapons Establishment at Aldermaston. Thames Valley Police were of course aware that we were coming. Although they had been in touch with

Strathclyde to gain from their experience of dealing with our activities, they opted for intimidation but they relaxed into a more reasonable line when their bluff was called. This extended to an understanding that we would use the informal camping site we had intended. There were 46 arrests at the blockade of the site on Monday 22nd May and 55 for the whole weekend. Very few of these were charged -most having been bailed to come back to a police station at a later date.

In a joint Trident Ploughshares/ Menwith Hill Women's Peace Campaign action on 19th June, Helen John, Angie Zelter and Anne Lee got through the new high security fence at the U.S. National Security Agency Space-War Spy Base at Menwith Hill in Yorkshire in an attempt to dismantle the new fence that serves to protect the systems designed to support the new US anti-ballistic missile system. They were apprehended when starting to cut an inner fence surrounding the satellite pic: Andrew McColl.

later a group of Walkers For Peace set off from Aldermaston to cover the 400 miles to Faslane. The core of the group were the monks and nuns of Nipponzan Myohoji, a Bud-dhist order committed to peace. They reached Faslane on 1" August, just in time to join the blockade of the gates. The walkers, led by the monks and nuns, went right up to the North gate of the base and attempted to attach the thou-sands of paper cranes they had brought with them. This was refused and, after a brief ceremony, activists blocked the gateway by sitting down or locking-on to each other. After warnings police moved in to remove, arrest and charge them; 83 in all. The day brought its own ironic twist, as many of the women on the Peace Walk from Aldermaston - who had received a warm and high profile reception from West

Dunbartonshire Council on their way through Clydebank now found themselves in police cells in the same town after being arrested at the blockade. A fine picture, which appeared in lots of papers, was of Hoosey and Teapot on top of the tripod at the South gate; an action which kept it closed for seven hours until they came down voluntarily.

This was followed by our annual four-day disarmament camp in Peaton Wood near Coulport Armaments depot, where Trident warheads are stored and loaded onto submarines. There were a whole variety of actions: a Shift-To-Peace-Work action at Coulport.....several blockades....graffili for peace.... getting into the protected area at Coulport by inflatable boat.....fence cutting galore (especially at the Sponsored Fence Cut)

The action highlight was again a swim to Trident. On 6th August Ulla Roder and Marcus Armstrong were arrested after swimming into the main security area of the base, getting through the boom and right up to the shiplift (where submarines are drawn out of the water for repair), and were only discovered by chance a few metres from the Trident berths. The 'bandit' alarm sounded around the base.

The second trial of Rachel Wenham and Rosie James began on 11th September in Manchester Crown Court. These women had got on board Trident submarine HMS Vengeance in February 1999 and had damaged testing equipment on the conning tower, setting its programme back by several weeks. After an extensive trial involving ex-

pert witnesses the women were found not guilty on the charge of criminal damage re-lating to the spray painting of peace slogans on the Trident submarine HMS vengeance in Barrow last year. Even after extra time the jury was not able to reach a verdict on the first charge relating to the damage to testing equipment on the conning tower – so the result was a 'hung jury'. It was tremendous achievement. They go to trial again on the 3rd April 2001 at Manchester Crown Court.

On November 3rd last year we were all inspired when Susan van der Hijden and Martin Newell got into a transport hanger at RAF Wittering and seriously damaged a truck which, as part of a convoy, regularly takes Trident warheads from Burghfield to Coulport. They have been on remand since and are currently in High Point prison, near Cambridge, and Belmarsh prison in London. On 21st May they will face trial at Chelms-ford Crown Court on charges of criminal damage, estimated at £32,000. In Decem-ber 2000, Member of the Scottish Parliament Tommy Sheridan, went to Greenock jail after refusing to pay the fine imposed on him by Helensburgh District Court for his part in

the Crimebusters' blockade. His determined stance brought the campaign very effectively into the public eye and encouraged us enormously.

Manchester Crown Court saw another famous victory on 16th January this year as Sylvia Boyes and River were acquitted by the jury of conspiracy to commit criminal damage. In November 1999 they had attempted to get to HMS Vengeance in the dock at Barrow but were intercepted while in the water. The verdict showed that when ordinary British people are given the chance to decide on Trident and the rights of activists to intervene, they are willing to be led by their conscience.

After the acquittal of the 'Trident Three' in October 1999, the Lord Advocate of Scotland had referred aspects of the case to the Scottish High Court. The hearing of the Lord Ad-

vocates 'Reference' began as scheduled on the 9th Octoher 2000. The process involved the Crown and the other Interested parties (called Respondents -in this case Angie, Ulla and Ellen) putting their arguments before a panel of three High Court judges. In essence it is a government appeal by the back door against the Gimblett verdict. Although the Lord Advocate set four biased and loaded questions, the actual hearings amounted to a debate on two crucial issues -the legality or otherwise of Trident under international law and the right of ordinary citizens to intervene to uphold the law. It was wonderful to sit in that court and hear the case against Trident being put with considerable cogency. Angie Zelter represented herself and gave two splendid submissions. On the 30th March the High Court duly gave its opinion which was totally supportive of the government line over Trident and said that the three women had no justification for what they did. The Court goes further and suggests that it probably had no business discussing what the government did on matters of defence since, they claim, these matters

are protected by the royal prerogative! We had hoped that this Scottish court would have shown some independence but the response is perhaps to be expected in a nuclear weapon state. The three judges were obviously under a great deal of pressure. At any rate, the campaign goes on and intensifies.

This account has simply cherry-picked the most dramatic events from a year's intensive campaigning. There has not been space to tell of the numerous other actions, the trials, the appeals, the time spent in jails.

Highly radioactive materials are regularly carried on Britain's railways. Most of the traffic consists of used (or spent) fuel rods from nuclear power stations en route to Sellafield on the Cumbrian coast, to be reprocessed - that is to be divided into useable and unuseable elements. Almost all these nuclear power stations are on the railway system and have their own sidings. If not, then the fuel rods are sent by road to the nearest railway loading point.

The fuel rods are extremely dangerous. They contain various elements that are highly radioactive and remain so for lengths of time ranging from a few weeks to 24,000 years.

Each nuclear power station usually produces enough material for one flask per week, although they may wait until they have a couple of flasks before running a train. At certain key junctions, such as at Willesden or Cricklewood, in north west London and Bescot, north of Birmingham, flasks may be kept in a goods yard for some hours, waiting for others coming in. One nuclear train per week per power station is normal.

The trains also sit in sidings at places such as Stratford and Hither Green in the London area and Rugby, either for crew changes or to wait for the rush hour commuter traffic to die down.

The bald statistics will have to suffice. To date in the campaign there have been 1170 arrests, 109 trials and 1074 days have been spent in jail (not including time in police cells). That's impressive, but to tip the balance we need so much more and, in particular, we need more people to join the nonviolent and peaceful disarmament work.

DEATH OF IRANIAN ASYLUM-SEEKER RAMIN KHALEGHI.

On Saturday 3rd February Leicester witnessed its biggest public event in defence of refugees and asylum seekers. Leicester Civil Rights Movement (LCRM) and the city's political refugees staged a demonstration in response to the suicide of 27 year-old Iranian asylum seeker Ramin Khaleghi - a resident at Leicester's hostel.

Over 200 people gathered in town hall square to both remember Ramin's suicide, which happened within a week of hearing of his threatened deportation to Iran, and to highlight the conditions in which asylum seekers are forced to live in Britain.

The gathering marched through the city centre behind banners of LCRM and 'Defend Asylum-Seekers and Refugees'. When parading past the 'hotel', where Ramin decided to take his own life rather than face certain torture or death in his homeland, the demonstration went silent.

However, no small surprise that the ever partial BBC decided to leave the section on the cutting room floor.

Ken Loach is famous for directing some of the most powerful social-realism films ever made British cinema including Kes and Land and Freedom. He also directed the court room scenes in the underground documentary classic of the McLibel trial, Two Worlds Collide. A film Channel Four refused to broadcast.

Sue Lawley, on the other hand, was more than happy to receive her OBE in this year's New Year's Honour's list.

TEACHERS' PEST

Big business was licking its lips this week after New Labour published another green paper on education. The main ingredient is that the government aims to turn half the country's comprehensives over as specialist schools by 2006, allowing schools to concentrate in one subject area. Good news? Well, David Hart, general secretary of the National Association of Head Teachers doesn't think so. He warned that the changes could lead to a market free-for-all.

Dunces

"Schools are the centre of a community. We get the reputation for being a good corporate citizen. But it's not an esoteric, holier-than-thou-thing. We're in business" Robert Halhead, NTL

"For failing schools, the government proposes a welcome dose of market discipline" - Financial Times

Unfortunately this 'market discipline' has already come a little unstuck. In January the National Audit Office published its audy of the 25 Education Action Zones that have been operating around the country (see SchNEWS 226). This is the scheme where the government had the strange idea that business would give money to schools out of the goodness of their hearts (ok, aside from getting their brand names plastered all over the place and getting a say in the running of the schools).

Companies synonymous with education like Shell, British Aerospace, Rentokil and McDonalds joined in. Unfortunately it wasn't enough, and only half the expected two and a half million quid from business materialised and much of this wasn't cash but "services in kind" like 'strategic advice' charged at imaginary rates.

The government meanwhile poured nearly £19 million of taxpayers money into the project. The Audit Office discovered that "some zones were spending large sums of public money before they had sound financial controls in place, creating risk of poor accounting, impropriety or poor value for money."

In fact, only a few zones exceeded their "targets" – notably Newham and Southwark in London. These are handily close to parliament and include companies like Price Waterhouse Coopers, Arthur Andersen and Capita, who are all hoping that their generosity will result in some juicy government contracts in the future.

Still, who cares about a silly little report: 14 more zones are to be created.

Could Do Better

In the New Labour everything-mustgo world, outsourcing is one of the buzz words etched on the blackboards of the corporate classroom. Outsourcing means privatisation but we don't want any old fashioned words like that getting in the way of our story.

Top of the class outsourcing companies will turn their hand to anything from recruiting teachers to organising payrolls, ordering stationery and IT supplies, and maintaining classrooms. Last month the Department of Education and Employment said that 20 local education authorities had either contracted out their back office functions or were doing so. Firms like WS Atkins, who recently agreed to generously provide the London borough of Southwark with virtually all its education services including building maintenance, payroll, hiring teachers and purchasing. The City is also catching on that this is a growth sector. Investors Chronicle recently said it expected Nord Anglia's profits to "grow at more than 30 per cent over the next two years", while another investment firm reckons the 'sector' will grow from £1.6 billion today to £5 billion within five years.

But it's not all been plain sailing. Haringey council, parents and governors recently rejected for the second time two bids to take over their "failing local education authority". One bid was from the Ensign consortium which includes Group 4 whose experience in managing privatised prisons presumably makes them an ideal candidate to run New Labour's schools!

CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK

A pensioner, a schoolboy, a care worker and a middle aged housewife were arrested and charged with harassment of B & K Universal Ltd, a company based in Hull, who breed animals for vivisection. The charges included - and we're not making this up-"holding a placard, making obscene gestures with an inflatable champagne bottle, sending a birthday card", and the best one "staring at a building!"

Coming top of the class in this story however, just so happens to be consultants Price Waterhouse Coopers who 'helped' the borough to prepare for the scheme and clocked up bills that run into millions. No one will say exactly how much because the information is, of course, confidential.

All this is just the tip of the iceberg. As Christopher Draper from the anarchist paper Freedom points out, "If schools were being liberated from state-control and handed over to co-operatives of pupils, parents and teachers we would have something to celebrate but these sell-offs provide the worst of both worlds."

For big business however every new education twist gives them an opportunity to make a profit from markets they could once only have wet dreams about

SIEMEN STAINS

A new computer system which cost £77 million with the promise that it would deal with the backlog of asylum seeker claims has proved to be bogus and has been scrapped by the government. The computer system was handed over to Siemens under the Private Finance Initiative, and they promptly sacked staff and made the service even worse. Despite the National Audit Office complaining about their incompetence, Siemens received bonuses because they were paid for reducing costs not for improving the system!

The company have a fine record in privatisation cock ups, managing to paralyse the passport agency two years back. People missed holidays or had to queue in the rain to get their documents, while the cost rose to £28 to cover the fiasco (see SchNEWS 219).

EAT THIS

For twenty years the people of Newcastle have been forced to breathe in toxic fumes pumped out from the Byker incinerator. Not content with this, in 1993 Newcastle Council decided that they should eat toxic waste as well, and so dumped 2,000 tonnes of incinerator ash on allotments and parks around the city. A report out this week has found that dioxin (extremely nasty persistent cancer causing chemicals) levels in the ash were almost 2,000 times higher than the safe recommended limit. Levels of dioxins in eggs from allotment hens were found to be up to 20 times greater than the levels found in 'normal' eggs. The report concluded that by eating one Byker egg daily you would be doubling your cancer risk. The eating of vegetables and eggs on 22 allotments have been banned, but the Council, the Environment Agency and the Food Standards Agency are assuring people there is really nothing to worry about. The Council and the operators of the incinerator will soon be facing 19 charges between them of illegally disposing of toxic waste.

There could well be an incinerator coming your way soon, as the government are planning to build 160 new incinerators over the next 20 years, so enjoy your allotment food whilst you still can. 2001 & All That

Last year fat boy fat (a.k.a John Prescott) announced a transport budget that could be called a New Deal for car drivers (see SchNEWS 288). Hastings looks set to become one of the first 'beneficiaries', when the South East England Regional Assembly (SEERA) gave the all clear for two new bypasses to be built around the town. The proposed roads will destroy two SSSI's and cut through an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty but Councillors and business leaders argue that the motorway standard roads are essential to help regenerate the town, which is one of the south-easts most deprived. A study into the bypasses warned that they could result in a loss of 300 jobs in the town centre, as jobs are sucked out of town to a new greenfield business park. It also highlights the fact that 95 percent of traffic is local, which will mean the roads will be of very little benefit. Over 1000 peace and anti-nuclear campaigner took part in a demonstration against Faslane Trident Submarine Base in Scotland on Monday. 'The Big Blockade', a major event in the peace movement calendar, attracted people from all over the world. Faslane is home to the four-strong fleet of Trident nuclear submarines, which activists claim are in breach of international law due to their inability to distinguish between civilians and soldiers.

