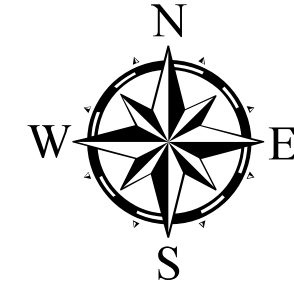




COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY

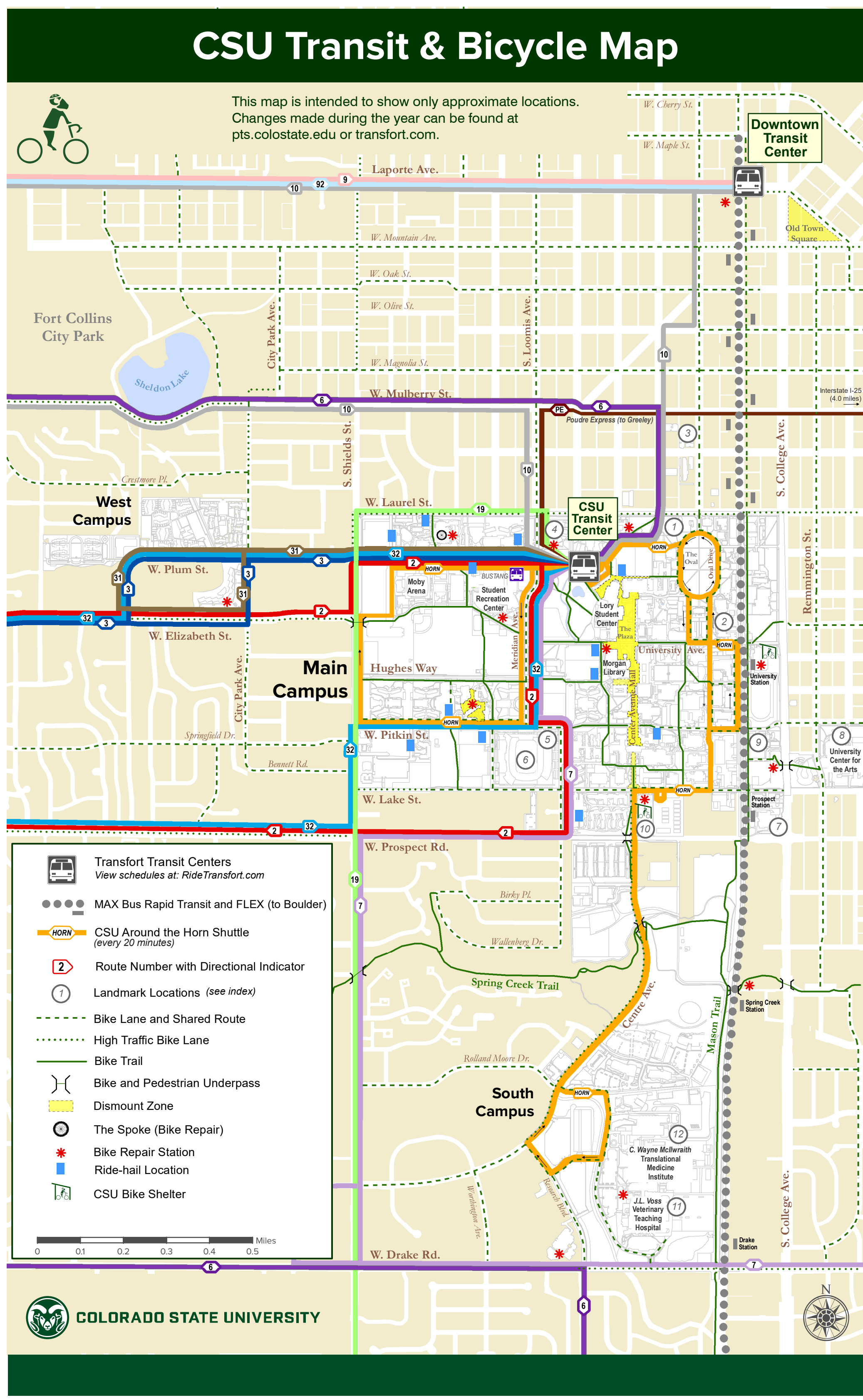
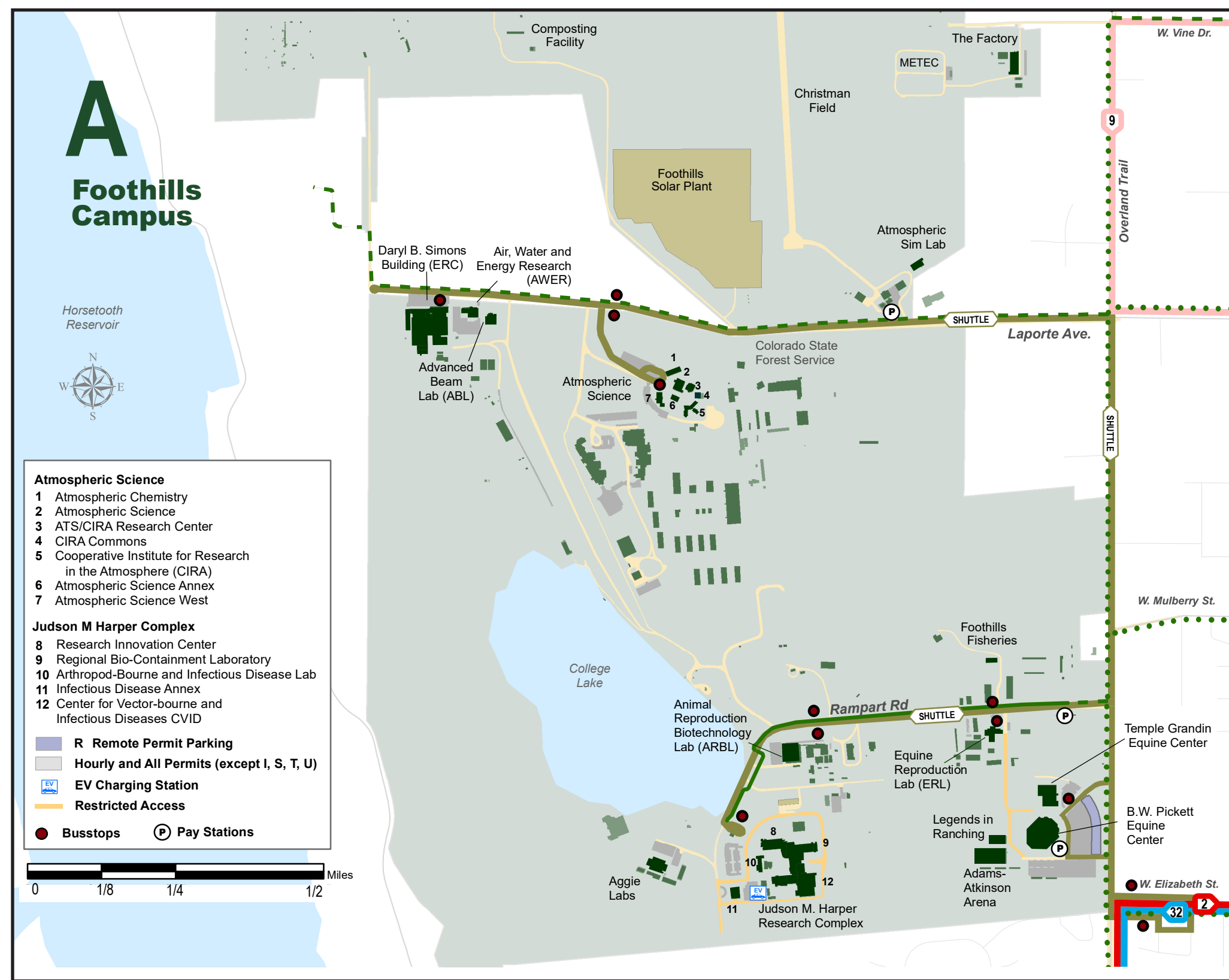
Paid parking is required on CSU campuses, including spring, summer, fall and winter breaks. Valid CSU parking permits can be purchased online at pts.colostate.edu. Hourly parking is available to students, staff and visitors in areas designated on the map. Parking Areas	Enforcement
Residence hall spaces (Q, Y, W, X, XR) Hughes Way spaces (X-Z)	7:30 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Friday, except for official university holidays when all university offices are closed. CSU permits are not valid during home Football game days at Canvas stadium, except in designated repair areas.
Extended enforcement A spaces	Specialty signed designated A spaces in lots 310, 350, and 425 in which enforcement is extended until 7 p.m. and in Lot 180 which is enforced at all times.
ADA, J, B, CSU Apartment permits (I, S, T, U) and Parking Garages	Enforced 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
Moby Arena lot 195 and 197 (A, V, and Hourly)	Moby Arena is a special event lot. Parking is restricted during special event dates. Lot 195 has mixed permitting use as signed in the lot. Lot 197 is designated for hourly use requiring mobile or pay station payment.
South Campus off Research Boulevard lot 740 and Foothills Campus at Pickett Equine Center (A, R, V, and Hourly)	Spaces in lot 740 are designated for permit and hourly use requiring a valid CSU permit or hourly payment. Designated R permit spaces along east side of the Pickett Equine Center.
Foothills Campus (A, B, Q, Y, W, X, XR, Z, V and Hourly)	Spaces on Foothills Campus are designated for permit or hourly use requiring a valid CSU permit or hourly payment.

