### "Mexico and Cuba - Botanical Treasures"

• • Jeremy Spath • •

**Jeremy Spath** and his wife Grace were able to travel through the state of Oaxaca recently with Kelly Griffin. Besides Echeverias, bromeliads, palms and cycads, the Agaves seemed to take center stage. Agave montana, A. parrasana, and A. albopilosa made a huge impression. There were also Astrophytum digitostigma and Echinocactus grusonii (common in the trade, but not so commonly seen in the wild).

After this trek, Jeremy and Grace flew off to Cuba – where they found a geographically pure country begging to be explored botanically. Searching mainly for the cycad

*Microcycas calocoma*, they found an abundance of bromeliads, palms and epiphytic cactus. It is a truly beautiful and astonishing country.

Inspired by a fascination with the natural world Jeremy creates gardens that match subtle beauty with rare and unusual plants. He travels the planet regularly in search of rare, new and beautiful plants. In the last number of years Jeremy has worked extensively with both the San Diego Botanic Garden and Rancho Soledad Nursery. Currently, Jeremy works with Xeric Growers tissue culture lab where he assists in producing cutting edge

plants that are new species, cultivars, and hybrids only available from this lab. Jeremy often includes original hybrids in his garden designs. He is a regular speaker to various plant societies and as has also published many articles on horticultural topics. **Spath Gardens** combine all this experience and creativity to design drought tolerant, fire resistant, year round color gardens that are uniquely individual to each landscape. One of Jeremy's projects from 2011 can be viewed at the public library in Cardiff-by-the-Sea. Jeremy loves working with plants and landscapes, but is happiest in the field since to him nature is truly the best landscaper.

There might even be pictures from his most recent trip with Kelly to **Madagascar**. I think he's actually still there!