Arriving at 7am, the campaigners linked arms and formed a chain designed to prevent workers from entering the base. Scottish ministers performed a service of worship. As at previous Faslane blockades, arrests were high. Police moved in, breaking up the chain and arresting around 385; Green MEP Caroline Lucas, Tommy Sheriden MSP and George Galloway MP were amongst the arrested. "The fact that parliamentarians, ministers of religion, a senior lawyer and a prominent author are among those arrested shows that this campaign is not restricted to a few activists but is beginning to engage civic society," said a spokesperson for Trident Ploughshares, one of the groups coordinating the event.

Activist gets visit from Special Branch

a highly active anti-nuclear and internet this campaigner, Stella Purvis is convinced the government will attempt to bring in wide-inging net censorship under the pretext of dealing with child pornography. So she decided to apply for the right to research the disparity between official claims and the actual incidence of the child pornography. However, as a mansitioning transsexual, she was a prime tart for a fit up..........so Special Branch paid her visit. This is her story....

On 11th January 2001, my computer was seized by the police. Also seized were: floppy discs of the first draft n novel, a book proposal about nerve agent, a book proposal about the CIA, numerous routine communimillions from CND, Trident Ploughshares and other antimolear groups, an essay about communications aboard 100 1950s nuclear submarine Nautilus, 13 DAT tapes of raw interview material collected for BBC Radio 4s invironmental program Costing The Earth - and already brondcast - a research proposal to the University of Lanmater concerning media manipulation in the "upergun" and "nuclear bomb triggers" affairs - tother with ideas for numerous other essays, scripted alks for Radio 4, fictionalized biography towards the making of new radio tales, and other fragments totaling mindreds of pages of text.

A collection of more than 2000 photographs and photographic equipment was totally ignored by the marching officers - very odd behaviour for men authorised to look for "indecent photographs".

Background. I am a transitioning transsexual who hanged her name to Stella Purvis on 3rd January 1001. I was previously known as Vaughan Purvis [Christopher David Vaughan Purvis].

I am a member of an internet campaign group called ther Rights & Cyber Liberties UK, a group of univerly academics, practising solicitors and others. In the unmer of 2000, I was actively engaged in spill, then Regulation of Livestifatory Powers Bill.

Consequently, I wrote last summer to Colin Phillips, the Constable of Cumbria, asking for his authority search the web for child porn sites in order to combine a statistical summary to refute government claims. This research protocol cited a number of individuals academic, journalistic and personal references.

After a very long delay this research proposal was locted in a letter from a female Assistant Chief Con-

on 22nd December 2000, while I was visiting mediate consultant Dr S.A. Pidd, at the Queen Victoria Hospital, Morecambe - an entire day out from Barrow-in-Turness - my home, then at 20 Greenhill Close, ormsgill, Barrow-in-Furness was broken into with numerous thefts and criminal damage including cuting all the cables on my PC - keyboard, mouse, printer, counter etc. The police failed to appear following my hree complaints. I was not immediately able to repair his damage, and it was not perhaps for three days that it occurred to me to check the Win 98 v.2 "history" file for the day of the burglary.

I discovered that the burglars had entered numerous sites with titles like "Little Kids" and "Pink Lolita", it a time when I can easily show I was still in Moreumbe. The police again failed to respond to a lengthy oill made to a dispatcher named Claire, so I posted an appeal entitled Help on the Cyber Rights list, which was soon and read by many people, referring to the child

porn accusation. This was answered by one Nigel Jones, an Assistant Chief Police Officer from (I think) Kent - a regular contributor to the list - who published the name and phone number of one Mark Cameron - as being a computer specialist I should contact in Cumbria Police.

Despite numerous calls to Mark Cameron it was not until 10th January that he told me that he and a colleague would visit me at 10am the following day. Mark Cameron and colleague did not appear the following day, 11th January. Instead, I received a visit from one D/S Forrester and a search party armed with a search warrant issued under the Child Protection Act authorising a search for "indecent photographs or pseudo-photographs of children".

or pseudo-photographs of children

I asked D/S Forrester what this was all about and
he said "We are aware of your letters to the Chief
Constable". He described my Help notice on the Cyber
Rights list as "an attempt to cover my back ". But
while my computer was seized, no interest was shown
in my large photographic collection, and of the 24
exhibits listed in the search document as having been
seized, not one item is a photograph. Almost all are
documents related to the anti-nuclear movement, to
DU, Trident Ploughshares, or wrong-doing by Intelligence organisations. WHY ME?

Together with "Heather", I have acquired more than 50 Geiger tubes and 12 scintillation counters with a view to creating monitoring stations round nuclear facilities in Cumbria and Scotland.

I was in brief communication with David Shayler during his exile in Paris, and one is reminded of the seizure of the computer belonging to, I think, a Sussex university student who had also been in touch with the portly runaway.

Nor was this the end of this loathsome business. On returning from a shopping trip at about 4pm the following day, I was astonished to see my two Staffordshires being lead away to van by the borough dog warden. The door of 20 Greenhill Close had been smashed in, and four police officers and the estate manager were inside.

The "word was out" that I was a child pornographer, (how?) the officers said, and "the word was" that a mob was going to "get me" that very night. I must grab a toothbrush and leave immediately. I said I had no intention of leaving as this would appear to be an admission of guilt for something I had not done. I was then told that if I did not leave with them right away and go to the Borough Homeless Persons Hostel, they would arrest me and lock me in a cell "for my own protection" under the PAC.E. Act. So my dogs were taken away to be locked in cages, and I was taken to the hostel for down-and-outs trailing a smear like a slug trail behind me. Deprived of communications of any kind, it has taken me days to rally and counterattack the dangerous, desperate and dishonest men who had done to this to me.

Was it under the orders of Colin Phillips himself, or rogue elements in the Special Branch Ulverstone office acting beyond all law and control? Certainly, they deceived the magistrate who signed the search warrant since not even the sickest mind could meaningfully connect the documents, stories, book proposals and radio talk scripts to the "indecent photographs or pseudophotographs of children" cited on the search warrant.

I have not as yet - January 29, 2001 - been charged with any offense. But who can say what further crimes or fabrications may yet be concocted to justify what the Special Branch has already done? Who gave the order to destroy me and my democratic right to oppose and expose nuclear weapons, atomic pollution and the wrong-doing of intelligence agencies and the secret police?

Everything I say here is true.

As Marie Celeste disappears up the bridge strutto attach the dynamite, I release the clump of antelopes from the cargo bay and they skitter off to deal with the armed guards. Soon their cries harmonise through the dawn mist and blend with the antelopes' beautiful meeping tones.

We take to the shore and not a second too soon. From behind a tree we see the nuclear transport leave the power station and roll onto the BOOM! The whistling antelopes once more leap into action, making short shrift of their all to human opponents. It is a few short steps up the bank to the transport.

GM animal feed has risen to the top of the agenda, and sen some of the fastest changes in policy by supermarkets around the UK. It is hardly surprising that what is fed to animals should become an issue. After all, it is animal feed that is at the root of the BS crisis, and the public has become aware and alarmed of the practice of creating cannibals out of herbivores.

The vast majority of GM crops around the world are grown purely to feed animals. This simple fact destroys one of the key myths of the biotech industry - that they are trying to provide food for the hungry. Nonsense, they are trying to create cheaper animal feed. But in the UK, and around Europe, there has been a remarkable backlash from the public. Fresh from getting supermarkets to remove GM products from their shelves, they have now created such a movement that all but the most recalcitrant retailers have now committed them selves to removing GM fed animal products as well.

This has been the result of persistent campaigning. The turkey producers, Bernard Matthews, were so inundated with let ters and packets of GM-free feed, that they announced their change to GM-free feed before Christmas. And a surreal protest at the Asda distribution depot in Dartford, where post-apocalyptic turkeys swarmed over lorries, blocking further deliveries, must have helped the supermarket's management realise that the campaigners were serious.

Out in the cold remains the supermarket Sainsbury's. They are the only one yet to make a commitment to remove GM and mal feed products from the shelves. And this is despite a visit from some remarkable cows that blockaded four distribution depots in February!

You couldn't make it up. Just three days after the U.S and Britain bombed Baghdad, the new Terrorism Act became law. Food Chained

"The British government is ignoring the wishes of the vast bulk of British customers. The public have made it very clear that they are unhappy about eating GM foods and about GM crops growing in the countryside" Adrian Bebb, Friends of the Earth.

Last week the European Parliament introduced a new directive allowing the further spread of GM food into our lives. The legislation will bring an end to the three-year moratorium on the granting of licences for commer-cial growing of GM products. The ruling is expected to bring about a flood of licence applications from biotech companies. Applications will be dealt with by a committee of representatives from EU member states with regulations said to be strict, yet anti-GM campaigners aren't impressed. "The new directive is not enough to protect the environment, consumers and farmers from GM crops " said a spokes-

Yesterday saw protestors attack supermarket giant Sainsburys by blockading regional distribution centres. Sainsburys was chosen due to their failure to announce any intention to ensure that their own brand animal products are GM free. Iceland, ASDA, Tesco and Marks and Spencers have recently given dates by which all their own-brand animal products will be from animals on GM-free diets. There are no regulations regarding the labelling of animal products meaning that GMOs had been entering the food chain

through their use in animal feed.

On Nov 8th of last year Eduardo Garcin be came yet another victim of a State fit-up when he was sent down for 20 years, charged will sending seven letter bombs to right-wing pol ticians and journalists. Although only 22 years old, Eduardo has been a prominent political activist in Madrid for some time, recently by ing involved in the jail solidarity movemen The movement has been organizing coordinated hunger strikes to end the isolation system of political prisoners, for the release of terminal ill prisoners and campaigning for prisoners to be held near to their families. When Eduarde was arrested the cops searched his flat and made a video record of this search. After finding noth ing while the cameras were rolling, they mis raculously "found" 40 grams of firework pow der when it was switched off! Although the package containing the powder had none of Eduardo's fingerprints on it, this "find" was deemed enough evidence to convict him. Apart from this obvious fit up, there are a few other reasons why Eduardo is innocent: because of his high profile campaign against the Spanish prison system - which included being a promi nent spokesperson in the campaign, helping to organise peaceful demonstrations outside prin ons and visiting different prisoners on a weekly basis-it would be unlikely that he would be in volved in more clandestine actions; also after Eduardo was jailed, four more identical bombs were sent to different targets, which would sup gest that the person that did that also sent the previous seven. This case seems to have much in common with many other incidents involving activists who have been fitted up by the State, namely to silence any dissenting voice which goes against their reactionary policies

*Last Sunday (18th), 29 different prisons across the state of Sao Paulo in Brazil erupted in a mass rebellion against the inhumane treat ment of inmates. No less than 25000 prisoners took part to protest about overcrowding, insanttary conditions and the widespread torture that happens on a daily basis. The riots started in the infamous Carandiru jail, the largest in Latin America, where in 1992 cops opened fire on inmates killing 111 - making this the worst case of human rights abuse since Brazil became a "de mocracy" in 1985. The Casa de Detencao, one part of the huge Carandiru complex was meant to house 3200: it now houses 7200. The rebellion was brutally put down on the Tuesday afterwards by thousands of riot cops, but, SchNEWS asks, how long till it all kicks off



SCUALL K-CHING! K-CHING! THAT'S THE SOUND OF THE POLICE!

A private security firm, who leapt to prominence in the 1990s by providing 'heavies' to protect road building projects, has been cast in the flagship role of the Government's creeping privatisation of police.

Bristol based Reliance Custodial Services, who are contracted to transport prisoners around the South West of England, were awarded a government Charter Mark on February 13 for their "caring, humane approach...to staff customers and the wider community".

The award, which the company nominated itself for, was described as "a pat on the back" by Reliance spokeswoman Charmyn Hall, who said the company hoped it would give them greater status in the eyes of the public.

It came just weeks after the company closed a £90 million deal to provide custody services for the entire Sussex region. The Police Authority have described the scheme, which will see 24 existing police stations closed and replaced by a half dozen privately managed custody centres, as their "most wide reaching" Private Finance Initiative (PFI) scheme.

Apart from the South West contract, the company's only other experience in this field is a 15 man pilot project in West Mercia - reported, by that force, to have had "teething troubles" - and a five year contract, which was terminated not long after it began, to operate an electronic tagging scheme in Southern England. Sussex Police Authority described the company as the "market leader in police support services."

Graham Alexander of Sussex Police Federation told

SQUALL: "We have deep reservations about PFI." He said the reduction in police stations will increase journey times from the scene to custody, meaning less police time on the streets (the Police Authority are looking at contract ing out this role too). "If it's a cost cutting exercise, it's fraught with danger," said Alexander.

The project is unlikely to save much public money, the Government is already subsidising the scheme to the tune of £34 million. Home Secretary, Jack Straw, is in favour privatising many police duties. He has often been backed by high ranking officers, including the former HM Inspector of Constabulary, Sir Geoffrey Dear - now a Reliance Director.

Reliance's recent Charter Mark is reminiscent of a suggestion in 1998 by Surrey Chief Constable Ian Blair, that beat officers could be replaced by "kitemarked" security

Sussex police are keen to turn round criticisms that they are underachieving. "[We] are in the bottom quartile [of Home Office figures] for arrests per 100 officers, Sarah O'Connor of Sussex Police Authority told Stephen Nathan, editor of Prison Privatisation Report International "We have to increase arrests by 53 per cent."

Payment to Reliance will be linked to the rate of prisoner turnover. Nathan is dubious if private sector prior ties match the public's. "If the police fail to meet their targets, will staffing levels be cut to protect profits?" he asks. He was also concerned about monitoring of cus tody procedures, as a single monitor is proposed for all six centres.

Human rights solicitor Mike Schwartz described the encroachment of the private sector into policing as "unconstitutional".

"Imprisonment and the use of force against people are so fundamental to their basic liberty that they cannot be trusted to commercial organisations," he told SQUALL. "A justice system should be directly accountable to the people not to company shareholders."

Reliance Security, another arm of the same company group, was heavily condemned in the mid 1990s for their 'policing' of road protests against the M11 link and bypasses for Newbury and Batheaston. The firm, who admitted receiving Special Branch intelligence on protesters, was employing men with violent criminal records, who were then assaulting non-violent activists.

Charmyn Hall was quick to distance Reliance Custodial from the Group's Security wing. "Our staff do six weeks training, not two days," she said.

"Basic police training is two years," said an unimpressed Graham Alexander. "Custody officers then undergo further special ist training. If the training [of Reliance's staff] is flawed it will have a huge effect on the administration of justice."

"If you have local food and local shops, things may go wrong but they don't spread like this" - Tim Lang, Professor of Food Policy, Thames Valley University.

In case you haven't noticed the foot and mouth disease outbreak has spread right across the country. Hardly surprising as livestock is routinely transported all around the UK, Europe and beyond. Let's face it Britain's agriculture is a mess: BSE, genetically modified foods, pesticide residues and now foot and mouth. So what's gone wrong?