All other spaces not detailed above (A, Z, and Hourly) are enforced 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday or as designated on signage at the entrance or in the parking areas, except for official university holidays when all university offices are closed. CSU permits are not valid during home Football game days at Canvas stadium.

The mobile app for Colorado State University offers access to key student information and CSU news anywhere, anytime. RAMmobile includes grades, courses, notifications, directory, campus contacts, maps, campus news, events, resources from the library, and more.

ParkMobile
Parking in designated hourly parking spaces is made easier with the mobile app. Select the amount of time you want to park in the app and pay directly with a credit card. If you need to park longer, you may extend the time using the app without walking back to your car to pay the hourly parking station. The app is only valid in hourly parking spaces and not valid in permit designated areas.

Campus Parking
Parking and Transportation Services is a self-funded auxiliary department of Colorado State University. No tax revenue, general funds, student fees, or tuition monies are received or used to support parking on campus and the Parking and Transportation Services budget. Paid parking is required on Colorado State University campuses.

Designated parking areas are signed, striped, or both. Posted signs in parking areas inform users and regulate authorized parking permits in the area. Please visit pts.colostate.edu for detailed explanation of parking regulations.

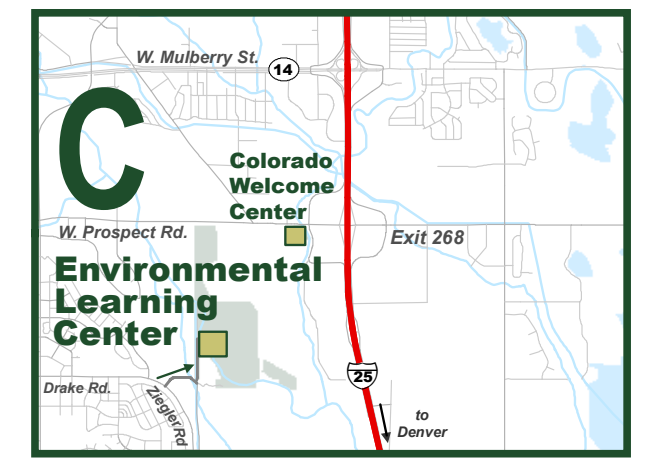
Parking on campus is monitored through a virtual permit system that scans your license plate. Your license plate is linked to your parking permit. Vehicles parked on campus must have a valid CSU parking permit associated with their properly displayed and clearly visible license plate or pay by the hour in designated hourly parking spaces. All zones are enforced as posted. Please watch signage carefully when entering the parking areas or as designated in the lot.

Parking in spaces in the interior area of campus may be difficult at times. Please allow sufficient time to walk to your desired destination, or take the free on campus shuttle, Around the Horn.
 • Parking areas are enforced over summer, fall, winter, spring, and holiday breaks.
 • ADA parking is available with a state issued ADA placard or ADA license plate and valid CSU parking permit or pay to park in a hourly designated space.
 • Visitors can purchase daily parking permits online to park in Z, V or R permitted spaces or pay by the hour to park in designated hourly parking spaces.
 • CSU students living on campus in residence halls or apartment housing can purchase permits valid for their designated residence hall or apartment location.

• Aggie Village apartments have limited parking availability. Parking permits are sold by waitlist status only.
 • CSU students living off campus can purchase permits to park in Z, V or R spaces.

• Hourly parking on campus for staff, students and visitors. Payment using the mobile app or at pay stations in the lot. CSU parking permits are not valid in hourly parking spaces.
 • CSU parking permits are not valid during home football games and Residence Hall students are required to repark to designated parking areas.

 CSU parking regulations are approved by the Board of Governors in accordance with the authority of Colo. Rev. Stat. §§ 23-5-106 through 108.

Transportation Around Campus
 • Around the Horn, free on campus shuttle, runs every 10 minutes during the school year and every 20 minutes during summer, winter and spring break.



• Transfort routes are free to CSU students and employees with their RamCard. Visitors may purchase their fare at ticket machines located at MAX stations or using cash when boarding. Visit RideTransfort.com for updated routes and schedules.
 • CSU electric vehicle chargers on the Main, South and Foothills campus, provide free charging using a Chargepoint card and a valid CSU parking permit or payment using mobile app

Regulation of Moving Vehicles
 In application of City and State Codes: Relevant Fort Collins municipal and Colorado traffic laws pertaining to the regulation, control, and enforcement of moving vehicular traffic are enforced on campus streets at all times. Each individual operating a motor vehicle on University property must obey all parking and traffic controls, signs, and lights.