In 1939 13% of the population worked on farms, now its only 2%. Today's food production has more in common with an industrial production line. Each year 860 million farm animals are slaughtered, the vast majority of these reared intensively in overcrowded conditions, leading to the rapid spread of disease and the routine use of antibiotics.

The production of fruit and veg isn't much different, crops are grown in huge monoculture plots and routinely sprayed with pesticides: e.g. lettuces are sprayed 15 times. Considering that England is an ideal climate for growing apples it's crazy that we now consume more French ones than English!

Supermarkets' Sweep Up

Outside economic forces have done me in. You have no control over prices, averything is set by outsiders. It doesn't matter how well you farm, it just gets harder and harder" - Ex-farmer

The big four supermarkets sell over half our food in the UK. This dominance gives them a stranglehold on producers. Supermarkets know that farmers have little choice and dictate which varieties should be produced, how animals should be kept, and what chemicals need to be sprayed, and when. In return for their efforts farmers receive minimum prices for their products. A survey found that apples were being sold at nearly double the price that farmers were setting for them, and eggs four times as much. And if the produce isn't uniform in size, shape and colour farmers have to throw the food away and get nothing.

Tescos are now trying to have only three suppliers for each of their products. so if you're a farm that gets a contract you can grow and grow (well unless you fall out of favour cos' your tomatoes aren't micy enough), if not, then hard luck. And despite the increasing supermarkets claims to support British farmers the amount we

import from abroad is increasing, and even food that is British probably isn't local in the last 20 years the average distance our food travels within the UK has doubled (SchNEWS 283).

So if farmers are getting shafted by supermarkets why aren't they protesting about this rather than the price of fuel? Well they did. In 1998, enraged by the fall in the amount they received for their meat, they blockaded ports and supermarkets. The action forced the government to carry out an investigation, but the Office of Fair Trading couldn't see that the supermarkets were doing anything wrong, so nothing changed. A recent survey by the National Farmers Union found that 98% of farmers believe that their futures would be more secure if they went back to basics and selling direct to the public. But most are too scared to speak out, in case they loose their 'contracts' i.e. livelihood and home.

* British supermarkets are roughly three times more profitable than similar companies in France, Germany, Italy and Spain.

Last year Sainsbury's made a meagre £580 million pre tax profits and Tesco's an embarrassing £955 million-

how do they cope? Lord Sainsbury, the former Chief Executive of Sainsbury's, is the richest man in Britain, and a Labour peer.

Superpowers

Supermarkets may have destroyed our farming industry, but they've given us convenience, choice, jobs and cheap goods. But hey, wait a minute lets look at how convenient and how much choice they really offer us. Call us old-fashioned but how convenient is it to get to an out of town shopping centre, rather than pop to your local shop (especially if you've got no car). When supermarkets move into an area small shops go down the pan. A government report in 1998 concluded that food shops in market towns lost between 13 and 50% of their trade when a supermarket opened. In 1950 there were 221,662 food shops in Britain by 1997 this had fallen to just under 37,000. Is that what they call more choice?

What about job creation? Well, supermarkets employ one-fifth of the staff per unit area than smaller shops, and how can working in a supermarket compare to working in a local store? But at least the supermarkets are cheap, aren't they? It may come as a surprise but they're not, Al-

CRAP ARREST OF THE WEEK

For handing out a leaflet! The Canadian police are getting a bit twitchy in the build up to the Summit of the Americas, which takes place in Quebec in April. To show off their intolerance, they arrested 3 people for handing out leaflets criticising the police plan to erect a 5-kilometre security perimeter around the conference centre. Sounds more like Qatar than Quebec to us. After a newspaper picked up on the story an embarrassing climb down followed, the city apologising to those arrested. Quebec has recently passed an anti-scarf by-law as a "security measure" for the Summit. Anyone even partially covering their face with a scarf faces arrest,

though they tempt you in with cheap bread and baked beans, loads of their other stuff is more expensive. Independent specialist shops have been found to be 30 percent cheaper than the big chains, and if you buy direct from your local farmer or farmers markets then the savings are even greater.

Despite all this the popularity of supermarkets appears to be growing and it may feel like there's nothing we can do to stop them. Their growth may be due to lazycar driver-shove-it-in-the-microwave mentality. But they've also curried favour with politicians, influencing policy so that they can build what they want where they want, even in National Parks. Supermarkets also bribe councils with roads and community centres in return for building their stores. In Brighton, Sainsbury's look set to be allowed to build next to the station despite everybody wishing they would get lost. In return they are willing to bribe the council with building a road.

So what can you do to undermine the su-permarkets' dominance? Simple, don't shop at 'em if you can help it.

Grow your own food. Get a list of allotment sites from your local authority or squat a bit of unused land! Alternatively you can join a City Farm, details from The Federation of City Farms www.farmgarden.org.uk

5th March 2000- African drummers lead a demo to the Association of the British Pharmaceutical Industry as the lawsuit was being heard in the Pretoria High Court which has since been withdrawn by the 39 chemical companies). The action was supported by various groups, including ACTSA, Oxfam, VSO, National AIDS Trust, Terence Higgins Trust Lighthouse and UNISON. ACTSA worked with the Treatment Action Campaign (TAC, a South African protest group) to co-ordinate an open letter to the international press signed by over 200 organisations rom 35 countries, condemning the lawsuit as 'legally flawed and morally reprehensible'. Vusi Nhlapo, president of NEHAWU (one of South Africa's largest trade unions) thanked protestors for their solidarity and spoke movingly of the crists in South Africa: 'Many of my fellow union members have died for want of medicines [that are] widely available in countries like Britain. Improving access to affordable medicines in South Africa is critical in the fight against the stigma of HIV/AIDS'. Protestors also delivered a letter of solidarity to Cheryl Carolus, High



Commissioner for South Africa, who outlined the importance of the South African government's Medicines Act (the target of the drug companies' ire) to address the impact of apartheid on South Africa's health system.

The landmark decision of 39 drug companies to drop their class-action suit against the South African government means that

it may now purchase generic copies of anti-HIV medication without GlaxoSmithKline, Merck and the rest of the bastards breathing down their necks in pursuit of their 'intellectual property rights'. The cave-in was largely motivated by a submission to the court by TAC which pointed out that most of the medications in question had been developed by universities in the US, who then sold the patents to the drug companies for buttons - undermining the companies' argument that they deserved to be recompensed for all their 'investment' in R&D. During the time it has taken this case to come to court, 400,000 people in South Africa have died of HIV/AIDS. This case is critical for the 30 million people infected with HIV/ AIDS in developing countries, as what happens in South Africa will affect how other countries import medicines. Without drugs for HIV/AIDS, 1 in 200 of the world's population will be condemned to early deaths. (see SchNEWS 290)



DAMN DESTRUCTION: THE ALQUEVA DAM, PORTUGAL

On February 22nd 2000, Europe's most extensive deforestation programme began in the beautiful Guadiana valley of eastern Portugal. Chainsaws ripped through the first of the more than one million trees to be felled, including thousands of mature oaks - all of this to make way for the Alqueva dam. Although the undertaking is huge, unless stopped, all of the trees will be cut down by spring 2002. This area of Portugal hosts some of the best examples of the rural way of life, producing some of the country's finest cured cheeses, olive oil, wine, good quality cork, and smoked hams. The whole region is a paradise, vibrantly humming with life and productivity which mocks the official purpose of the dam - to supply water to the semi-arid fields of this region.

When filled, the dam will be the largest artificial lake in Europe in terms of surface area, at around 240 square kilometres. It has taken almost thirty years to reach its current



stage, and has met with opposition at almost every stage of development, including by the people of Aldeia de Luz, whose home village will be flooded.


The EU funded this project, and despite the resistance and substantial costs, the Portuguese government is determined to finish. But even when the job is complete, there more to come: a further nine smaller dams, 114 pumping stations and 4,500 kilometres of irrigation canals are also still to be built as part of the enterprise, though funding for this is uncertain.

Rare and endangered birds are affected by the dam: the habitat of Portugal's only pair of Golden Eagles will vanish, as will two pairs of the threatened Bonelli's Eagle and ten per cent of the country's black stork population. Even the earlier plans to rescue their young and eggs have now been dropped. The region to be submerged includes a 135 square kilometre area. According to a report by the ICN, the government's own conservation agency – the area is inhabited by the Iberian lynx. The Iberian lynx is Europe's most endangered carnivore, and only 40-53 are thought to be left in Portugal, yet the 5-6 inhabiting this region and comprising one of the only five lynx populations in Portugal are still to be sacrificed to the floods.

As if that wasn't all more than enough, environmental groups have pointed out that the dam is also on a seismic fault line.

There's still just about time for this dam to be stopped, so organise international support or get down there...

a hard day's graft at NchNEWS Towers we like nothing better than retiring to the local boozer for a swift 23 pints. The problem is that as we sip our well-earned pint we could be lining the pockets of some corporate nasty we've never even heard of.

Take Nomura International, the Japanese investment bank who pulled out of buying the Dome at the last minute. Last month they became the UK's biggest pub landlord after taking over Bass, and now control over five and a half thousand pubs. They are also currently in the front running for Whitbread's 3000 pubs. Whitbread has offered none of the pubs in this 'Everything Must Go' sale to any of its current landlords, preferring to sell them all to one bidder. If, as seems likely, Nomura is successful, it will own 8,885 pubs, some 17% of the total pub market.

Other vulture capitalists are now casting their greedy eyes on yer pint. Punch Taverns have bought up more than 5,000 pubs in the last two years, and the execrable Wetherspoons seem intent on world domination with a characterless supermarket pub on every street corner.

The bulk buying capabilities of these groups mean that they are able to negotiate substantial discounts from the breweries, often purchasing beer at a discount of between £100 and £120 per barrel compared with the price paid by an individual landlord. Very little if any of this discount is passed on to the customer.

At the present time, more that 6,000 pubs in the country are on the market and a pub closes permanently every day of the year.

So why would venture capitalists be interested in a pub? The answer is certainly not that they want to serve the community. Pubs are often in prime city centre locations and represent an enormous profit potential in real estate terms. Currently, there are many examples of these powerdrunks deliberately running down pubs that they can't turn into soulless, trendy and expensive wine bars. Once a pub becomes so run down that it's not viable, they relinquish the license, demolish the pub and build expensive housing on the site.

Hands off our Pubs!

The man behind Nomura is Guy Hands, who is reputed to earn £40 million a year and had Conservative leader William Hague as the best man at his wedding. Even in the shark-eat-shark world of venture capitalism Hands is acknowledged as

a merciless predator - which is saving something. Hands has taken full advantage of his contacts, helping Nomura to buy up 57,000 redundant Ministry of Defence houses from the Government at a knock down price. These houses were not even offered to local authorities or housing associations, where they could have made significant inroads into housing problems. The homes were then sold off at vast profits on the private market.

And don't think you can escape their evil clutches with a few tinnies from the off-licence. Chances are that Nomura own that too after they bought First Quench - the country's largest off-licence chain that includes Thresher, Victoria Wine, Wine Rack and Bottoms Up. Nothing like good old freedom of choice in the High Street is there?

A local ex-landlord, whose pub was frequented by the more inebriated members of the SchNEWS crew (that means most of 'em) before Nomura won a high court battle to evict him, commented that "The days of your local, friendly, community boozer are definitely numbered. Pubs are being priced out of the range of ordinary working class people. Soon only the rich or the trendy will be able to afford to drink in a public house. The global capitalist pub of the future will have all the character of the foyer of your local Sainsburys."

It's a year since Brighton's New Kensington Public House and the Gladstone fell foul of the vultures (SchNEWS 251). Since then Zel and C Side continue with their pub and club domination plans killing all diversity. C Side have now been bought up by - venture capitalists! Check out www.brightonsucks.com

Channel One is an in-school broadcaster, showing a daily compulsory 12 minute current affairs programme with two minutes of adverts targeted at children. In return the schools get no cash, but can use the equipment in other lessons. Channel One is raking it in charging advertisers twice as much as regular TV stations as they can guarantee viewers with no channel hopping or off button. Channel One spreads the corporate TV bullshit more sneakily by enlisting teachers to develop lessons for such socially useful teaching as designing new Pepsi vending machines and Burger King adverts.

Commercial Alert and Obligation, Inc., two national anti-media groups, have taken up the kids' cause, saying "When the government sends children to a juvenile detention centre because they don't want to watch advertising, that is both Orwellian and more than a little sick. Nice to see Labour's ethical foreign policy working as usual. The Foreign Office recently admitted to granting licences for Royal Ordinance (subsidiary of BAe Systems) to refurbish 30 105mm Howitzer guns for Morocco. The guns' final destinations are the middle of the Western Sahara, a country invaded by Morocco in 1975. The people of the Western Sahara have been fighting an independence struggle from their refugee camps in the desert of SW Algeria. The family I was staying with had escaped across the desert from the Moroccan forces, who napalmed people as they fled, and people were asking me "Why does Robin Cook want to help my enemies kill me?" LEGAL AIDS

The law suit brought by 39 pharmaceutical companies fighting South Africa's right to import cheap generic AIDS drugs has been adjourned on its second day. A ruling by the judge has forced the Pharmaceutical Manufacturers Association (PMA) to find responses to accusations of profiteering and secrecy.

The corporations are challenging laws that allow patented drugs to be produced more cheaply by someone other than the patent holder it is in the public interest. The drug giants who fear a drop in profits - say the laws are breaking World Trade Organisation rules

(SchNEWS 290).

The ruling will force the PMA to reveal their pricing policy, which has always remained top-secret until now. Previously they claimed the excessive prices in the country are due to markups by chemists, a claim which lobby groups in South Africa have disputed.

Kenya's health minister has said his country will also adopt South Africa's stance in order to curb their own AIDS epidemic, promising to use a clause in international law which allows countries to break patents in order to respond to a national emergency.

Indian Farmers on the streets against W

New Delhi: Just 12 days before the WTO deadline for opening up markets, farmers came together in the Capital on Monday, 19th March, to fight a last-ditch battle against dobalisation and the government's "anti-larmer and reform policies".

They even threatened a nation wide 'antyagraha', direct action and a programme for a parallel government. By the end of the day, a six-member delegation had managed an appointment with the President of India for Tuesday. They spoke from the platform of the National Coordination of Indian Farmers Movements, an effort led by Bharatiya Kisan Union's Mahendra Singh Tikait and Karnataka Rajya Raitha Sangha, (KRRS) President Prof. M. D. Nanjundaswamy, requesting the President to intervene.


There was some anger, some fear and some rlespair among more than 100,000 farmers who had gathered at Kisan Ghat since morning. larmers worried about low prices, rising input costs, eroding competitiveness and assaults by multinationals. Local issues like power merged into the infamous and troublesome GATT (Genural Agreement on Trade and Tariffs), sharpening a sense of injustice and neglect by the government. 'Unless you organize and come into the streets, nobody will listen to you', said Tikait.
Agricultural issues have grabbed the atten-

tion of political parties over the past few months, while scientists and NGOs have been voicing apprehensions about the effect of the World Trade Organization's trade liberalization process. And the government, acknowledging WTO is loaded in favour of the developed countries, has been promising a spirited fight during the For the moment, however, there is not much


to be done, except keep vigil. April 1 will see the lifting of the last set of quantitative restrictions (QRs), leaving the government with three options on protection-tariff barriers, anti-dump-

ing steps and safeguard measures.

Scientists may have been restrained in their criticism but just about everybody agrees developing countries have been denied a fair deal in WTO. Commitments on market access, domestic support and export subsidies, It is said, have served only to protect the farmers and farming systems of developed coun-


We send you this newsletter out of a sense of urgency. The workers at Daewoo Motors have been on strike against the lay-offs of 1750 workers since the 16th of February The government has brutally repressed the workers, sending in riot police to break up the strike at the factory. Workers, students, and social movement activists have been engaged in an all-out battle against the government ever since, resulting in the arrest of dozens and the injury of hundreds. The people of Korea need your solidarity to overcome this attack by the government. Send your messages of support to the workers at Daewoo. Send your messages of protest to the Korean government and police. Organize actions at Korean Embassies. An injury to one is an injury to all!

The Daewoo workers need you Support!! Solidarity to the Workers at Daewoo Motors!!

The Daewoo workers have declared an all out struggle against the largest lay-offs ever in Korea, amidst brutal suppression from the government. The workers of Daewoo Motors had already been several strikes on and off during the last 9 months, but the struggle reached its peak on the 16th of February as the union announced an indefinite general strike against management's official announcement that 1,750 workers would be layed off. The management had made some revisions to its demands, for example, insisting that 400 of the 1,780 will be given 2 year leave without wages, but the union did not make any compromises.

The management has shut down the Bu-pyung plant where all of the 1,750 to be laid off are working, but the union has called for the workers to keep working, organize education sessions and struggles. The

police sent 2,000 riot police to the Bu-pyung plant and blocked the gates to stop the workers who, having received their 'pinkslips' by post, came to the plant to join the demonstrations. Family members of the laid-off workers have also come to the plant in anguish to join forces with the striking workers. The management hired 300 'security' thugs to fight the workers, and on 19th February, the government



took strong action and sent thousands of riot police to the plant to break up the strike. The police thoroughly ignored the children of the workers who had come hanging on their mothers' backs, broke through the gates and forcefully dispersed the workers, causing many injuries.

Unedited communique

After the suppression of the struggle at the Bu-Pyung plant, the workers are now out on the streets. On the 20th, 2,000 workers and students demonstrated at the Bupyeong Sta-

tion and fought vigorously with molotov cocktails. They continued onto the next day. But the police closed off and blocked the demonstrators even before they had commenced. The demonstrators instead ran onto the highway and marched approximately 2km towards Seoul. On the 23rd, one worker who could not bear out the burden of being laid-off committed suicide. On the 24th, the police once again chased the workers and students who were trying to come together at the Bu-pyung Station. Some demonstrators were even driven onto the rails and were injured. The demonstrators then took over a road but were chased again into a nearby university and fought until





dusk. 8 buses with supporting workers and family members also joined the barricades. More than 2,000 workers fought around the country the same day.

We are witnessing once again, how the economic crisis is brought on and used by the capitalists to throw workers onto the streets, weaken workers' power and bloat the wealth in their pockets. The



pictures of Kim leisurely playing golf somewhere in sunny California, although he seems to have moved now either to Europe, Morocco or Sudan. The Arrest Squad sent its members to Europe on the 23rd, in search for the 'fugitive' and force him to come home and face the charges. The Joint Struggle Headquar-ters have made contact with the International Metallic Workers Federation

for assistance, and have sent multi-lingual 'wanted' posters to foreign organizations and unions. The 'wanted' not only aims at the arrest of Kim but also for the confiscation of the wealth he had illegally accumulated and to publicize the collaboration of the Kim Dae-Jung government.

Their objective of arresting Kim is really symbolic - they will be meeting with various anti neo-liberal groups and trade unions to call for international solidarity.

The struggle continues as the Joint Struggle Headquarters has organized daily demonstrations. The struggle is gaining strength as more and more workers, students, and activists are joining the demonstrations. The struggle moved to Seoul today, as about 3000 participants gathered to denounce the government's actions.

Protestors threw rocks and molotov cocktails at police, again engaging in violent and intense clashes with them, which have become routine during the past week. The oppression from the government is also becoming more seas police have outlawed all demonstrations in the Bu-pyung area and dozens have been arrested during the demonstrations. We will keep

you updated on the results

of the struggles.

Right-on In Dijon

In the run-up to the French elections in March, the anarchists of Dijon decided to organise a week of events, actions, parties, discussions and information to enlighten curious citizens as to the activities of their local black-clad unwashed. Housing issues, womyn's liberation, radical unionist struggles and old favourite anti-capitalism were just some of the treats in store; 'another aim was to shout our opposition to the big electoral farce going on' say the anarchos. 'We wanted to show that some alternative political structures and projects were possible, in which people could get involved.' Right on, brother. Here's some highlights of a packed week:

Things kick off on Saturday 3rd, with a gig at Les Tanneries, a squatted social centre in an old abbatoir which since 1998 has played host to hundreds of counterculture events. Resistance recently forced the council to abandon eviction plans, and that night 300 revellers packed the building. The entertainment was organised by the Maloka Collective – a group involved in DIY music and politics for more than 10 years. They run the 'Local Libertaire', an info-shop in the city centre where you can browse the library or buy books and very noisy records very cheap.

Sunday and Monday are very industrious: preparing for action! 'Meetings, workshops, costume making and training took place in Les Tanneries with people interested in partici-

pating (not just sitting and consuming)'.

This bore fruit on Tuesday, when 30 people occupied the Dutch embassy for an hour, protesting against 'Plan Columbia'- the US and EU funded 'War on Drugs' which seeks to crush Columbian anti-capitalist currents; the Dutch are lending military bases to the cause. In the evening, grub and videos were served up by the local CNT union in a bar, 'which allowed people to gather and discuss revolutionary politics all night'. Like you, we're kicking ourselves we missed that one.

On Wednesday afternoon, 'Local Libertaire' - the infoshopthrew open its doors to a Dijon public hungry for hardcore CDs and fanzines on international social struggle. Hungry also 250

 no doubt - for vegan food, provided that evening by the local Anarchist Black Cross, who serve it up with a garnish of videos 'exploring the prison issue'.

Come Thursday, and Dijon awakes to croissants, coffee and a city centre covered in feminist slogans. Despite being up all night, the 'avin it girls of the feminist group spend the day handing out flyers about male domination and patriarchy, and running stalls full of 'free feminist documentation'. More vids in the evening, this time at 'La Courdemone', a 'womyn only squatted house' opened last year, where a regular library and free clothing store are run. Films charting the history of the womyn's movement are followed by a debate, attracting more than 60 persons.

Friday the 9th is Squatting Day. There's a growing squatculture in Dijon; 'empty basements have been taken over by people who not only want to live in them, but to use the space to develop autonomous and alternative ways to live, to create, to fight'. March is apparently a bad time of the year for French squatters, and for people who are behind on their rent, who often also get evicted then (it's something about kicking squatters out at the end of winter). So a symbolic theatre action is planned; on Friday morning, 30 squatters attack the 'prefecture' (some sort of balliffs' office) armed with cardboard swords, helmets and shields. 'Let's evict the prefecturel' shout the squatters, who dance, sing and play drums until the gendarmes arrive with slightly more coercive instruments.

Evening sees a squat exhibition, followed by a public discussion on squats. People can come and 'discover everything they always wanted to know but feared to ask' on this burning issue. Tonight's venue is 'Le Pamplemousse' (the Grapefruit), a male-only squat where men can 'work against our oppressive male behaviours by sharing thoughts, analyses and deconstructing our habits'. The days must just fly by.

Saturday 10th, and the elections are only a day away! 'Because there are better things to do than go voting, a wide range of libertarians from the various collectives involved in the week gathered and occupied a city centre plaza to suggest to people they could spend their time in more fun ways'. Like what? Why, sharing a cuppa with the anarchists, participating in political discussion and perusing the wealth of free pamphlets and flyer, bien sur! Stalls, banners and tables were put out for a 'People together-meal' on one of the main shopping streets, complete with kids' corner. 'The idea was to take back part of the city, to show streets could be turned into pleasant communication and creation spaces- the source for non-hierarchical politics'.


Later in the afternoon, the action switches back to La Tanneries, where Domenico Liguori from the 'grassroots municipal federation of Espezzano Albnes in Italy' stokes the crowd with a discussion on libertarian municipalism (which apparently means communities organising to undermine council power.) There's a ska/punk/hardcore gig to follow- a benefit for SCALP, the local anti-fascists.

And then it's Sunday- the last day! A newly-opened squal called 'Collectif #6' hosts a free art exhibition and music performance all afternoon. To mark the week's finale, a special programme dedicated to the week's events gets broadcast on local radio, where the Maloka Collective have a weekly show.

So, what impact did this week-long dip of Dijon's collective toes in the waters of potential Utopia have? 'Some new people showed up, many from different backgrounds discovered a culture and means of action they didn't know about and a radical view against the whole electoral system was widely spread' say the anarchists. 'On a wider level, this libertarian week should certainly be considered as a first step. Not only did various local groups and squats work together towards better coordination and communication, but more than ten other cities in France also organized pretty similar action & information weeks. At the same time, networking efforts between French squats are on the rise. Some meetings are held and connections are created. To be continued!

Digging In In Chiapas

Shaymus King is a member of the Easton Cowboys, a team of football-playing activists from Bristol. He sent this dispatch from the Chiapas jungle during a recent away fixture with the

Zapatista guerilla's of Mexico.
The young kid welcomed us and steered the canoe over the river to his village on the other side. We had arrived in the autonomous community of Nueva Libertad (New Freedom) in the Zapatista heartland of Chiapas. This community is one of seven in this valley, occupied three years ago en masse by dispossessed indigenous people of the Zapatista organisation. All the communities have names from the history of 500 years of indigenous struggle. Twenty three young families live here now, with barely enough to eat, no access to health services, no school, and a lack of clean drinking water. In Chiapas, up to 80 per cent of indigenous people suffer from malnutrition, 50 per cent have no portable water and the average life expectancy is 44 years. This is the poverty which has created the Zapatista Army of National Libera-

After a community assembly in which we pretion, or EZLN. sented ourselves, work began on installing a new water system to bring clean water to the village. Over the next two weeks we worked alongside the community, digging trenches, connecting pipelines, mixing cement, building a water tank, and got a brief insight into the grueling life of an indigenous peasant in Mexico. Sand, cement, gravel, rocks, piping everything had to be hauled across the river and carried, sometimes over two km, and backbreaking digging was not made any more easy by the blazing midday sun. But the companeros were clearly enjoying themselves, chuckling at our efforts to speak their language and to dig as fast as them. The jungle was filled with the whoops of collective work, as the Zapatistas kept digging like berzerkers, seemingly powered only by a tasteless drink made from maize and water! Their real strength, though, comes from years of struggle and a solid sense of autonomy and pride. This is the dignidad rebelde, or rebel dignity we'd heard so much about. It would be so much easier to accept a government water system, with all the strings attached, renounce the EZLN and get paid off. The Mexican government has always sought divide the indigenous people, and the politics of water are a clear example. In another community we worked in where there were serious divisions, we found the pipelines of an autonomous water system hacked open, undoubtedly by a govern-

ment supporters machete. The enemy within is the hardest thing to deal with, but the Zapatistas just persevere and carry on building. They have a determination borne of years of struggle; as I read on one mural: "They want to exterminate us, but we wont let them'. No one gives in here. And after eight hours of exhausting work, everyday, the same question: "So are you up for playing football now then?" So follows four hours of relentless football, some momentous goals, and a further understanding of how this lot run rings around the Mexican army on their home ground. As the saying goes, ZAPATA VIVE. LA LUCHA SIGUE....ZAPATA LIVES. THE

STRUGGLE CONTINUES. Despite the declarations of the new Mexican president about new democracy and opportunities for all, and the efforts of the government to claim the movement for peace as its own, there is still a low-intensity war being waged against the indigenous people of Chiapas. There remain over 250 military in the state, and military intimidation and harassment of Zapatista



communities continues. Right wing paramilitary groups still threaten Zapatista supporters, while some 15 Zapatista prisoners remain in jail. The Zapatis response to the new government was to inform Press dent Fox that, with the indigenous communities Chiapas, he was starting from zero. They demand the fulfillment of three signals to show the govern ment's willingness to meaningful dialogue, and to m


solve the conflict in Chiapas. So far five army bases have been withdrawn an Zapatista prisoners released amidst much media fan fare, but none of the demands have been fully met. Fo once declared that the problem in Chiapas could be solved in 15 minutes, by giving the indigenous a car, TV and a little shop, but clearly, these insurgents are not so easily pacified. With such statements, Fox (pro viously a Coca-Cola executive) has shown his true col ours, exposing both his neoliberal roots and intention He is widely regarded as a stooge for business interest and none of the people we spoke to had any faith in th new government and regard Fox with extreme mistrum Five hundred years of murderous trickery and broken

promises are not quickly forgotten. On 24th Feb this year the commandantes the EZLN, headed of course by Subcommandant Marcos arrived in San Cristobal to begin the march for dignity, a 3,000 km long journey through 12 states l Mexico City. With them came hundreds of men, women and children of the autonomous communities; the bases de apoyo, or support bases, which have sustained the Zapatista uprising. This was the first time in years that the Zapatista command left the Lacandon jungle, and a massive crowd was there to greet them For the next two weeks, as civil society mobilised, the huge level of support for the Zapatistas throughou Mexico became clear. Everywhere thousands of people greeted the caravan with cries of No estan solos! You're not alone!. Despite three death threats, the commandantes arrived in Mexico City on 11th March welcomed by the world's second largest square filled with over 100,000 people there to welcome them. The president was shut in his palace, and had nothing say. It was clear who held the real power in Mexico

The indigenous struggle for respect with Peace Justice and Democracy looks set to continue in the face of powerful business interests and a compliant government, which in the words of Marcos is only in terested in una paz mentirosa, a false peace, with dove as an advertising logo. Confronted with over whelming odds, the determined resistance of the Zapatistas has given inspiration to millions worldwid Likewise, the Zapatista movement has been strengt ened in many ways by an impressive show of interm tional solidarity, which must go on. The Zapatista Army of National Liberation (EZLN) marched triumphantly into the main squure in Mexico City last Sunday to crowds of over 200,000. The 24 commanders, in full uniform and masks but no weapons, are now refusing to leave Mexico City until all their prisoners are released, Mexican troops withdrawn from the state of Chiapas and a bill guaranteeing the political and cultural rights of the 10 million indigenous Mexicans is passed.

The march into the capital was the last stage of a tour which has seen the /apatistas stopping and speaking to thouands of supporters in towns and cities across the country. As a result 50 of the 56 indigenous ethnic groups have now united with them to form a National Indigenous Congress.

This has been overshadowed by some in the media who would have us believe n's merely some sort of rock tour with politics; a personality duel between Sub-Commandante Marcos and the new President of Mexico, Vincent Fox. But it isn't about personalities or only about indigenous peoples rights. The Zapatistas strugale has shown graphically that not everyone is happy with the 'neo-liberal privause everything' version of the world that is being forced down our throats and that we all have the right to say NO!

On January 1st 1994, the same day the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) came into force, the Zapatistas emerged from the Lacandon jungle and occupied four towns in the state of Chiapas (see SchNEWS 174/5, 250). The government response was swift and brutal, but the Zapatistas responded by dodging the army in the jungle, cutting off their supply routes, and when the army retreated, seizing the land from the landowners that had kept them as virtual slaves for years. Evenually a stand-off was established with the Mexican government signing, but never natifying the San Andres Peace Accords, while surrounding the state of Chiapas with 90,000 troops. Over the next 7 years the

Mexican Army conducted a low intensity war against Zapatista communities including the butchering of 45 indigenous men and women in 1997.

The difference that distinguishes the EZLN and every other guerrilla uprising is that the EZLN don't bark commands from a central committee. Instead they take their orders directly from the civilian communities from which they get their support. Before the Zapatista uprising began every Zapatista community was consulted beforehand to see if they supported it and over 98% were in favour. These one and a half thousand communities which cover nearly a third of the area of Chiapas, still exist today, despite suffering continual harassment from over 90,000 troops from the Mexican army who are based there. They are divided into 35 autonomous municipalities that organise and operate collectively. The role of women in particular has changed dramatically, with women taking part in the decision-making process on an equal level with men, and a third of the EZLN made up of women. As Infantry Major Anna Maria says "It is just not the Zapatista men who have their rights, but now the women as well"

Making Waves

The Zapatistas have helped broaden their struggle by recognising the need for international solidarity. In particular foreign peace observers have helped to lessen the worst offences of the Mexican army, giving birth to a living, evolving internationalism. They also organised the first Intercontinental Gathering for Humanity and Against NeoLiberalism (Encuentro) where 4,000 delegates from many different countries attended.

Women around da globe

International Women's Day last week was celebrated in 59 countries, as well as the Global Women's strike there were loads of pro-

tests. Here's just a few:

A weekend of protest at Faslane in Scotland saw 8 women penetrating the base and board a French warship where they locked themselves on for 5 hours, they managed to stop the whole base working for the day, as they can't do anything when they've got intruders. The women were removed and (ironically) charged with breach of the peace. GAP were targeted across the world for their exploitation of largely female sweatshop labour. In the UK protests were held at twenty GAP Stores from Brighton to Dundee. In London the store on Oxford Road was picketed for six hours. A few women managed to sneak into the store and get into the shop window and strip off to reveal T-shirts bearing slogans like "Girls abused 4 profit". In Dundee the Technopunx padlocked the doors of their local GAP shut.

In Bogotà the capital of Columbia, the Mayor imposed a voluntary curfew for men in the evening of the day. Leaving the streets free for women to enjoy women only concerts, film shows, poetry readings and cycle rides. Even the cities emergency services male crew weren't allowed out leaving it up to female police officers and firewomen. The night was a great success with the usually violent streets taking on a carnival atmosphere. A few men who did break the curfew were pelted with water and flour by women and told to go home. In South Africa 2,000 women gathered in a sports stadium in Cape Town to listen to talks given by women from around the world. 1,500 later took to the streets as a mass demonstration of 'women in black' took to the streets of Cape Town to demand a permanent end to violence and oppression. Even with on looking armed police the women surged into the road and blocked a dual carriageway.

They were demanding a more havin'-it approach to the global climate crisis including the reject of emissions trading, that allows rich countries to buy themselves reductions in emissions (see SchNEWS 285). The ministers had barricaded themselves in behind over 3,000 police, and so again didn't listen to the voice of public opinion.

SchNEWS in brief

SchWoops! NAFA (Notts Anti-Fascist Alliance) were not involved in the attack on a fascist at the recent anti-fash demo in Nottingham. NAFA is an alliance of many diverse groups in Nottingham who are opposed to fascism. Many people and groups were at the demonstration, not just NAFA. They still need witnesses for arrests and police violence (one woman who was truncheoned over the head is bringing a case). Delegates from 188 countries arrived in the city of Naples for the Global Forum, a group that has the potential to create an e-governmental institution which could control and regulate internet and telephone communications globally. The particular focus was increasing and spreading internet technology to the third world - and topics on the agenda included Italy's first electronic ID card.


15,000 – 20,000 people arrived in the alty to protest against the three day conference. The crowd was a diverse mix of political elements: Kurdish refugees, a myriad of anarchist groups, COBAS (a federation of trade union syndicalists), pacifist and student collectives, communists, and everyone olse in between – many arriving on squatted trains, and a university faculty building was squatted for the action.

A major clash with police arose in the Plaza Borsa during the conference, where hundreds of demonstrators came prepared to fight with helmets, masks, glant plexiglass shields, sticks, rocks, and a few Molotov cocktails, and the police responded with gas, and charging the crowd. After much gas and fighting with injuries on both sides - large groups of protesters surrendered and were led out of the plaza by the police.

Well, finally 16 years worth of junk has been sorted and shifted. We're all rather tired here in Nottingham after last week's manic moving out from the Rainbow Centre. Established 16 years ago as a peace centre by CND and Friends of the Earth groups in Nottingham, it has grown to accommodate a wide diversity of groups in a row of rabbit-warren terraces on the Mansfield Road. The Circle A Cafe, a library and information room, office and internet resource centre, alternative energy The new building - the old Ukrainian groups. It was also home to Veggies, the vegan catering campaign and even a few residents as well. But, with a landlord who didn't care, it was becoming run down and under-used and needed an injection of new life. So we decided to do it up.

But then - a flash of inspiration. Why not buy our own building? Why pay rent to some bastard landlord? Why spend dosh doing his building up for him? Why didn't we think of this years ago?! So we looked around the old Ukrainian centre in Forest Fields, an inner city area where many of the Rainbow's volunteers already live anyway. We started to get excited - the stage in the corner with its spangly cabaret backdrop, the possibility of our very own social club - with

beer on tap! Too much! It was time the Rainbow centre moved on. The idea of a more community - based centre appealed to us, and a social venue would open up loads more possibilities.

£110,000 though. Could we really raise that much? We decided to go for it, though I don't think we fully realised what we were letting ourselves in for. 52 or so weekly meetings, lots of fundraising and a few crises later, and we're almost there. The building society was a little bewildered, I think, but we won them over with our promising business plan - can you go wrong selling beer? There's a lot of bureaucracy that goes with buying a building and setting up a new centre; we've made some mistakes and we've learnt a lot along the way. There's been lots of generosity in helping us out financially, in no small part due to Veggies calling in favours from the hundreds of groups they've helped out over the years. We've discovered lots of hidden costs and there've been many other hitches besides, and I'm sure it ain't over yet. There's still work to be done on the building and we've yet to go before the magistrate and convince them that we're worthy of a licence. The way we've worked is by forming a number of sub-groups, each responsible for a different aspect of the new centre. There's the bar group, the cafe group, planning group and so on; people have got involved in the area they're most interested, and (if you're lucky) have most expertise in.

Once we do open, the centre will operate as a private members' social club on some evenings, with a vegan cafe during the day, and a library and other resources, including the usual office stuff; Veggies are coming too. There're plans for an urban permaculture garden project and eventually we hope to renovate outbuildings to make office and workshop space. The first floor of the building will be residential, hopefully to become a housing co-op.

A really important aspect for us is that the centre should bring new people in and be an important resource for the local community as well as the groups traditionally associ-

ated with the Rainbow Centre. Loads of locals are really excited about it and already have plans and ideas, but that's not to say that there haven't been concerns - particularly regarding the bar. I think the neighbours were a little sceptical at first about our commitment to really listen to what local people want and need (maybe they've been to too many council meetings). But we're gradually building faith.

It's been hard work but loads of good fun and if anyone thinks they're up for doing something similar, we're up for dishing out advice. What with all our newly acquired wealth of experience and learning, we just might be able to help you avoid some of the pitfalls! And if anyone out there has any skills we might find useful in doing the place up and you're up for donating a few days of your time (or exchanging it for beer!) then we'd be delighted to hear from you. We also want people to get involved once the place is up and running, and we even need a couple more residents in the place, so, likewise, get in touch. One final thing -we haven't come up with a name! We don't want to be called the Rainbow Centre again that's one of the bonuses of starting

Legalise it!

Connabis advocates act up in Whitehall Activists nathered outside Downing Street on March the 10th - the day the government released the latout drug arrest figures. Home Office statistics revealed just under 100,000 people were arrested for cannabis related offences last year. Shane Collins, an ardent legalisation activist and Green Party Drugs Group operative said: "Cannabis poslession is the sixth most common crime and a major source of tension between police and many actions of society. Now is the time to legalise annabis, cut crime and separate this much maligned herb from addictive drugs such as heroin which need to be treated as a medical issue." A noll conducted by the Economist in Jan 2000 sugjusted 90 per cent of the population were in fayour of decriminalising cannabis use. A report published by Cleveland Police in the same month userted: "An alternative approach must be found...the most obvious alternative approach is the legalisation and subsequent regulation of ome or all drugs." An independent committee int up by the Police Federation and chaired by and Runciman concluded that a radical overhaul of drug laws was required including decriminalising cultivation and possession of canlibbs for personal use. After the report was iglored by the Government, Lady Runciman told OUALL: "I think it's absolutely pathetic. And it indicates they [the government] are not well up the issues......We think there's a real risk that cannabis laws are used as a proxy for the control of public order and we think they are inimical to good community relations."

VODKA AD NOT IN SOCIALIST SPIRIT

Photographer reclaims Guevara image from the marketeers:

It was a flippant British advert for vodka which finally provoked 72 year-old Alberto Diaz Gutierrez, aka Korda, to claim copyright for one of the most famous photographs in world history. In September this year, Alberto Gutierrez accepted "substantial" payments from photoagency, Rex Features and the advertising agency, Lowe Lintas, for the misappropriation of Che Guevara's image for a spicy vodka advert in the UK.

Korda's photograph of a strident and determined Che Guevara, entitled 'Guerillero Heroico', was taken on March 5 1960 at a memorial for 100 Belgian seaman killed when anti-Cuban forces, back by the US, attacked their armscarrying shipment. At the memorial service, also attended by Jean Paul Sartre and Simone de Beauvoir, Guevara stepped forward on the platform for a brief moment and, seeing the look on his face, Korda aimed his Leica camera.

After falling into the hands of Italian publisher Giancomo Fetrinelli in 1967, Korda's photograph was mass reproduced on posters, badges, T-shirts and sold all over the world. During that time several people, including Fetrinelli, made a stack of money from the image but Alberto Korda was neither acknowledged as author nor given any royalty payments.

Although it was common knowledge that, as a photographer for a Cuban newspaper, Korda had taken the photograph, Korda himself never pressed for royalties

although he acknowledged in London recently that "I have always considered it a mark of disrespect for the picture to be used without my permission and without me being credited as the author.


However, according to his submissions to the High Court, Korda accused the British advertising company, Lowe Lintas, of trivialising Guevara's

image by overlaying it with a hammer and sickle mou where the hammer had been replaced by a chilli pepper Korda said: "I was offended by the use of the image

To use the image of Che Guevara to sell vodka is a slin on his name and memory."

Initially Lowe Lintas and Rex Features contested Korda claim of copyright infringement, but then agreed an out of court settlement. The settlement was ratified by the High Court and Korda was declared to be the copyright own of the image. In keeping with Korda's socialist principle the photographer has donated the money he received from the settlement to child care projects in his native Cuba.

This week politicians and corporations were bigging up more trade agreements as ways of helping the poor of the world get a bigger slice of the cake. But not everyone in the so-called global village is having the (global) village idiot wool pulled over their eyes.

GENEVA: Protestors dressed as businessmen an d waving butterfly nets were seen chasing other demonstrators dressed as giant taps, mobile phones and first aid kits on the lawns of the World Trade Organisation headquarters on Monday. They were marking the opening of the next round of trade talks - the General Agreement on Trades in Services or GATS (see SchNEWS 286). Everything from water to housing, education to hospitals could go under the corporate hammer with the World Development Movement describing GATS as 'an agreement set to privatise the world's public services in the interests of big business.

Even World Trade Organisation officials have described GATS as a means of locking countries into 'liberalisation' - and once a country's privatised any service there's no going back on the decision. Unless they're willing to face trade sanc-

NEW DELHI: 100,000 farmers gathered in New Delhi in a last ditch batile against plans by the World Trade Orpanisation to liberalise agriculture. Farmers are worried amongst other things about highly subsidised imports of agricultural goods from rich countries flooding their country. Mahendra Singh Tikait from the Bharatiya Kisan Union's said, "Unless you organise and come into the streets, nobody will listen to you." swamy.krrs@vsnl.com

QUEBEC: From the 20-22 April Quebec City has the 'honour' of hosting the Summit of the Americas. One of the Summit's major goals is putting the final touches on the Free Trade Area of the Americas agreement which aims to establish a "free trade" zone that would extend NAFTA (the North American Free Trade Agreement - see SchNEWS 200) to the

tip of South America. As usual the main purpose of this trade area is to allow corporations to reap greater profits by getting rid of what they perceive as barriers to trade - silly things like environmental regulations, unionised workplaces, restrictions on child labour etc.

Demonstrations are planned and the police are promising the largest security operation in Canadian history.

NAPLES: Twenty thousand antiglobalisation protestors clashed with six thousand police on Saturday at the end of a Global Forum Conference on e-government. A security cordon ringed the conference, which discussed things like Italy's first electronic ID card. TV footage showed isolated demonstrators, as well as journalists, TV cameramen and two of their own plainclothes being beaten by cops! Father Vitaliano Della Sala who took part in the Zapatista march to Mexico City last week (see SchNEWS 297) said, "It was easier for sub-commandante Marcos to reach Mexico City than for these kids to reach Piazza Plebiscito.' www.noglobal.org

ARGENTINA: Cuts of nearly \$4.5 billion over the next two years have plunged Argentina into economic and political crisis. The austerity package is in order to receive loans from the International Monetary Fund. Two finance ministers as well as government officials have walked out in protest, unions announced a series of general strikes, students are planning protests at cuts in education while opposition leaders said they would not support the measures. The President has asked Congress to grant him special emergency powers to push through the cuts.

GENOA: Support is building for the demonstrations against the G8 - leaders of the seven richest industrialised countries plus Russia - Summit in Genoa on 20-23rd July. Maybe that's why there are rumours that events could turn into a real life Water World with delegates stuck aboard luxury cruisers anchored in Genoa Bay in an effort to foil protesters. Protests are now continuing on a daily basis, all protest in Bupyong has been outlawed and the protests have spread to the capital Seoul. Late on Friday 16 March, Delroy Lindo was arrested for the 38th time in eight years (see SchNews 260, 265). Delroy, a black community worker, was nicked at a shopping centre in London after cops driving pass on the other side claimed he mouthed the words 'wanker' at them. The real reason is that Delroy's been a thorn in the side of the establishmental least loyears, including organising a campaign to free Winston Silcott, who was wrongly sent down for the murder of P.C. Blakelock in the riots on Broadwater Farm, London in 1985.

This time Delroy, who suffered injuries during the arrest, was held for 6 hours at the infamous Hornsey police station - infamous for the death of Joy Gardener, which kicked-off the riot on Broadwater Farm. After holding Delroy all night, he was offered a caution which was flatly refused. He was once again released without charge.

An internal report by the Met published six weeks ago concluded that Delroy has been unduly harassed - it seems the cops who arrested him didn't read the report. TRAIN TO KILL

"We hope to make the transportation of this highly dangerous waste as expensive as possible so that the government will have to stop" – Activist

At 00.30 on Thursday morning, a CASTOR trainload of nuclear waste finally arrived - over 24 hours late - at the rural German village of Gorleben, Filled with 60 tonnes of deadly waste, the Castor pulled out of Le Hague in France on Monday on its 375 mile journey. Despite the freezing weather and the massive police operation anti-nuclear protesters across Germany dogged the shipment every inch of the way. People blockaded, occupied, chained and cemented themselves to tracks; some even staged a volleyball tournament. More than 1,400 people have been arrested amid accounts of massive police brutality. So far, most have been released without charge.

On Tuesday morning, the train was forced to change route after a blockade in Goettingen where Greenpeace activists abeiled with chains connected to the track from Seerau bridge and succeeded in hanging in there for six hours. On Tuesday evening, the train got stuck for hours again, this time at Lueneburg - 50km from the destination. Why? Cos a 'cell train' full of people nicked from an earlier 1600-strong blockade got blocked in on the single-track line to Gorleben by other protesters. Nice one!

And for Babylon, it all went downhill from there. Plans to finish the journey went totally pear-shaped as over 15,000 people including groups such as x-1000, Robin Wood, Greenpeace, a 'black bloc' of Autonomen anarchists and even local farmers - upped the number of 'delaying' actions, to the fury of over 20,000 tooled-up cops. At Sueschendorf, it took police 20 hours to remove five plucky Robin Wood activists who had chained and cemented themselves in between the tracks. Thousands of people had blocked the line along the final miles of the route and could only be moved by police using extreme force. Although the evil cargo eventually reached its destination, protesters are regarding the massive disruption as a huge success.

The police operation was the largest seen in post-war Germany. Around Dannenberg - the railhead for Gorleben - cops attacked and evicted temporary 'camps' set up in fields by protesters, dispersing people over the freezing countryside. Daft restrictions forbidding tents were brought in by the police,

which meant everyone had to sleep out in sub-zero temperatures. Several protesters were badly injured when riot police charged camps at Nahrendorf and Dahlenberg, while others were nicked and then driven miles away and released - a ruse foiled by activists who quickly got together a 'shuttle bus' to get folk back to the barricades!

This was the first CASTOR (meaning 'Cask for Storage and Transport Of Radioactive waste) train to run since 1998, when clashes between protesters and cops saw a suspension of the noxious trade. German nuclear power stations are legally required to deal with their waste, and unless they can safely store this waste they cannot get a license to operate. The waste storage sites at Gorleben and Ahaus are the only approved sites for storing dodgy stuff after reprocessing at Sellafield in the UK or La Hague in France. So anti-nuclear activists see the storage sites as critical to the functioning of the whole unpleasant set-up, and there's been a long history of makin' trouble to stop the trains. In March '97, 7,000 people blocked Dannesburg rail terminal where the containers are transferred to road trucks for the last few miles into the Gorleben site - cutting down railway power cables and setting light to barricades.

First Class Actions

* Police threatened the owner of a private company that they would force the doors of his premises if he continued to refuse to let them refuel their water cannons there! * In at least one case police have given written orders to stay away from the location to an inhabitant of Dannenberg - he is supposed to stay away from the town he lives in until March 28!

* Activists in Luechow-Dannenberg report that cops took over the telecom premises in the nearby town of Uelzen and banned technical staff from entering the premises. This place is responsible for maintaining the D-1 cell-phone net in the area; cops closed it down to prevent communication! * In the towns of Hitzacker and Dannenberg, school-kids squatted schools

Dannenberg, school-kids squatted schools and gyms to prevent the police from commandeering them as accomodation for officers. The clued-up kids then opened the buildings as crash space for protesters!

* The transport is expected to cost some 60 mill. US dollars, Well spent, eh?

BEYOND the PALE

Looks like there's gonna be fun and games in store for BP next month as protestors plan to descend on their AGM. Maybe there will be complaints about BP's investment in PetroChina – the Chinese state oil company who are sucking the wealth out of countries like Tibet and Sudan. In Sudan for example the security forces have cleared areas by the pipelines using such pleasant techniques as aerial bombardments, unlawful killings, rape, abduction and torture.

Maybe people will be arguing that despite the fact that BP have adopted a sunflower logo and "beyond petroleum" slogan they're spending £6 billion a year on oil exploration in ecologically sensitive places like the Atlantic frontier in the North Sea and the Arctic (where temperatures are rising up to five times faster than the global average and an area the size of Holland is disappearing each year).

Or maybe they'll just be hearing complaints about the obscene £24,000 profit a minute that the company are making – that's £1 billion a month. This should more than cover the £200 million they are proposing to spend over the next five years on renewable energy.

SchNEWS just can't understand why BP has been putting pressure on the government to change the law so corporations don't have to bother with AGMs.

Still, in true BP topsy-turvy style they have committed themselves to greater openness while trying to stop debate at the meeting!

PLANS MODIFIED

Anti-genetic campaigners in Sussex are celebrating after plans for a farm scale trial of genetically modified oil seed rape were scrapped. After talking to locals, a demo in the nearby town of Hailsham, and visits to the farm, the farmer pulled out saying he was afraid of the spread of foot and mouth (even though there have been no cases in Sussex). Protesters believe it may be because he was none too popular in his village as at the parish council meeting only four out of sixty people voted in favour of the trial.

Nursery Crime

Atherden Road Nursery won its first court battle this week, against Hackney Council who have been busy cutting services across the borough after it went bankrupt (SchNEWS 281). The Nursery has now been squatted by local people and turned into a Community Centre with everything from a Parent and Under-5s Drop-in; Circus Skills; Creative Arts and Ceramic Workshops; to English as a Second Language; Samba Classes; Gardening; DJ and Bike Workshops; cheap Internet Access; a book and video library; low-cost community meals and evening events. As one user put it "the centre provides the kind of services Hacknev Council should be offering instead of cutting." Now, of course the Council wants the building back so they can sell it off to some private corporation. The Centre is just off Lower Clapton Road. To find out what's going on call 020 8525 0247. Not only do they make loads of cash out of the voucher system provided for refugees but they also are one of the main companies involved in the privatised prison service. Last month there was a day of action against them with activists in Bristol occupying the Mariott hotel, which is owned by said multi-national. Forty campaigners turned up to tell the public all about Sodexho's sordid affairs with some activists sneaking into a hotel room, barricading themselves in and hanging a banner out of a window which read Sodexho Marriot - from hotels to prisons' Others occupied the front steps of the building, banged drums and handed leaflets to passers by. "What Sodexho represents is the degradation of humanity in the pursuit of profit" says Mark Foran of Bristol's Sod-Action collective "By taking action we can show Sodexho what we really think of their dirty trade. In a distressed state he threatened to take his own life, and after a 4 hour siege was arrested and charged with possessing a replica hand gun, and intending to use an imitation hand gun with the intent of resisting arrest. Now put yourself in his shoes - he had to flee Iran because he would have been sentenced to death, but he says "I am very, very puzzled, in this country they say I am not allowed to kill myself, but on the other hand they want to return me to people who will kill me."

What the f**k is going on when we know that human rights abuses occur in Iran, we know that people are tortured on a daily basis, but we still refuse people who have fled for their lives asy lum, and deport them back to face certain death? If Farrokh is found guilty he could face two years in prison before getting deported. At the moment he is being held on remand at HMP Exeter, New North Road, Exeter, Devon, EX44EX. and has no money for phone cards, so if you could, send cheques made payable to 'the Gov-ernor' but write Farrokh Shiri on the back, as

1 in 12 turns 20

In 1980 Margaret Thatcher was completing her first year in office, unemployment had rocketed and industrial northern cities like Bradford were being decimated. Nonetheless the local Claimants Union group countered the pervasive mood of depression with spirited resistance. As well as providing advice to claimants, the union hounded dole snoopers, produced a claimants newspaper and put on regular cheap gigs with local bands. A spirit of mutual aid, self management and cooperation were the underlying principles.

In early 1981 the Government published the Raynor Report which alleged that one in every twelve claimants were defrauding the state. In April the Claimants Union responded, "Join the 1 in 12 and be an enemy of the State!". Once a week the Club would organise gigs, socials and benefits in a room above a city centre pub. Membership soon reached 1000, and by late 1982 the Club could boast 6 issues of its own fanzine, Knee Deep in Shit, two volumes of 'Worst of the 1 in 12' featuring bands who had played the Club, and a free outdoor music festival attended by over 3000 people.

Before each gig there would be the weekly 1 in 12 Club meetings, open to all members and where ALL decisions were taken. In 1983, after much soul searching the decision was taken to apply to the Council for a Department of Environment 'Urban Programme' Grant for the purchase of premises. To everyone's surprise this was successful, and after much delay work started on the Club's Albion Street home in 1986.

Meanwhile the Club was establishing itself as a genuine creative influence on the music scene. NME and Sounds regularly reviewed gigs, bands based at the Club gained radio play, and the 1 in 12 Record Collectives releases consistently sold out. New Model Army, Southern Death Cult, Joolz and Chumbawamba all featured on the early albums.

1984-5 was the year of the Strike. The defeat of the Miners' changed the political landscape forever, but during the year of struggle the impact on the 1 in 12 Club was enormous. At each gig, collections of food, money and materials were made, members picketed, broke the council ban on street collections, and engaged in other 'direct action'! It was a year of politicisation, a year in which the Club grew up. At the end of the strike Kellingley Miners' Wives Support Group showed their appreciation for the solidarity shown by members, and at a special ceremony at Kellingley Miners Welfare the Club was amongst those presented with special commemorative plaques. In 1986 the 1 in 12 Publications Collective published its first book, a collection of poems by Jean Gittens, mother of two striking miners' with all monies going to the N.U.M Solidarity Fund.

With the purchase of the Albion Street building in 1986

all efforts were directed towards its renovation. For over two years, the mostly unemployed Club members worked voluntarily carrying out building work. As if that wasn't hard enough, the Club now faced an increasing hostile Council, angry at 1 in 12 revelations about Masonic influence in the Knee Deep in Shit fanzine. When a local paper ran a front page story, "How Council Money is Funding Anarchy" the shit really hit the fan. At least five separate Council and Governmental inquiries were launched into the Club, each time finding nothing untoward and forced to conclude that self-management and mutual aid worked!

In June 1988 the Club's new home at 21-23 Albion Street was finally opened, complete with two bars, a concert room, pool table, and meeting space. The achievement was monumental, but in many ways the hard work hadn't even started. A grant had bought the building, but survival was down to the viability of the Club's ideas! If we couldn't manage our own building what made us think we could run our own society!

The never-ending struggle to meet the financial obligations of running a building the size of Albion street has often imposed a dreary obsession with creating enough revenue to survive. The Club has never made a profit, most work is done voluntarily and those who are paid work for ridiculously low wages. The pressure to succumb to

capitalistic and exploitative methods has never been far away. But the Club has survived, constantly reinventing itself, new members joining old, challenging assumptions and expectations and taking the Club in to new and exciting directions.

Since the building opened a cafe has been opened on the top floor, a library with over 2500 titles added, a snooker room built, and most recently work on a recording studio almost completed. Numerous collectives have come into existence bringing people together around shared interests and projects. The Club runs two quiz teams, a pool and doms team, two football teams, a drama collective, maintains three plots on an inner-city allotment, maintains its web-site and since 1997 has organised its own Reclaim May Day celebrations.

This followed a trip by 43 Club members to Barcelona in 1996 for the anarchist, CNT union federation's May Day celebrations and suitably inspired the club has organised its own events each year since. These include a May Day Parade, gigs, plays, football tournaments, meetings, speakers, exhibitions, bookfairs, film festivals and the May Day 98 Conference. Reclaim May Day events have now spread and last year saw impressive celebrations in Sheffield and Manchester as well as the much publicised Conference and Guerilla Gardening in London. In a small way the 1 in 12 Club would like to think it played a part in reviving May Day as a day of celebration and resistance.

In April 2001 the 1 in 12 Club celebrates its twentieth anniversary. Twenty years of self-management, music and mayhem!

It was watching the pyres pumping black smoke, the charred carcasses and the gunshots in the background that pushed the penny to drop - this is wrong, period. We're possessed by a collective madness, a tunnel-visioned obsession that will tolerate no other vision.

At first the cull seemed half way reasonable - "let's stop the outbreak in its tracks" - except the tracks had already disappeared over the horizon, from Longtown to Devon, across into Wales and all over Cumbria.

Now, thousands of animals, prize flocks and herds have been blown away, generations and centuries of joy and grief and hardship and breeding, up in smoke. And the slaughter has hardly begun. If we continue, mass burials and pyres will pollute our water courses and the air we breathe. And vital parts of our animal heritage, the Herdwicks and Swaledales and Devon Reds and Cheviots will be lost.

We cannot treat animals like this, period. I was bought up to look after animals, be they cats or calves, to treat them well and with due respect. It's part of being a decent human being. Lining them up and mass slaughtering them so they know exactly what is coming and bellow with terror is obscene and against all laws forbidding cruelty. And how will the children grow up, the ones who've witnessed these horrors? They've either been separated from their parents so they could go to school and be with their friends, or stayed on the farm, cut off from school, living in a limbo-land, confined inside until the men from the bungling Ministry arrive to kill their pets.

We could have vaccinated, right from the beginning, or as soon as we realised it was out of control, within the first few days at least. And we could have vaccinated to give life, not kill the animals later. Based on the experiences of other infected countries, that would have stopped the epidemic in its tracks. And the damage? At best we wouldn't have been able to export animals or meat - a small percentage of the market - for one whole year after the last vaccination and outbreak. At worst we'd have had to live with occasional outbreaks of a disease which most animals survive. Balance that against the horror and economic ruin which is actually happening.

We could even, heresy of heresy, have treated the animals who came down with the disease, improving resistance in flocks and herds and dispelling the panic which foot and mouth's rapid spread amongst stressed, resistance free animals engenders.

And we could have applied proper prevention measures.

No farms in this area so far have been infected, touch wood. We're four miles from a restricted area and about 11 miles from the nearest confirmed outbreak. There's one small road into the area which passes through Uplowman Court farm, owned by Stafford Blake, Stafford's the only farmer in this area who regularly went to market, with all the attendant dangers of infection. All farmers in the area including Stafford Blake want to see the road closed, as do the local MP, councillors and Devon County Council Highways Department - who did actually shut it. There's an easy detour, adds about three minutes to the journey. But then our elected council was told to open the road by the police, and an appeal to MAFF from our MP in the House of Commons fell on deaf ears. The police informed us that roads would only be closed if MAFF made a recommendation MAFF refused to recommend because policy from London wouldn't permit unless we had an outbreak on the road - hardly prevention.

The police threatened to arrest us if we put any signs on the termac asking people not to drive through the farmyard. So we put big signs in the hedges and on the verge, which stopped the locals at least going through. MAFF even refused to help provide decent mats and disinfectant to disinfect the public highway through the farm, despite spending millions on slaughter when prevention fails. A car drove through last week en route from Cumbria. There's ten farmers who border on Stafford Blake's land, a thousand head of cattle and more of sheep at risk. We wait in hope.

Then came the borax saga: Borax 30 is the homeopathic remedy for ulcers and salivation in cattle, the symptoms of foot and mouth. I wrote my first article about homeopathic veterinary care some fifteen years ago and was thoroughly impressed. Homeopathic vets are generally also allopathic vets. They treat using both systems. They make no extravagant claims, but many believe that certain remedies may work, like borax 30.

It was used during the 1939 and 1967 outbreaks. There's a farmer near Dartmoor, surrounded by infected farms, who's using it, has kept his dairy herd free of infection, and intends to keep it that way, while MAFF try to make him cull. Let's be clear, borax 30 cannot at present be used to cure, because that is illegal. Any outbreak of foot and mouth must be reported immediately and the herd slaughtered. But borax may well have a preventive effect. "We have no problem with you using it at all." Simon Hack told me, from MAFF's veterinary medicine directorate. "We have been mundated with calls, there are many many farmers using it." Meanwhile, in a strange reversal of roles, the Soil Association helpline told me that preventative use of homeopathic borax is "illegal," possibly because there's controversy raging amongst homeopathic vets as to whether borax 30 acts to prevent, or merely masks symptoms. If we'd only spent a tiny fraction of the money being consumed by funeral pyres on researching borax 30, farmers wouldn't be so confused and we might have an effective preventative remedy.

The future lies with local markets, with people knowing where their food comes from and being able to see for themselves. How we feed ourselves and use our land is perhaps the most important issue facing the human race. If there's anything good to be drawn from this cruel, polluting waste, it's that we have to change the system. But first we must stop this senseless slaughter. It's wrong, full stop.

"If a genuine and serious grievance arose, such as might result from a significant drop in the standard of living, all those who now dissipate their protest over a wide variety of causes might concentrate their efforts and produce a situation which was beyond the power of the police to handle.

Last Saturday morning 200 police took part in a dawn raid on the Button Factory in Brixton. Cops claimed that the centre was "A secret training centre for anarchists who are planning to bring chaos to London on May Day". Apparently, "Anarchists from across Europe were due to gather... this weekend for riot training and planning.

The raid is part of the hysteria leading up to the planned Monopoly May Day protests, with stories in the papers getting more and more ludicrous as the day approaches. The cops feed the media and the media feeds the cops until broken skulls and mass arrests are seen as essential to stop marauding anarchists from leaving the capital and city in ruins.

But it's also part of a wider picture - in this country and across the world - of resistance and opposition to injustice, ecological destruction and poverty being criminalised. As campaigners against single issues like roads or genetics are increasingly cottoning on to the fact that it's the whole damn capitalist system that needs to be overthrown, they're finding themselves being described as 'terrorists'. The

stakes are being raised.

The British State is the most experienced in the world at quelling resistance. General Frank Kitson (who worked in Malaya, Ireland and then Britain in the early 80s) wrote the British state's handbook on dealing with 'subversion', Low Intensity Operations, way back in 1971. In it he emphasises the importance of intelligence gathering using "a large number of low grade sources", "psychological operations" such as propaganda against opposition groups, use of the media to target individuals, and the use of infiltrators. The aim of this activity is to divide and destroy the movement by encouraging ineffective opposition (voting for 'left-wing' MPs, marching from A to B, listening passively to public speakers at rallies, signing petitions...) at the same time as using the media, police, courts and prisons to destroy effective opposition. As Kitson puts it, the way to smash a movement is "to associate as many prominent members of the population, especially those who may have engaged in non-violent action, with the government" and "to discover and neutralise the genuine subversive element".

Since May Day 2000 this strategy has been actively pursued in Britain. The po-lice used May Day itself to gather an enormous amount of intelligence and get its mates in the media to portray such actions in the future as 'unacceptable' and those involved as 'criminal'. Alongside the ar-rests, raids and imprisonments, it was not long before "prominent" people "involved in non-violent action" were joining in the police's attacks on the Mayday action and specifically on alleged organisers. These people were quickly used by groups uninvolved in direct action to promote some kind of third way between direct action and doing nothing - a sort of being annoyed at capitalism while tut-tutting people who do

BUTTON UP! Without any sense of irony, the UK's brand spanking new Terrorism Act came into effect just two days after the UK and good ol' USA bombed Baghdad. We've mentioned the new Law plenty of times, but going to the People's Global Action Conference in Milan we heard first hand from across the globe how different governments are dealing with the growing anticapitalist movement. And hey what a surprise, it's a pretty standard formula: spread propaganda that these people will eat your babies and that the only way to stop them is more repressive laws.

But the fact remains, it isn't anti-capitalists, environmentalists or even those dastardly animal rights protesters who have been bombing Baghdad or Belgrade (yeah, we know - it was 'humanitarian' bombing). It isn't protesters who welcomed with open arms Russia's President Putin



something about it. The prominent individuals proposing this sort of ineffectual opposition soon find themselves getting newspaper columns, appearing on chat shows and generally being promoted by those in control of the media. Unless they show support for effective opposition on the streets, that is - in which case they can kiss goodbye to their newspaper columns.

Kitson pointed out that it's no good just repressing opposition when people have genuine grievances - you must allow people to let off steam, but only in ways that don't have any effect. Our job is to make sure that our resistance isn't just about letting off steam, shouting at the telly and cheering people at rallies - but about taking effective action.

REBEL ALLIANCE

after he'd bombed Chechnya back into the dark ages. It isn't protesters who sell Hawk jets to dictators, refuse AIDS drugs to Africans because they're poor, dump toxic chemicals in the poorest countries in the world . We could go on ..

Quite by chance however, one clause under the UK's Terrorism Act states that its OK to bomb Baghdad as "nothing in this section imposes criminal liability on any person acting on behalf of, or holding office under, The Crown." It's just when you protest against government policy that you become a terrorist. As the saying goes, "you can't be a terrorist if you've got an airforce"

BUTTON MOON

The Button Factory was opened as a social centre late summer last year, and has been used for a variety of different benefit gigs, gettogethers and parties. But that's now all come to an end after the owner and his hired heavies used mechanical diggers to make the place uninhabitable. So let's get this straight - the police en masse raid an empty building and take 'materials' from it. The owners then smash up the building and make it uninhabitable. The police then keep the building guarded and under surveillance so anarchists don't try and meet there and make plans for er, smashing up buildings.

MEET THE TERRORISTS!

EUROPOL

Police chiefs from the European Union were joined by heads of police from other countries and representatives from the European Commission, early this year in Madrid. The meeting was the first European Conference on Terrorism, organised by the Spanish Ministry of the Interior and Europol. Out of this meeting Europol (the new European Union police similar to the FBI) has started attacking-narchists, anti-capitalists and street violence at mass demonstrations as terrorism. It now wants Europewide powers against terrorism.

COLOMBIA

Oscar was working for a Colombian human rights group when he was arrested at a demonstration and charged with being a member of a guerrilla group under special Public Order legislation. "The intention of the special legislation is too scare people and to attack opponents of the government. I was put in a small room with a big mirror. Behind the mirror is the judge who you can't see. He talks through a microphone that distorts his voice. A secret witness accused me and it is impossible to know who that person is. I refused to take part in the trial or use a solicitor - if you are charged under the legislation you are going to be sentenced, everyone is found guilty. If you kill somebody in Colombia you can be sentenced to 10 years and you'll just be in prison for 5, but if you are charged with being a terrorist you can be sentenced to 20 or 50 years. For example, if you are sentenced for throwing a stone at a demonstration you can be put in prison for 20 years. I was in prison for four years. I went on hunger strike and I was temporarily released. Amnesty International bought me a ticket to come to London where I got political asylum. If I go back to Colombia I face 10 years in prison.

When SchNEWS asked Oscar's wife what it was like living in London she looked behind both shoulders "At least we are not looking behind our backs anymore."

GREECE

A new umbrella anti-terrorism law is currently before the Greek parliament representing an attack on the mass movements in general and includes a very broad definition of what constitutes terrorism. It encourages the use of agent provocateurs, and allows facial mapping of suspects and DNA samples to be taken by force.

UNITED STATES

An anti-terrorism bill has just been approved by the state government of Oregon, and is waiting to be ratified by the US senate. Under the bill, tree spiking and sabbing animal research or livestock production would be reclassified as organised crimes with increased penalties. Protesters could face up to 20 years in prison for such 'hate crimes', and victims of 'eco-terrorism' would be able to seek civil damages. The measure is aimed at curtailing the activities of groups like the Earth Liberation Front, which has caused \$19.2 million in property damage since 1996. A Republican supporter of the bill said, "The FBI recognises the Earth Liberation Front as one of the nation's leading single-issue domestic terrorists," and then went on to compare the way the ELF operates with the mafia!

PRAGUE

Chris is a well-known activist and cartoonist who went to last September's demonstrations against the World Bank and International Monetary Fund in Prague. Police arrested her in a school field away from the Conference Centre. What happened to her over the next few days is the stuff of nightmares. "The police asked for my camera and I refused so about seven of them started hitting me and then threw me into a police van knocking me half-conscious.

"When I got to prison I just lay on the floor for the first six hours. After a while when they kept refusing us phone calls, all the women in the cell started making lots of noise until they handcuffed us onto the bench in contorted positions. They made us pay a fine saying we would be released but it was a lie and we had to stay the whole night. In the morning I asked to go to the toilet and on the way back I just refused to go back to the cell. I held onto objects while they hit me all over. I was bleeding really heavily and eventually they took me to a hospital where I had loads of stitches. They took me back to the cell and it was empty, all my friends had been released, I freaked out and asked why I was still here and they laughed really ugly. They then took me upstairs to the interrogation room and they start telling me I was going to jail for 20 years minimum for assaulting seven police officers! They said I'd be held for a few months before I even got a hearing. I was afraid of being in four walls for a long time; I couldn't imagine myself staying sane in there. I saw the open window and jumped. I didn't know how high it was or what was at the bottom. I hit the ground - it was the hardest thing I ever felt in my life, I nearly vomited my insides and I started screaming. I thought if I went to hospital they would treat me humanely and the police would have to leave me alone - I was so wrong.

The Ministry of Interior made the hospital like a fortress. These were not normal nurses and doctors - basically I should have been op-erated on in the first 24 hours to save my leg and they didn't do anything, they didn't even give me ice or painkillers. They would shake my leg really strong and I was screaming, and they would laugh informing me that I was a terrorist and that's why they treated me like this: 'You come here to destroy Prague so you deserve this.' and 'It's a war zone, you can't expect to have your human rights respected.' They put a cage around my bed even though I had a broken spine, and locked me in a storage cupboard with the doors closed with guards outside so nobody could hear me scream. There was an information embargo about me. My friends called the hospital who told them I wasn't there - many dissidents and important Czech personalities called as well and they got lied to too. I didn't know if anybody would ever find out about me, that's why I was so scared, they refused me any contact with the outside world. It wasn't until all the media hype that I was eventually taken to Austria. My leg literally exploded, and for one month in Austria they wanted to cut my leg off. While I was in hospital in Austria, I was sent a big bouquet of flowers with a card 'with best recommendations - the Czech Embassy.'! The last six months I've been in hospital or laid up in bed. It really did stun me, and I lost a lot of motivation. I haven't drawn any pictures - I was too vulnerable. I made notes in the Prague Hospital on little bits of paper and when I re-read these I was so shocked. I'd forgotten everything, I

started shaking. All these memories were so

incredibly horrible, it was like a nightmare, I couldn't believe the whole time that it was happening - it didn't seem possible that people could do such cruel things." On the positive side (such as it is), Chris praised "the wonderful solidarity of the people all over the world, regarding the prisoners of Prague. I think that this kind of thing must fascinate even the police and their likes, just because of the immense commitment and frighteningly chaotic strength and self organisation that these campaigns have."

* Since the Prague protests the authorities have been rushing ahead with new laws. Graffiti can now get you a lengthy prison sentence, and there are plans to crack down on public gatherings.

HOLLAND

Gay marriages, smoking cannabis on the streets, laws on euthanasia - Holland is seen by many in Europe as a liberal paradise. SchNEWS spoke to someone from Groen Front! (Dutch Earth First!) who helped dispel some of the myths and tell us about some of the new Kafka style laws in operation. "They have just introduced a new criminal organisation law specifically targeted at anarchist groups. It describes leadership as 'inciting or organising any initiative that other people can act upon.' This is exactly what activists do organise demonstrations and encourage people to come to them, but it doesn't mean that you are the leader. Another new law is public violence. Recently in the eviction of a squat in Amsterdam, people who'd cooked that night and one person who took part in a pirate radio show got arrested for public violence, after someone threw stones at the police. This is because the new law says that if one person throws a beer can at a police officer on a demonstration, that is public violence and everyone at the demonstration can be arrested for it. Even more bizarre is that if you make a sandwich for someone going to a demonstration you can also legally be arrested!" (This is part of new 'collective responsibility' laws introduced under the cover of stopping football hooliganism at Euro 2000!). "On International Women's Day a group of Groen Front women occupied a construction site and were held for six days. Some got 20 days in prison when usually the fine for trespass is only 60 guilders (£20). During the Climate Convention in The Hague there was an anti nuclear demonstration that was surrounded by the police and everyone arrested. People were later convicted of ignoring police orders and fined 200 guilders. They said they didn't want this demonstration because they didn't have enough police but there were 5,000 police in The Hague during the Conference!

This sort of thing is happening more and more. It shows that they're really scared and they're extremely paranoid of us. They often target individuals. For example one person who has been doing covert actions was put in a psychiatric hospital saying that he had a 'sickly love for nature' and 'disturbing non-realisation of authority.'You can smoke a joint on the street, but if you pass a certain point, or when you get effective they try to really smash you. They have now set up a special security intelligence agency for activist groups and are using informers. The fear is that local people will start occupying things as well especially as they are so many completely useless infrastructure projects happening at the moment.'

AUTONOMOUS ZONES

The demolition of the Button Factory is as good an example as any of authority's fear of people coming together – unless of course they're shopping or paying for entertainment. Having your own autonomous space is crucial for organising, socialising, for breaking down the barriers that set us against each other.

Here's a few examples of European autonomous zones in action:

MILAN

Italy has "three or four hundred autonomous social centres" and the Leoncavello social centre in Milan is the oldest and biggest, kicking off the whole movement in 1974 after two people were killed by fascists. It has been forced to change location several times, once after being demolished by the authorities who didn't leave a wall standing.

They have been in their latest location since 1994 – an impressive old factory complex that is roughly the size of Huddersfield. It includes a massive concert hall, skateboard ramp, cinema, courtyard, several bars including an outdoor one with barbie, café, kids space, table-football, art exhibitions and masses of workshop space. The centre employs full-time office-workers, cleaners, cooks, organisers and printers.

One of the collective members told SchNEWS how important the centre is for organising. "It's fundamental. Everything to develop needs a space." But what really impressed us was the range of people using the place. At Monday's open collective meeting ("every week we have an assembly where we manage the building, anything from 30 to 200 attend"), some are dressed very straight like they've just come from their job in Milano, along with all the people just mentioned who work at the Centro Sociale. SchNEWS saw them all shouting, rolling their eyes, banging the table, standing up, sitting down, pointing, heckling and talking over each other in a spirit of communal unity and collective purpose. As far as we could make out (not speaking Italian) the proposal to keep broccolli on the menu was carried.

On Saturday night 5,000 people came in to see Goldie play in a mini Glastonbury style setting. While probably not all gemmed up on the politics of the place the anti-corporate feel no doubt rubs off. For starters, it was just £3 to get in and there were no overbearing bouncers to spoil your fun. As our man told us, "we are very open to everyone as long as people behave. What is important is what people are like not how they dress."

And maybe, just maybe when they see people who run the centre that helped put on such a good night portrayed in the media as terrorists they will remember buying beers at the Ya Basta bar and begin to question....

BRITANNY

'La Marmite' is a new centre squatted after a Reclaim the Streets party at the beginning of a month long Festival of Resistance in Rennes, Britanny. SchNEWS spoke to one of those involved.

"The main focus of the festival was the opening of a new autonomous zone. We opened on the day of the first ballot of the French local elections. A lot of people from different backgrounds are using the centre, working people, '68 survivors, squatters, organic farmers, students, unemployed people, artists."

There's been daily hot organic meals at £1 a go as well as round-table discussions, video showings, street theatre workshops, painting, actions, an alternative library and musical activities with everything from acoustic and salsa to punk and techno. "The occupation echoes a myriad of similar actions round the world aiming at creating areas of freedom and creativity safe from the grip of market. It is part of the global movement against capitalist globalization, boredom and cultural homogeneity."

And perhaps the best thing of all is that "people who were not involved before have now got involved."

As SchNEWS went to press La Marmite was facing eviction.

EURO DUSNIE

EuroDusnie is an amazing collective from Holland that sprang out of actions against European Unification in April 1997. They have three squatted buildings in Leiden, and have about 10 different projects on the go. These are organised by independent groups whose 'representatives' meet up every two weeks for a joint general meeting.

Amongst other things they produce a free monthly newspaper, run an info-shop, food coop and café, put on cultural evenings, make regular visit schools to talk about the disadvantages of European unification and help run a pirate radio station. They also have a pie-throwing group and a 'collective without money' which organises free train rides to capitalist conferences because "demonstrators, just like the official assholes going to political topsummits, don't have to pay for going there." They also run a Free Shop where the motto is 'happiness is not for sale'. They are also involved in fighting local unwanted commercial 'developments' by bringing people together as well as showing alternatives with locally based projects.

As they point out, "We are firm believers in the idea that when you want something done, you have to go for it yourself rather than expecting that politicians will do it for you. Parliamentary democracy has degenerated into a puppet show. Politics has bartered people away to trade and industry and international institutions like the European Union and the World Trade Organisation. This shows clearly what happens when you let the government make decisions on your behalf..."



SEED OF DISSENT

Minister - here's the pesticide resistant crop. A species which can eat it is in the pipeline.

I never put those plants on my land, The question is, where do Monsanto's rights end and mine begin?"

Percy Schmeiser, Canadian farmer.

Imagine you're a farmer growing a crop and saving some seed to sow the follow-ing year. Now imagine that unbeknown to you, your crop gets contaminated with genetically engineered pollen, then you get taken to court and sued! Er, is this

some kind of April fool?

Well, in Canada last week a judge ruled that a Canadian farmer, Percy Schmeiser, violated Monsanto's patent by "unknowingly and unwillingly growing genetically modified (GM) oil seed rape." He now faces a bill for \$105,000 and after 40 years of saving seeds and developing his own strain has had to purchase new seed wast-

ing a lifetime's work.

Under Canadian patent law, as in the US and many other industrialised countries, it is illegal for farmers to re-use patented seed, or to grow Monsanto's GM seed without signing a licensing agreement. If biotech bastards such as Monsanto get their way, every na-tion in the world will be forced to adopt pat-ent laws that make seed saving illegal. The ruling against Schmeiser establishes an even more dangerous precedent, meaning that farmers can be forced to pay royalties on GM seeds found on their land, even if they didn't buy the seeds, or benefit from them.

The GM oil seed rape that drifted onto Schmeiser's farm was engineered to be resistant to Monsanto's weedkiller, Roundup. He didn't use Roundup on his crop, because that would have killed the majority of his oil seed rape plants that were not geneti-cally modified!. Schmeiser didn't take advantage of Monsanto's GM technology, but the court ruling says he's guilty of using the seed without a licensing agreement.

Monsanto are so zealous about protecting their fat profits that they send around gene police' stealing crops from random farms and then testing them to see if they contain Monsanto's gene to tolerate their own pesticides. Monsanto has threatened to 'vigorously prosecute' hundreds of seed saving farmers, but Schmeiser's was the first major case to reach the courts.

About the ruling Percy said: "I was re-ally alarmed at the fact that it said in the decision that it doesn't matter how it gets into a farmer's field - whether it blows in or cross-pollinates, or comes in on farm machinery - it doesn't belong to the farmer.

It belongs to Monsanto.'

Percy is now considering an appeal and has filed a counter-suit against Monsanto, but his family faces enormous legal costs. Sow What?

The verdict is being hailed as a landmark victory for Monsanto, but it may spark a biotech backlash. North American farmers grow three-quarters of the world's commercial GM crops, and now they're showing signs of biotech battle fatigue. Illegal traces of Aventis' StarLink maize (unapproved for human consumption) have disrupted grain markets and jeopardized exports. Unsold stockpiles of US maize are at their highest level since GM crops were commercialised. The US government announced last month that it would spend \$20 million in taxpayer money to bail out the biotech industry, using money that would normally go to disaster relief for farmers!

Now American farmers are reluctant to plant GM crops, the chief executive of the American Corn Growers Foundation complaining "Consumer resistance in Europe, Asia, Australia, Canada, Mexico, South Africa, Brazil and the growing resistance in the United States makes it unlikely that many market opportunities will be avail-

able for GM crops"

Aventis in the UK

In last week's SchNEWS we told a tale that wamed our cockles, about a Sussex farmer who pulled out of a farm scale trial of oil seed rape. The farmer had originally contacted the local press and said he was pulling out because of the possibility that the scientists conducting the tests could spread foot and mouth disease. When asked about whether the protests against him had had an effect he said, "I'm not bothered about the antis. I enjoy a good debate". Two hours later though he changed his tune saying he pulled out "due to the unbearable level of intimidation and threatening behaviour that has been targeted towards me and my family.". So why

Aventis' application for Chardon LL maize to be the first commercialized GM seeds to be approved for the UK National Seed List has been indefinitely postponed after it was discovered that French authorities had only tested the crop for one year, rather than the two required under EU law. The hearing brought up issues including the failure to test the GM maize on cows, and 'suspicious' higher death rates among GM-fed chickens during trials.

How comes the countryside remains closed to everyone except anyone involved in GM crops? Scientists from 5 institutions will be making regular visits to all of the trials, moving between farms and counties. The trials are non-essential and pose a serious risk of further spreading of the disease. And the government tells us that foot and mouth travels miles but that geneticaly al-tered crops somehow won't. Yeah right, try telling that to Percy Schmeiser!

POSITIVE SCHNEWS: **Outlawed Vegetables**

In the UK 97% of the vegetable varieties available in 1903 were no longer available just eighty years later. Does it matter? - well the Henry Doubleday Research Association (HDRA) think so, and have set up the Heritage Seed Library, because as one of their gardeners pointed out "genetic erosion is a mass extinction every bit as important as the loss of species from tropical rainforests."

Every year seed companies decide not to register certain seeds, and because they aren't on the National Seed List they can't be sold. Plants that may have characteristics that might be useful in the future would be lost if it were not for the amazing work of the Library. You can join the Library and choose some outlawed vegetables and they'll 'lend' you a few seeds.

Just 3 corporations control a quarter of the world's entire seed market: Monsanto, Dupont and Syngenta. The corporations that have been steadily buying all up all your favourite garden seed companies, are the very same biotech giants that are trying to get us all to eat our genetically modified greens. But as Bob Sherman from the HDRA points out, "the risk of concentrating so much commercial power into the hands of one corporate empire is that we have become subject to the dreams and aspirations of a very few people. Do they care about bio-diversity? Not as much, I suspect, as they do about profit."

The Occupation of Atherden Day Nursery in Hackney: Setting Up an Autonomous Community Centre

Atherden Community Centre, Saturday 3rd March 2001. Twenty minutes to go and already there is a queue outside. Inside, a motley staff consisting of the local lollipop lady and her family, a handful of kids from the surrounding streets and a bunch of more orthodox squatters manically fold the last items of clothing and fling them to the tops of teetering piles of jumble. Some of these salespersons to be, veterans of protest and confrontation, are looking more than a little anxious at the sight of the restless senior citizens waiting at the front door, handbags at the ready.

By one o'clock the butterfly cakes are out, the tea urn is steaming, and the apprehensive crew are at their stations and

ready to go. The doors are opened, and the ensuing chaos of elbowing grannies, flying garments and roller-skating 5year-olds marks the opening of Atherden Community Centre's first Jumble Sale.

How did this unlikely scene come about? The story maybe starts in October 2000, when the Borough Treasurer declared Hackney Council officially bankrupt.

Over the next few months, drastic cuts were implemented in public services and community resources across the Borough, including three nurseries which were threatened with closure. A campaign against the cuts, 'Hackney Fightback', was led by striking council workers and supported by a wide cross-section of Hackney residents. Marches and rallies were held, and angry parents occupied the threatened nurseries. At Atherden Nursery, after occupying the centre for 2 weeks, parents were told plans had been changed and the nursery would be kept open. They moved out, and or January 12th the Council went back on their word, and closed

the building anyway.
Inspired by the parents' occupation, a group of local squal ters and assorted activists decided the nursery should remain a community resource, and re-occupied the building. On the 3" Feb they held a public meeting to decide how to use the place. The meeting brought out an inspiring list of ideas for the place, all along the lines of an alternative, self-run community centre Over the next couple of months various regular activities and resources took root, such as a parent and toddler drop-in twice a week, band rehearsals, a ceramics/craft room, different la cal group meetings, massage and T'ai Chi, circus skills & ta ble-tennis for kids, a bike workshop, gardening, computer and internet access, a Free Shop (swap-shop) and language classes.

As well as the Jumble Sale, there was a Columbian Night with great food and visiting speakers; there have been two DJ work shops for under-16s with Megabitch sound system; a Comedy Night with Rob Newman, John Hegley and Jeremy Hardy; a night of samba with the Rhythms of Resistance and a local jazz band, Slamba and a workshop on Alternative Technology from Generator X.

Inevitably, the Council's wheels of bureaucracy continued to turn despite the cuts, and eviction proceedings were initiated. Although a judicial review application delayed them for a while, at time of writing, it seems likely that the Council will regain possession of the building on the 27th April. Undaunted, a 'Never Mind the Bailiffs' Atherden Spring Fete is planned for Saturday the 28th

For the group of squatters who re-opened the building it has been an amazing and difficult experience/experiment in

taking squatted social centres a step outside the usual sub-culture. Sometimes exhausting and frustrating, often inspiring and hilarious, always thought-provoking, Atherden Community Centre has achieved a lot in a short space of time. It has also opened up some possibilities for other closed amenity buildings in the area.....Is there a disused community resource near you?

Note: The centre was evicted on Wednesday,

9th of May 2001.
